### **CRIMESTOPPERS**

Hampshire Crimestoppers is continuing the fight against rural and coastal crime by targeting would-be thieves across the county. Crimestoppers is fighting back with a campaign to stop theft of farm machinery and equipment. This may include oil, diesel, batteries, metal for its scrap value, tools, quad bikes, agricultural chemicals, tractors, and even livestock.

Rural and coastal crime costs the country a great deal - an estimated £50 million to £70 million worth of plant and agricultural machinery is stolen nationally every year, and only 5% of this stolen property is ever recovered. Stealing this valuable equipment – some of which is worth tens of thousands of pounds - may have a lasting effect on its victims who may be unable to carry on their day-to-day business without them. Thieves see it as easy to steal from outbuildings on farms or from marinas and beaches, due to limited surveillance and lack of street lighting away from urban areas.

We have a large and diverse coastline in Hampshire and Isle of Wight and this can also occasionally attract incidents of crime, anti-social behaviour and vandalism.

If you have a beach hut, do ensure it is in good repair and make sure it is secured with good quality padlocks and a solid steel bar across the front. Don't leave valuables or alcohol inside, and don't leave anything lying around that could be used to damage or enter yours or your neighbours' huts.

Likewise if you have a boat, never leave any valuables on display and keep your keys somewhere safe – ie not in the boat's ignition! Use strong padlocks or rimlocks on all your hatches, entry points and cockpit lockers.

It is very important not to buy anything suspicious 'out the back of a van', at a car boot sale or from a website. You may think you're getting a bargain on that chainsaw, or power tools, but you're actually contributing to the crime – if people didn't buy stolen goods, there would be no point the thief stealing them in the first place. You may also find yourself explaining to the Police and a Court why you thought the cheap outboard motor with no paperwork that you bought from a bloke down the pub was a genuine purchase.

Rural crime affects us all wherever we might live. We all finish up paying the price

with increased insurance premiums and the potential increase in food costs. We would all soon notice if there was no milk because a local farmer could no longer operate his business!

The financial restraints of recent years have increased pressure on rural communities and this makes it more important that people who have vital knowledge have a safe and anonymous way to give information. We understand that rural communities are close-knit and trust is an important part of rural life, so people may be aware of who is committing these crimes but don't feel comfortable giving this information directly to the police. This is where Crimestoppers can help, by providing a route for people to pass on information about crimes anonymously.


As well as SSAFA being able to assist those in need, we have a need for more caseworkers.

### RAMBLERS ASSOCIATION

The North Hampshire Downs Ramblers group, is part of the Ramblers Association, we walk mostly in Hampshire and the surrounding countryside. In the last few months our group has enjoyed both walks and social activities.

The group walk on both Tuesday and Saturday and cover both areas in and around Basingstoke as well as sometimes going further afield.

Our Tuesday morning walks, which are typically 6-7 miles continues to attract quite a number of walkers. We have recently walked around Hartley Wintney, Frimley Green as well as in the Kingsclere area. We usually end up with an end of walk pub stop, to give people time for a catch up.

Our Saturday walks tend to be longer, with fewer walkers, and can sometimes take most of the day. We recently did a walk from Shawford to St Catherine hill and then picked up the Valley of the Fields walk back to Shawford. This afforded beautiful views back down over Winchester.

As well as the walks, the group also enjoys some social activities, this includes an Annual Summer Picnic, Boys lunches and the group occasionally organise weekends away.

The group have an active path patrol group, who report problems to the local council and also do some work on the paths, which can be as varied as checking waymarking and replacing waymarking discs, minor clearing or even repairing stiles and gates. To date this group has replaced 20 gates in conjunction with the local council. The most recent being the replacement of 4 gates at Cottington Hill, where as well as the gates and steps being erected, some footpath clearance work was done at the same time.

Our walks are graded so you can tell

whether a walk is right for you. The grading is as follows:-

**Easy:** Suitable for anyone who does not have a mobility difficulty or a specific health problem or is seriously unfit; suitable for pushchairs if they can be lifted over occasional obstructions. Comfortable shoes or trainers can be worn.

**Leisurely:** Suitable for reasonably fit people with at least a little country walking experience; may include unsurfaced rural paths. Walking boots and warm, waterproof clothing are recommended.

