#### **CGHB PPG**

#### Feedback from patients:

March and April comments into the PPG via the email account and other on-line and personal reports revolved around two main themes, Dr.iQ and telephone wait times.

**Dr.iQ** was mostly received positively when ordering repeat prescriptions but was held in disrepute when it came to trying to contact the surgery for an appointment/call back as the system was often "switched off" during regular surgery hours or call backs were not happening as per the stated timetable. This was particularly annoying as the patient was then forced to ring the surgery and the first message they get is that instead of waiting on the phone for a response from the surgery it was best to use Dr.iQ!!

**Call wait times** was of course exacerbated by the above and the lack of receptionists to answer the calls in a timely manner. See comments below from Operose about challenges in recruiting surgery receptionists. If you'd like to apply, please contact any of the surgeries for further details about these important roles, either full or part-time.

#### **Google Reviews**

It's interesting that if you review the Google rating for the surgeries (just search for CGH partnership using Google and look to the left of your screen to see the reviews) it comes out with a 3.9 rating out of a possible 5. Maybe you'd like to leave a review of your experiences here?

Alternatively you can send the PPG an email to the above address. We would be interested to know whether you feel that the surgery has improved in the last year. Please let us hear your positive and negative comments so we can feed back to Operose.

#### **Volunteering in Surgeries**

The project relating to the updating of surgery noticeboards will be pushed back until later in the year because of conflicting initiatives for some members.

One of our Digital Team has agreed to lead the Dr iQ training project and we will

email Operose try to get a consensus of dates when this can happen.

#### Prescriptions

As we all know the Lloyds pharmacy in Sainsbury's is now closed this will undoubtedly put more pressure on the surrounding chemists. Please bear this in mind when ordering repeat prescriptions and leave plenty of time when ordering. We have also been talking to the local pharmacies and Operose about how they can both help each other to improve this service. We are reassured by Operose that meetings have recently been held with at least two pharmacies and work is now being undertaken to streamline this important service.

#### Joining the PPG

Membership of the PPG Group is open to all patients of the Operose surgeries. We meet once a month using the on-line tool Zoom with meetings lasting around 60-90 minutes starting around 7 pm. We are particularly interested in recruiting people who are willing to attend the face-to-face meetings with Operose to help take the minutes from the meeting. These are normally held around 4pm on a Wednesday. We are also actively recruiting for our Newsletter Team. If you'd like to speak to us about any of these roles, please drop us an email using the email address above.

#### **Surgeries Update From Operose**

Operose advised that the NHS year-end is now complete which will mean that staff workload is somewhat reduced.

Blood tests wait times continue to be a challenge with surgery wait times of 2-3 weeks to get a test and almost the same waiting time through the hospital. Operose advised that there is a general lack of phlebotomists, which is affecting the NHS as a whole.

#### Staffing

Two new receptionist/administrators have started since the last meeting.

They have made two successful offers to new Clinical Pharmacists and they are

currently going through the onboarding process.

A new nurse manager is currently working her notice period and will join Operose in June.

A Healthcare Assistant has completed her nursing training and has now moved to a Practice Nurse role. They have welcomed a new Healthcare Assistant to replace her previous role.

They continue to have challenges with recruitment, on top of absence challenges and this has deteriorated the call queue slightly, although not to the levels experienced previously. They are awaiting one more new starter on reception at CGH and they are trying all they can to recruit further.

## Phillips Law

#### WHY IS MY CONVEYANCING TRANSACTION TAKING SO LONG?

It is a common grumble that conveyancing takes longer than expected. Buyers are keen to own their new properties as soon as possible but the average transaction takes around 12 weeks from offer to completion.

#### Several factors can contribute to delays: Identification

Conveyancers are required by law to verify the identity of clients and the source of their funds. Ensure you have ID documents and proof of deposit readily available at the very start of the transaction.

#### Lost Documents

If you have carried out work to a property you are selling, get planning and building regulation paperwork together. Check you have your Final Certificates. A surprising number of sellers do not request the building inspector for a final inspection so do not receive their Completion Certificates.

#### Lost Title Deeds

Although most properties are now registered with the Land Registry some unregistered land remains, particularly where the property has remained in the same family for many years. If you have original deeds, please keep these safe.

#### **Missing Rights**

When viewing a property make a point of checking for private access roads and shared driveways, private or shared services such as drainage, and other unusual features.

#### Service Information Packs

Properties that are leasehold or have an estate service charge require these, and they can take anything between

2 to 8 weeks to be returned by management companies. If your property is subject to a service charge, let your conveyancer know early.

