Hampshire Crimestoppers is continuing the fight against rural and coastal crime by targeting would-be thieves across the county. Crimestoppers is fighting back with a campaign

### What we do

The CSPO service aims to reduce antisocial behaviour affecting people and places by:

- **Enforcing** a robust approach to ASB
- **Deterring** ASB through high visibility patrols
- **Reassuring** communities and victims
- **Promoting** measures to reduce risks of ASB
- **Supporting** police and partners
- Gathering evidence for remedial action

The council will not ignore antisocial behaviour and it will use its range of powers to take the most appropriate action to address it

### How is this achieved?

- High visibility patrolling on foot, bicycle and vehicle across the whole of the Basingstoke and Deane area, dealing with the issues that affect residents the
- High profile campaigns targeting the key issues affecting residents (littering at the Leisure Park, Cigarette litter campaign, ASB in parks and Dog Fouling)
- Use of accredited police powers to provide a range of options to best deal with antisocial behavior.
- Close work with partners to ensure the most appropriate action is taken.

### How do we operate?

- 12 patrol officers
- · Providing coverage throughout all of Basingstoke & Deane
- Geographical points of contact for residents, community groups, elected members, businesses etc.
- Working between 7am-midnight 7 days a week (focussing on the key times antisocial behaviour is occurring)

### **Introduction to Doorstep Crime**

Most people who call at your home will be genuine, but sometimes people can turn up unannounced, with the aim of tricking their way into your home in order to steal your money and valuables.

They may claim to be from well-known companies, organizations or charities. They may be men or women, young or old, and will be convincing and persuasive. They often use 'props' like an identity card or wear clothes with a company logo.

Other people can turn up as builders or gardeners and try to trick you into paying for unnecessary work. You should never agree to having any work done at your home by someone who is just passing or take their word that the work needs to be done at all.

Remember when people come to your

If they're there, be aware! If you're not sure, don't open the door!

Say no, and tell them to go!

### **RECLAIMING JANE**

Not all Basingstoke residents realise the links we have with Jane Austen in Basingstoke, and those links are strong here on this side of town. Despite Winchester claiming Jane because she died there and was buried in the Cathedral, and Alton claiming her because she lived in Chawton towards the end of her life, she lived for the most part in the nearby village of Steventon, in the Borough of Basingstoke, and wrote Pride and Prejudice, Sense and Sensibility and Northanger Abbey there.

Jane was very active socially in Basingstoke and was a frequent visitor to dances and balls at many of the large family houses such as Manydown House. It is believed that she would walk from Steventon to the coaching Inn at North Waltham to meet the mail coach. This is now the Wheatsheaf on the A30. So we can claim Jane as someone very familar with this side of town. She would also take trips into Basingstoke town to attend dances at the assembly rooms at the top of town, or to shop. She bought her writing slope from a Basingstoke company.

Next year is the two hundreth anniversary of lane's death, and there will be a whole series of events around Hampshire and the South, with many places claiming lane as her own. But we are determined to establish lane as a Basingstoke girl, she lived most of her life here and it is time that we claimed her back. There will be many exciting projects over the next year or so, and we begin this year with a weekend of the Basingstoke Festival dedicated to a Women's Literary Festival where many of the events will have a Jane link. Watch out for further updates and events, lane will be coming back to Basingstoke where she belongs!

### WOOFS AND WELLIES





The speaker this month was lain Kennedy who gave a talk entitled "Liverpool, Capital of the Transatlantic Slave Trade." He described how the shipping magnates of the 1700s saw the great potential in shipping slaves from West Africa, a practice that had been carried out by the Spanish and Portuguese since the time of Elizabeth 1. The first ship out of Liverpool to do this in 1700 was called Liverpool Trader and carried 220 slaves which netted £330,000 profit. He explained how sailing from Liverpool was much safer than trying to navigate the English Channel at the time of the Napoleonic wars and how later trade in sugar and cotton as well as supplying slaves for these industries ensured huge profits for the ship owners. This continued



until the Abolition of Slavery Act of 1833 when the owners, having realised that their profitable business was coming to an end used their wealth to create some of the well-known banks and business empires which remain to this day.