**Moderate:** Suitable for people with country walking experience and a good level of fitness; may include some steep paths and open country, and may be at a brisk pace. Walking boots and warm, waterproof clothing are essential.

**Strenuous:** Suitable for experienced country walkers with an above average fitness level; may include hills and rough country, and may be at a brisk pace. Walking boots and warm, waterproof clothing are essential. People in doubt about their fitness are advised to contact the organiser or leader in advance.

### PROBUS HEARS FROM A TV COMEDY WRITER

Writing "gags" for a living is a cut throat business Brad Ashton

explained to the Probus Club of Basingstoke. The club for retired professional and business managers was amazed to hear that he had written over I 500 comedy shows for television over a working lifetime and the names he mentioned were household favourites that the audience recalled with ease.

Since his retirement he has been telling his anecdotal tales to passengers on cruise ships about working with the comedy greats. Ted Ray, Tommy Trinder, Jimmy Edwards, Jon Pertwee, Leslie Phillips, Harry Worth and Dick Emery from the early days; Benny Hill, Tommy Cooper, Les Dawson, Frankie Howerd, Tony Hancock, Ken Dodd, Bob Monkhouse, Bernard Bresslaw, Mike and Bernie Winters, Morecambe & Wise and Little & Large were the British stars. And Brad worked with Groucho Marx for fourteen weeks on a UK tour:

Brad's first script was broadcast on the wireless on 28 September 1952, but was unable to listen as it was Yom Kippur."I come from a traditional Jewish family and my father would not let me turn on the radio during Holy Days, which I respected."

"In the early 50s I found the BBC a bit anti-Semitic so having the Jewish surname of



Abrahams did not help, so for professional reasons I changed my name by deed poll."

Spike Milligan was a witness at Brad's marriage in 1961 and had an office below Brad's for 20 years. They would lunch together with Ray Galton and Alan Simpson, Johnny Speight and others. In fact there were 16 of them in the building and if unsure of a gag or routine they would pop into one of the other offices and try it out on each other. Some comedians were well known for being a little tight over money. Brad gave an example "I sold a gag to a well known name for £250 but six months later he phoned me to tell me that as he had not used it he wanted his money back."

Brad was asked by Ned Sherrin at the BBC to help decide between David Frost and Brian Redhead who was to be the anchor man on a new topical show called That Was The Week That Was. Initially Brian Redhead was ahead but then Brad saw David Frost

handle a 300 strong audience with top quality political impersonations.

"On the day of the show I would get all the newspapers, sit down by 7.00am and by 3pm I'd have my target of 33 gags. I would read them out to David in his dressing room at the BBC for the show that night and those that excited him, he'd remember: On average he would use at least fifteen in that night's TW3. He was without doubt the most talented person I ever worked with."

Les Dawson was another of Brad's favourites and unbeknown to most, spoke seven languages. At lunch with Brad in a Chinese restaurant Les spoke in Mandarin for twenty minutes with a waiter. He was also a good pianist who by deliberately playing out of tune avoided paying royalties.

Brad went on "Everyone says, having written for all these comedians I must have had an exciting life. I probably did but was too busy to notice as each day I would be at rehearsals and script meetings. I slept at my desk using a satchel as a pillow, but they were marvellous experiences. The best thing about my profession was by not having to be a performer I could watch a good comedian get a laugh, sit back and think, I wrote that!" See the Probus Club's web site www.

### **CIVILISED FAMILY RESOLUTIONS**

The collaborative approach can be a quicker, cheaper and more dignified way of dealing with family matters than Court. Ann Davies and Laura Bell are both collaboratively trained family solicitors at Lamb Brooks and have assisted numerous clients through the collaborative process.

G and S took the difficult decision to separate. They both wanted to limit the financial and emotional cost and ensure that they acted in their children's best interests.

G had an initial consultation with Ann Davies, who identified that G and S's circumstances were suitable for collaborative law. G was enthusiastic and suggested to S that they use the

collaborative approach to resolve matters.

A meeting was arranged between G, S, Ann and S's solicitor to discuss and identify G and S's hopes and expectations. A timetable was agreed for commencing the divorce and gathering financial information before the second meeting.

In the second meeting G and S agreed upon a routine to share the care of their children and work together as co-parents. In the third and fourth meetings the financial arrangements were agreed.