#### Missing Landlords and Defective Leases

If your property is leasehold or subject to ground rent, ensure you have your latest ground rent receipt or freeholder contact details available.

#### Finance Problems

Speak to your bank or financial adviser before making an offer. If you are funding your purchase from savings, check how long it takes to release the funds - a Life Time ISA can take up to 3 weeks to be released. If you are receiving a gifted deposit, you need to provide information on the source of the funds to your conveyancer and mortgage lender, so submit your paperwork early.

#### Search Delays

Most local authorities can return an Official Local Search within two weeks, but some require longer as not all records are readily available. Further searches may be required in particular circumstances like former mining areas or relative to the particular property such as a Highways Search where there are access issues.

Whilst delays can be frustrating, there may be factors outside of your conveyancer's control. It is important that the documentation is correct and complies with legislation to avoid future problems, so you need to be flexible with target dates and review these regularly as the transaction proceeds.

We had a full house at May's Beggarwood Bookworms meeting, with everyone wanting to attend


to discuss our latest read despite being busy in between bank holidays too!

#### **COUNCILLOR'S UPDATE**

A30 ROADWORKS: I have been frustrated, as have others, at the seeming lack of progress on the junction into the Golf Course development. My enquiries reveal that the remaining work includes installing new ducting under the carriageway, resurfacing the road and painting new white lines. This work will be undertaken at night and will require the road to be closed. And that's the key to the problem - the need to close the road. Apparently, the A30 has been part of a diversion route for another scheme (now finished) and it will be the diversion route for traffic off the M3 in the near future, as National Highways have plans for resurfacing works on the motorway. It is obviously not acceptable to have a diversion in place where the diversion route itself is closed. That means the network coordinators have to find suitable gaps in the other works to finish the access into the golf course. The positive news is that they have identified a window of opportunity and currently have the works planned for 22nd May to 4th June, subject to other works completing on time and no unforeseen delays such as weather. Hopefully, by the time you read this, work will have restarted.

**BRIGHTON HILL ROUNDABOUT:** There are some longerterm restrictions in the use of the roundabout which may involve drivers diverting to the Kempshott or Winchester Road roundabouts. The restrictions are designed to facilitate the resurfacing work on the new layout. The previous use of this model seemed to work as planned, but motorists are asked to allow additional time for journeys. Further details are available on the scheme web page. The restrictions are expected to remain until 30th June.

**CYCLE ROUTE:** I am planning to attend a briefing on proposals to create a continuous cycle route along the A30 Winchester Road and through the Winchester Road roundabout. Future phases of this route will include improvements west from the Brighton Hill roundabout towards Hatch Warren. One of the comments I receive from cyclists is that our cycle routes are disjointed, so I hope that the plans will improve the situation for local users. I will however, be very concerned if the plans involve yet another digging up of our roads.

**POTHOLE REPAIRED:** Drivers will be relieved to see that the very wide pothole in Cliddesden Lane, just past the Portsmouth Arms, has been repaired. It was causing drivers to swerve to avoid it.

**BROADMERE ROAD ADOPTIONS:** Progress is now being made on the work leading to adoption of these residential roads (and not before time!) The work involves identifying the highways land that should be grass or tarmac to enable access to manhole covers leading to soakaways. Some areas have been cleared of vegetation. I was informed by a concerned resident about a tree that was under threat and managed to intervene to stop it being felled, though it has been trimmed back. I feel that the work in the area has been fairly brutal, but hopefully the grassed areas will recover.

**CAR MEETS:** I attended a meeting with management from Sainsbury's, and Maria Miller MP, to review the operation of the

ANPR cameras and associated parking restrictions. The reports were positive: the store believes that the new arrangements have stopped (or nearly so) the misuse of their car park for car meets. That isn't to say that the problem has been eliminated from the area. Sadly there are still reports of antisocial driving based elsewhere. A notice has been placed on the gates to the Hatch Warren Retail Park (the LIDL car park) warning about mis-use there.

**DANEBURY ROAD:** It seems to me that the 'school run' problem is worse this year and there are periods when Danebury Road is effectively reduced to a single lane for a long distance. The school encourages drivers to use the Community Association car park.

WATER LEAKS: Another leak has occurred, seemingly round a water meter connection once again, in the pavement in Petworth Close... I reported it to South East Water and it was repaired. This is the third instance of which I am aware in a few months and I am getting concerned that the installations have a weakness that is causing them to fail at the same time. One to monitor.