At the next meeting on 4th May the speaker will be Jane Komrower from the CAB.

### HELICOPTER FLYING IN THE ROYAL NAVY



Retired Royal Navy Captain Mike Sant has experienced a full and varied 35 year career on land, sea and in the air. He gave

a presentation to the Probus Club of Basingstoke for retired professional and business managers, recounting his flight training and operating helicopters around the globe for the Senior Service.

Mike joined the Royal Naval College at Dartmouth in 1958. Initially cutting his teeth training as a young naval officer he spent weekends and summer camps learning to fly the legendary Tiger Moth biplane. This propeller driven aircraft from the 1930s was a basic trainer with an open cockpit and most did not have a radio. It was often described as easy to fly but very difficult to fly well.

Then selected for fixed wing flying training Mike underwent joint service jet instruction with the RAF at their Linton on Ouse base in Lincolnshire, but due to chronic air sickness while instrument flying, was re-streamed to fly helicopters. He attended the elementary Royal Naval helicopter flying school at Culdrose in Cornwall and was awarded his Wings in 1964.

Mike illustrated the basic principles of helicopter aerodynamics and its controls describing the many problems he encountered when learning to fly the early types of single engine machines including how to land the aircraft on engine failure. Posted for anti-submarine duties flying the then new Wessex helicopter, he was on board the aircraft carrier HMS

Victorious in the Far East. The Wessex had a crew of four; two pilots, sonor operator and observer. Operating day and night, he explained how they searched for submarines and what life was like on board an extremely busy, congested ship alongside fast jet aircraft. A Wessex had to be airborne every time a jet took off or landed should one go overboard and the crew needed rescuing.

Promoted to be the Flight Commander on the Frigate HMS Eskimo, Mike and his men flew the single engine Wasp helicopter in the anti-submarine role. Perched precariously on a tiny platform cum hangar at the aft end of the ship, he described operating and managing a team in an inhospitable Arctic Ocean environment.

He was promoted to be the Senior pilot of 819 RN Squadron based at Prestwick, positioned on the west coast of Scotland. They were equipped with modern Sea King helicopters, its main role being an anti-submarine aircraft. However, the base was ideally geographically positioned to support the deployment of nuclear submarines from nearby Faslane together with search and rescue emergency cover for both sea and the Scottish mountains. Mike's last flying job was as Commander (Air) at Portland where he flew Wessex V. ### WHAT IS CLINICAL NEGLIGENCE?

Lamb Brooks solicitors have been building a Clinical Negligence team over the last few years – but what is a clinical negligence claim all about?

In essence, clinical negligence claims arise where a patient sustains an injury or loss as a result of negligent medical treatment. Unfortunately, errors can be made that can have devastating consequences on not just you but also your family.

The term 'medical treatment' is widereaching and encompasses treatment provided by the medical profession – including the NHS, private sector, GPs, Community Health Care Providers or Dentists. What can be done if you think you have been injured as a result of medical treatment? There are two options:

- Make a complaint regarding the treatment received. This should be done in writing to the relevant complaints body; and
- 2. Take advice on whether to proceed with a legal claim. There are two legal tests that have to be proven in order for your claim to succeed. The first is establishing a 'duty of care' was a reasonable standard of a competent doctor in the relevant area of medicine achieved. The second is 'causation' what impact has the injury had on you. If

both of these tests are fulfilled you may be entitled to compensation.

### GREENLIGHT FOR LOCAL PLAN AS BOROUGH'S DEVELOPMENT BLUEPRINT

With just some modifications to agree Basingstoke and Deane's Local Plan, the blueprint to guide decisions on future development across the borough, has been declared 'sound' by a planning inspector.

A 'good to go' report on the examination of the Local Plan has just been received from planning inspector Mike Fox, who held public hearings from 5 October to 11 November 2015.

Once formally adopted, set to be at the next Council meeting on Thursday 26 May 2016, the plan will become the key document that will guide how planning applications will be determined up to 2029. This follows a long and detailed process, including extensive public consultation.

To keep the borough a great place to live and work, the Local Plan sets out where new homes should be built, identifies the areas where new businesses should be encouraged to locate, covers what infrastructure is needed and outlines how the environment of the borough will be protected and enhanced.