G and S felt empowered by the process, as they came to an agreement

themselves, rather than a Judge deciding for them. Most importantly, G and S felt that they could co-parent and communicate effectively with one another:

### **CHRISTABEL**

For my day job I run a small business called Pedlars and Petticoats, a historical presentation company. One of the talks I give is as Christabel Pankhurst, one of the founders of the Suffragette movement and a truly amazing and surprising woman.

Christabel was born in 1880 to politically active and campaigning parents Richard and Emmeline. She had two younger sisters, Sylvia and Adela. After her father died Christabel joined her mother in setting up the Women's Social and Political Union in 1903. Christabel was adamant that their campaign should be far more radical and high profile than those run by other organisations pressing for votes for women. She also targeted the campaign at middle and upper class women only as she did not want to "dilute" their impact by being drawn into discussions about universal suffrage and the lot of the poor. She was behind the strategy of mass protests, bombings and hunger strikes. Christabel drew supporters in with her charisma and drive. She fell out with both sisters who did not approve of the direction Christabel and Emmeline were taking. Sylvia left to form a suffragette movement in the East End with working class women, Adela was banished to Australia.

During WWI Christabel aligned herself with those calling for more stringent measures to support the war effort and was part of the white feather campaign. In 1918 women over 30 were given the vote and Christabel stood for parliament for the Women's Party, missing being elected by 700 votes. Christabel then spent much of the rest of her life in the USA where she became a campaigning evangelist, making public appearances proclaiming the second coming! She was made a Dame of the British Empire in 1936.



### SPRING IN THE GARDEN

Spring is the time we want to make a difference, with sudden bursts of unaccustomed strenuous activity after a season of inactivity. Let's prepare and protect.

**WARM UP** Do some simple stretching or take a short walk.

**PACING** Don't try to do it all in one session, tissue fatigue occurs at 50 minutes and will not recover until the next day, take breaks every 30 minutes and vary the tasks.

**LIFTING** Remember to bend the knees and hips, 'sit' into the bend, keep your lower back arched, head up and bottom out. Use a wheelbarrow, wet soil is heavier than dry!

**REACHING** Keep objects close; go on one or both knees, move don't reach.

### EARLYYEARS FOUNDATION STAGES- EYFS (Part 3) Prime area 2: - Communication and language

There are 3 elements within this area. For those aged between 22 months – 36 months you might notice some of the following:

### I. Listening and attention

- I listen to stories when you make different noises or use different voices as you read to me.
- I can recognise sounds by finding or going to the thing or place.
- I join in with singing songs and rhymes.
- I stop what I am doing, look at you and listen to you when you say my name.

### 2. Understanding

- When you ask questions like "Who's jumping?" or "Who's sleeping?" I can point to the right picture to show you that I understand action or "doing" words.
- I understand longer instructions or questions such as "Put the bricks away and then we'll read a book".

- I can show you that I understand "who", "what" and "where" when you use short questions such as "Who's that?", "What's that?" or "Where is?" as we look at pictures in a book or play with toys.
- I can point to the right picture or object to show that I understand describing words such as "big" or "small".

### 3. Speaking

- I can use simple sentences with 3-4 words to talk about what I am doing or what is happening.
- When I am talking with you, I talk about lots of different things – what I am doing, what I like or what I have done.
- I use objects and gestures to help me explain what I mean when I am talking.
- I can ask questions such as "what", "where" and "who" when I am sharing a book or playing with toys.
- I am beginning to use word endings, such as "I am going" instead of "I go" and plurals, such as "babies" when talking about more than one object or person.

# Things you can do at home to help with this learning:-

### Listening & attention

• Use sock puppets or toy people or animals when you're sharing one of my favourite stories or songs with me.

### **Understanding**

 When we're making a sandwich together tell me what you are doing so I know what to do.

### **Speaking**

 When we're playing with things, use new words to describe what I'm doing with them or to tell me what they are called

SMALL BUSINESSES AND COSTLY DISPUTES

In the Autumn I wrote about the options available to prevent disputes occurring in the first place through work we do to improve on the contracts you have and the Terms & Conditions you trade under. I also briefly referenced alternative ways of resolving any disputes outside of the Court. This is why: an increasingly austere legal landscape is throwing up plenty for parties to a dispute to consider before entering into formal proceedings. For starters, the Small Claims Track of the County Court is now something of a misnomer as it deals with claims up to £10,000 in value. It is always worth being mindful of the threshold for Small Claims as in those cases legal fees are not as a rule recoverable. That means that Claimants retaining lawyers to work on Small Claims cases may find themselves out of pocket even if they win, or at the very least find that the margin of victory is eroded by legal costs.