**PATIENT PARTICIPATION GROUP:** The next meeting, which I plan to attend, is likely to discuss the Dr IQ app, and how volunteers may help with training users. Also on the agenda are management metrics and a potential annual meeting with patients.

**ELECTIONS:** Cllr Dan Putty was re-elected on 4th May to represent Hatch Warren and Beggarwood on the Borough Council. He has been appointed as Deputy Mayor, which means that he will be Mayor next year.

**COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION ANNUAL MEETING:** The Hatch Warren and Beggarwood Community Association is advertising its Annual Meeting which will be held on Wednesday 7th June at 7pm at the Beggarwood Community Centre. Tickets can be booked viaTicketsource and are free. This is an important meeting as the trustees cannot operate successfully without the continued support of the Association Members. The Association has been through a difficult time and is still navigating the issues thrown up by the pandemic..

**ST MARK'S SCHOOL** has posted its thanks to Tesco shoppers who voted for it to win a community grant. The scheme has now finished and the school was delighted to have come second, which meant it has been awarded  $\pounds$ 1,000.

**CRICKET AT BRIGHTON HILL SCHOOL:** In a huge coup for the school, Brighton Hill has been chosen as the official home of Hampshire Cricket's first youth academy in North Hampshire. This is a scheme to allow state school students an opportunity to access elite cricket. Stars from Hampshire Hawks and Southern Vipers came to the school to help launch the initiative and dozens of young people were given the chance to meet them. Cricket fans (I am one!) will be delighted as there has been concern that the sport has been in decline in state schools.





If you are at the Top of Town and in need of a light snack or meal, then the Tea Bar is an interesting place to visit. Lunch times are quiet whereas the evenings, especially Friday and Saturday nights, are apparently a busy scene with varying amounts of live entertainment.

The weekday lunch visit that Madam and I experienced was very quiet and only two other sets of customers were there. But this was no problem for us as we only needed something light and ensured that



#### KEMPSHOTT CONSERVATION GROUP

A note of caution. Early signs are that this year may be a bad one for ticks, so please make sure your charges are well covered, especially no shorts and preferably long sleeved tops, irrespective of the weather:

Flora everywhere. We hope you enjoyed the lovely cowslip display in Down Grange Meadow in May. We are hoping for a good display of yellow rattle and other wild flowers in June and July in the areas of the Meadow by the two main paths which were prepared and seeded back in October last year.

#### Digging for Britain?

If you have your eye to the ground when walking you may spot the tell-tale "volcanoes" of early solitary mining bees. While 'solitary', these four groups - Mining, Carpenter, Mason and Leafcutter bees - are not anti-social and the service was prompt. We decided that in the Tea Bar we should have a pot of tea for two. Although we were not asked which type of tea we wanted there are apparently 28 varieties on offer. Ours was traditional English breakfast type tea. There is a full bar service available.

There is an array of light bites on offer and Madam chose a tuna crisp salad which was a delight on the eye while I had a tuna cheese panini which came with tortilla chips, slaw and salad garnish. It was very tasty and filling. Madam also was replete with her salad, so we were not tempted with a dessert. The salad



was  $\pounds$ 6.25, the panini  $\pounds$ 6.25 and the pot of tea for two was  $\pounds$ 4.95.

Their web site could benefit from being updated as their offerings are extensive and are reasonably priced with children's portions there to tempt young families. Afternoon tea is available for walk in customers although the most sophisticated version would be pre-ordered. Sixties background music accompanied our lunch with all the songs being recognisable by us oldies and were the sort that would be possible to whistle to. Just as I like them and matched our liking of the lunch.



some species do nest in loose colonies. Mining bees are often parasitized by various flies and even other bees. Living colonially gives them a degree of protection.

All the solitary bees, while they have stings, pose no risk of sting to humans, providing you don't corner one. The mining bees are smaller than the honey bee and their volcanoes can be found anywhere on open or bare ground. Some species like nesting in lawns and for those who like to maintain a pristine lawn, this could be a problem, but just remember that they are great pollinators.



The most distinctive species are also the most photogenic. The Tawny Mining Bee (*Andrena fulva*) (pictured above) has a bush of dark brick red fur on the thorax, while the Ashy Mining



Bee (Andrena cineraria) (pictured above) is black with two silver-grey bands across the thorax and abdomen. Both are out and about early in the season and so their volcanoes are easier to spot.

Later in the season, look out for the signs of the Leafcutters. Again, keen gardeners may not like circular chunks being taken from the leaves of roses or other plants but we all have to live!