The council's Head of Planning and Infrastructure Matthew Evans said: "This is a significant milestone for the borough and reflects the hard work of all those involved, including the many people who have taken the time to respond to consultations over the past few years.

"Having a Local Plan for the borough will help to ensure that borough growth takes place in the right way and in line with the views of the borough's residents."

Adoption of the Local Plan in May will mean that the existing Local Plan, adopted in 2006, is formally superseded.



### OLD DOWN AND BEGGARWOOD WILDLIFE GROUP

The Annual General Meeting was on Tuesday 5 April at Old Down Hall. Not a huge turn-out but all enjoyed the homemade cakes and the presentation of photo slides - "Birds of Old Down". There were reports on the achievements of the work parties and its representations to Basingstoke Council on various matters relating to Old Down and Beggarwood. If you were unable to attend but would like to be more involved then please do contact the Group (see below) - we are always in need of new faces and ideas. We particularly need assistance with recording flora on the two sites and birds and butterflies on Beggarwood. On Beggarwood last year 18 species (367) species were recorded but certainly there were and are more; just need some more recorders! Following a survey by Basingstoke Council about 11 trees have been felled and several have had work done to them. It is sad to lose trees but safety is paramount and the resultant space may help regenerate beech trees.

As reported last month, the consultation regarding Beggarwood Park's declaration as a Local Nature Reserve is over however we still await the results from Basingstoke Council.

Spring has sprung and early flowers are showing. The winter birds (such as Fieldfare) are now away and the summer migrants arriving, for example Chiffchaff and Whitethroat. The Chiffchaff has a very distinctive call, which does sound rather like - "chiff-chaff". Several species of butterflies have been seen - Brimstone, Comma, Red Admiral and Small Tortoiseshell. As summer approaches the 'hirundines' are arriving; this is the family that includes Swallows and Martins.

If you should see anything interesting at either of the two sites, such as plants, insects, bird species or bird behaviour, please let the Group know (see below) and photographs are always welcome. The Group is on Facebook where photos are regularly posted.

Work Parties: Please come and join us. For work on Old Down, we meet at Old Down Hall every Thursday 10-12 noon; for work on Beggarwood, we meet monthly on the third Saturday of the month 10-12 noon. Check the website for further information.

### DOUBLE JOY AS CHARLIE FINDS HIS FOREVER HOME AND IS REUNITED WITH HIS FIRST OWNER

In July 2015 Cats Protection's Basingstoke & District Branch received a call about two cats that had been left behind after their owners had been evicted. With a bit of detective work they tracked down their owners and they signed them over to the branch.

Gayna Ballard, Branch Co-ordinator said: "We decided it would be best to home the cats separately. Stella soon found a home but poor Charlie didn't have much luck. Twice we thought we'd found the perfect home but each time it fell through. Then in November, we had a call from a lady called Debbie who was looking for an older cat, and Charlie had caught her eye. They were the perfect match and he settled in straight away.

"When Debbie's sister-in-law, Michelle, met Charlie she couldn't believe her eyes. It turned out Charlie was her cat Sox, who had gone missing five years earlier! They compared photos and he had the same face, eyes, markings and character. When Michelle called his name, he started rubbing himself round her legs. Isn't that incredible?!"

Sox wasn't microchipped by Michelle, so unfortunately she couldn't be traced. He is microchipped now, thankfully, so if he did ever go missing he could be reunited with his new owner, Debbie. It certainly demonstrates the importance of microchipping.



Thousands of cats go missing every year and research conducted by Cats Protection found that almost half never return, so the charity recommends microchipping as a safe and permanent method of identification. The charity reunites 3,000 cats with their owners every year across the UK.

Microchips contain a unique identification number and are inserted under the cat's skin between their shoulder blades. The number is linked to a database containing details of the pet, as well as the owner's contact details. When a scanner detects the microchip, a simple phone call can ascertain the owner's details and the pet can then be quickly returned home.

"However, it is very important pet owners keep their details up to date so owners should check their certificate, which will tell them how to do this," said Gayna.