Current national policy is therefore fairly clear: when it comes to Small Claims, even where there are complex issues to be dealt with, claimants are financially incentivised to act in person (without lawyers). That is coupled with the fact that starting a claim is easier than ever: claims can be issued online now which is cheaper and more efficient than the paper based alternative. However there are still plenty of pitfalls for the Litigant in Person.

The Court process is not straightforward at the best of times; we regularly deal with Claimants that find themselves in difficulty by having made mistakes that can stall or undermine their claims – whether it is understanding the legitimacy or quantum of a particular claim or dealing with procedural matters, it is important to get it right if you are to succeed. Issuing a claim in person can be a false economy if the claim is a non-starter in the first place or legal advice is needed later on to rectify matters for instance by amending a claim.

We try to address the pressure on potential litigants by offering initial advice for a fixed fee. The idea is that without the risk of legal costs escalating you can have your questions answered and establish where you stand legally. Our meetings are not time limited and are always followed up with a comprehensive letter of advice dealing with the strength of your position legally, the options available to you along with cost/risk analysis. The idea is always to put you in a position to make commercially sensible decisions. In that regard we also advise on the full range of options including alternative means of resolving matters outside the Courts such as mediation.

### APRIL IN THE GARDEN

April is such an exciting time in the garden because you can finally get out and start the jobs. With the daffodils starting to stop flowering, dead head them in your garden to give the leaves energy to store for next year's growth.

After dead heading them give them a good fertilizer with a general feed. A granular brand is best as it will release the energy over time and allow the daffodils roots a chance to soak it up from the surrounding soil naturally.

Plants in the garden can do with a tidy up now. After leaving the growth on certain plants over the winter months to protect the new growth, they can now be cut back. For example, Fuchsia, Bujelia and Hydrangeas can have their old heads chopped off now, and allow the new growth to take over. Hellebores need their leaves cut away to show off the last of their flower blossom. Make sure your roses and other trained plants are still attached to walls and have not received any damage over the winter months. Other areas of the garden will benefit from a good fertilizer feed too. Plants such as Roses, Raspberries and Fruit trees should receive a good granular fertilizer at the base of the plant or in their pots. Acidic loving plants such as Blueberries, that are in pots will especially appreciate this treatment. There are lots of fertilizers out there and lot of brands. You want to look for a fertilizer with Nitrogen, Phosphate, and Potash. These three ingredients will help to promote shoot growth and provide your roots with a boost for structure. If you have a good healthy plant it will help to guard against drought or diseases.

Now is a great time to start planting seed based vegetables. If space is limited you can plant onions and garlic in pots around the garden. Seed potatoes are also now available for Chitting. You should always buy seed potatoes if you are hoping for a good quality crop. It's very tempting to save last year's potatoes or use shop bought ones that have sprouted in the cupboard. They will still produce you some potatoes, but you will have a lot less, and they will be prone to rotting in the ground before you have a chance to harvest them. Chitting them before putting them in the ground helps the eyes develop and you will get a better crop from them. Place them in a tray in a warm, light place that's frost free. Within a few weeks you will see them starting to sprout.

Towards the end of the month you can plant out your potatoes. If you are planting directly into soil dig trenches about one spit depth and place out your potatoes about I foot apart. Cover the potatoes with soil, making sure you have space for a small trench either side of the rows. This is so you can heap the soil when the leaves start to show through to protect against potential frost damage. If you are planning to plant your potatoes in pots, fill them with some multipurpose soil about two foot deep. Place your potatoes in the tub and cover over with soil. Try to leave some space at the top so when the leaves start to poke through you can top up with soil, covering over the leaves and once again protecting them from frost.

Now is the perfect time to continue seed sowing, pricking out, and potting on larger seedlings. It's always a juggling act to find space, getting everything ready to go out. To prick out your seeds they need to have germinated so the first set of leaves have fully formed. You may be concerned about the size of the leaves to prick out, but you need to move them out of the seed tray as soon as possible. This is because seed soil only has a very basic nutrient content and the seeds will soon start competing with each other for what nutrients are left, as well as space, water and light. By potting on into smaller cells you can be sure they are getting good nutrients, and can fully root out before going outside. I like to use a multipurpose soil at this stage and then add any fertilizer when watering if needed. You can tell if your seeds need fertilizing because your leaves will start to go yellow and sometimes the edges start to roll over.