#### SPIRITUALLY SPEAKING

- If I asked you to name the 12 disciples, could you name them? Who might you know?
- Judas-the betrayer I'm sure you'd get him
- Peter, the denier and probably him too
- Judas betrayed Jesus for 30 pieces of silver.
- But what about us?
- How do we get betrayed?
- We too often get betrayed by people we love or are close to us.
- Some people have been abused by family members or close friends. Those who should be loving and protecting them.
- I know two people who were jilted (or betrayed) just before
- their wedding and the effects are quite catastrophic. One did
- remarry but it ended in divorce and the other never quite trusted anyone enough to try again.
- All these things play into our everyday lives and everyday situations. How we deal with them, makes a huge difference to ourselves as well as to other people. We need to avoid retaliation and revenge.
- We need to forgive and that's not as easy as it sounds.
- I once watched a video where a woman whose son had been killed in a knifing said, "I must pick up the cup of forgiveness every single day. Forgiveness is not just a one-off event. I must
- keep on doing it. Otherwise, I sink into wanting retaliation."
- On the cross Jesus says, "Father forgive them for they know not what they're doing." So, He has forgiven the people who've beaten him up and Peter for denying him and I suggest this means that Jesus did forgive Judas too.
- When Jesus was arrested, Peter denied knowing Jesus three times just as Jesus predicted he would.
- Ponder upon the behaviours, attitudes or situations in our everyday lives which we deny or ignore?
- But what happened to Peter?
- The resurrected Jesus had a meal of fish on the beach with Peter and the other disciples.
- In the Gospels it tells us that Jesus asked Peter three times "Do you love me?" And Peter says "Yes, Lord, I love you" but by the time Jesus asked a third time, Peter is obviously a little bit miffed at this, because he says "Yes, Lord, you know I love you".
- Jesus asked Peter three times. Is it Jesus merely making a point saying, 'You denied me three times. So, I am going to ask you three times to make you squirm''.
- No, it's much more than that. Jesus is healing Peter. Jesus is showing him the way forward. He is taking away all the hurt.
- He is doing it by asking him three times. He's taken away the three denials just as he takes away our wrongdoings if we only lay them before him.
- The important thing for us about these stories is that we are forgiven for all our betrayals and denials.
- We are forgiven by Jesus. He is so much better at it than we are.We find it difficult, and we want to retaliate, but Jesus didn't.

200g butter 300g golden syrup 350g rolled (porridge) oats

#### Method

- Preheat oven to 180C/160C fan
- Melt butter and syrup in a pan and remove from heat before they bubble
- Pour the butter over the oats in a large bowl and mix
- Place mixture into a baking tin (any square one will do) and press gently so that the mixture is flat
- Put into the oven and bake for approx 30 minutes
- Cut into 12 portions and eat!
- If you want to add dried fruit, seeds or nuts to this recipe they work too!

#### LOCAL STREET NAMES

Most people living in Hatch Warren and Beggarwood will have noticed some themes with local street naming. There are clusters of roads with Roman connections, perhaps reflecting the small archaeological finds of Roman artefacts during excavations prior to building, and many street names which refer to the farmlands and meadows which used to be here. In Beggarwood there is a cluster of roads close to what was the Golf Course which carry the names of famous golf courses. But there are some more specific local references.

Paterson Close is named after Rex Paterson OBE. An agriculturalist, he farmed the land here and was recognised as a pioneer in dairy farming, trialling new methods and developing new equipment with Taskers of Andover such as a buckrake for grass gathering and a fertiliser spreader:

He was awarded the OBE in 1964. His farm buildings (close to the Portsmouth Arms) are now in use as a nursery, gym, offices.

Garlic Lane leading to Farleigh Wallop was named relatively recently – the name was chosen from a shortlist as it reflects the astonishing amount of wild garlic that grows along both sides of the lane at this time of year.

Blue Hut Way refers to the old Blue Hut Café that used to sit on this side of the A30 on Kempshott Hill. It used to be a favourite meeting place for motorcyclists.

Wallop Drive and the Portsmouth Arms refer to the Wallop family, the Earls of Portsmouth, the previous owners of much of the land here. Once based at Hurstbourne Park near Whitchurch, and Farleigh House just over the motorway in Farleigh Wallop. John Charles Wallop, the 3rd Earl of Portsmouth was a contemporary of Jane Austen who danced at balls at Hurstbourne, and was well known to Lord Byron. The 3rd Earl was the subject of a scandalous insanity trial in 1823. Perhaps more of that another time!