To prick out a seedling carefully place a thumb and finger on to one of the leaves. Using a Dibber, or bamboo cane, scope out the soil around the base of the seedling ensuring you get as many of the roots as you can. Lift the seedling out gently. Make a hole in the seed cell tray, and place the seedling in, ensuring you cover all the roots and the plants leaves are sitting just above the soil surface. If you can grade your seedlings making sure larger ones are at the back. This will help with light competition. Keep a close eye out for pests as well. Aphids and white fly love a nice young leaf to eat. You can help prevent this by spraying your plants with a solution of water and washing up liquid. Coating the plants in a thin layer of solution that makes it difficult for pests to cling to them. You can also put out yellow sticky traps which attract the pests to the colour rather than the plants. Once they get trapped this attracts further pests, trapping more of them. Make sure you change these as they become full. These pest yellow sticky traps are great for Scarred Fly.

Have fun and see what you can grow this month. Happy Gardening



### SPIRITUALLY SPEAKING

As I write this, in mid-March, we're enjoying some respite from the rain which we seem to have had far too much of and enjoying pleasant spring days, the sun is shining and the daffodils are out. By the time you read this, Easter will have been and gone, the schools will be on their Easter holiday break before the long summer term.

There is still much going on. There's plenty of aggression still going on in the world and we watch what is going on across the Atlantic in America in preparation for their presidential elections and the very likely possibility of Donald Trump being the Republican candidate. I think Pope Francis hit the nail on the head when he said of Donald Trump

"A person who thinks only about building walls — wherever they may be — and not building bridges, is not Christian......This is not in the Gospel."





### GOODBYE TO CRIMESTOPPERS AS WE KNOW IT



The Crimestoppers report in this edition of the Rabbiter is the last one we can publish. This is due to the retirement at the end of March of PC Simon Wright after 27 years in the Hampshire Constabulary. Simon has been a Basingstoke resident for some 30 years and of Hatch Warren for twenty.

Simon Wright has been the Crimestoppers Co-ordinator across a vast swathe of southern England since the year 2000. As well as being totally responsible for all activities in Hampshire, Isle of Wight, he has also been overseeing Wiltshire, Dorset, Devon, Cornwall, Channel Islands and Isles of Scilly together with the co-ordinators in Surrey, Sussex and Kent. As part of this demanding role he has written monthly reports that are sent to 120 publications.

His position as the Crimestoppers Co-ordinator actually came to an end last Easter and he was transferred to other Police duties in Winchester due to the extensive budget cuts across the Police service. In fact over 800 officers have left the Hampshire force since the financial cuts began and have not been replaced. However Simon has carried on unofficially overseeing Crimestoppers and voluntarily writing the monthly updates and articles in his spare time, however he recognises that once he retires from the Police Force he cannot continue in this vein.

Crimestoppers as an entity continues, where the public can give information about crime anonymously either by phone or online. The huge response to Simon's articles has made Hampshire Crimestoppers one of the most successful regions in the country, both with the number of calls made to Crimestoppers and the results achieved with that information.

Simon can look back on his Police career with pride in his achievements. Early on he was heavily involved with the Policing of the construction of the Newbury bypass and all its problems with public protesters who featured regularly on television news. The High Sheriff of Berkshire awarded Simon a Shrievalty commendation certificate in recognition of his contribution to policing the event. The High Sheriff of Isle of Wight nominated him to attend a Buckingham Palace garden party as thanks for his Crimestoppers work on the island and the current Home Secretary, Teresa May, presented him with a certificate for his outstanding work with Crimestoppers.

Local personalities have also been involved in his work; the late Shaw Taylor, for many years the presenter on TV of Police Five who lived on the IoW, Dr Hilary Jones and Alan Titchmarsh have supported his efforts to get the public to report suspects in a completely anonymous way that has helped the law have an impact on many miscreants.

What does the future hold for this law supporting figure? 'A rest and some serious gardening before embarking on a new yet-to-be-discovered project'.