Prime area 3: - Physical Development

There are 2 elements within this area. For those aged between 22 months – 36 months you might notice some of the following:

### I. Moving and handling

- I can run without bumping into things or tripping up.
- I can squat down on my knees to play and can get up without using my hands.
- I can climb up a ladder on a small slide or climbing frame or onto a sofa or armchair.
- I can kick a large ball.
- I can turn the pages in a book.
   Sometimes I might turn over more than one page at a time.
- I can hold a small jug and pour my own drink
- I can hold a chunky crayon, pencil, pen or paint brush and makes lines that go across, up and down or round and round.
- When I walk up and down stairs or steps I hold onto the hand rail and move one foot at a time on to the next step until both my feet are on. Then I do the same to get to the next step.

### 2. Health and self-care

- I am beginning to choose to hold objects in one hand more than in the other.
- I can hold a spoon to pick up my food and put it into my mouth to feed myself.
- I can drink from a cup with no lid and not spill my drink as I put the cup to my mouth.
- I can tell you when I need to use the potty or toilet.
- I know how far I can climb up the stairs, the slide or the climbing frame on my own before I need to ask you for help.
- I can put on my hat, unzip my coat and take off my unfastened shoes/boots and cardigan/shirt by myself.
- I am beginning to be able to wash and dry my hands by myself.
- I am beginning to be able to sit on a potty or toilet by myself.
- I can use a set of steps to help me reach the sink or toilet by myself

# Things you can do at home to help with this learning: Moving & handling.

- Play ball games with me.
- Give me lots of ribbons that I can wave around me.
- Let me try and dress my teddy or doll with different types of clothes, like coats, jumpers and dresses, and different types of fastenings, like buttons, Velcro and zips.

• Let me help get lunch ready by cutting the cheese or bananas.

COLLABORATIVE LAW: A BETTER WAY TO SEPARATE

Rob Parker, family solicitor at Phillips, explains 'collaborative law', an alternative approach to sorting out family disputes that is increasingly being taken up around North Hampshire.

#### Why collaborative law now?

The way family law works in England is changing the legal system is developing from an adversarial approach to a more collaborative approach which brings the separating couples together to agree matters of importance.

#### How does collaborative law work?

The collaborative process deals with family disputes in a nonconfrontational way. Both parties instruct

their own specially-trained collaborative lawyers and everyone agrees to abide by the Participation Agreement. This means that:

- Neither party should, where possible, go over past events
- · The children and their welfare must be the priority
- There should be complete transparency in dealings with financial matters
- All discussions are regarded as "privileged", which means they cannot be brought up later in a subsequent court case

Both parties and the lawyers will sign the agreement. Matters are then resolved in a series of 'four-way' meetings involving both parties and their solicitors, all in one room together:

### Is it suitable for everything?

Not all situations will suit collaborative law, such as where there has been domestic abuse or a party is not willing to be honest and transparent.

### How does collaborative law differ from mediation or going to court?

Mediation is a voluntary process where both parties sit in the same room as the mediator who is impartial and who is not there to give legal advice. You must both agree on solutions or there is no agreement. During the confidential sessions the mediator will help you and your former partner to identify all the issues that need to be resolved and reach a settlement that is acceptable to both of you.

With collaborative law you each have your own solicitor to represent your interests, important in cases where one party may feel less confident about how to address matters. Your solicitor is also on hand to give you legal advice at all times, including during the face-to-face negotiations.

Whilst in mediation and collaborative law the couple arrives at the agreements themselves if you go through the court process, a judgment will be imposed on you by a third party (ie a judge).

#### Why does collaborative law work?

It works because it's non-confrontational and you will be dealing with competent, trained lawyers who are sympathetic, approachable and understand what you are going through. The priority is to resolve matters your way, not how the lawyers think it should be.

### What's the best possible outcome?

Resolving matters through collaborative law can be quicker, cheaper and more dignified. Where there are children matters can be to resolved in a calm way to retain an agreeable, working relationship as co-parents in the future.

### MAY IN THE GARDEN

May in the garden is when the spring flowers have ended but the next colourful flowers are coming into their own. The threat of frost has passed so you can sow as many seeds as you like. You can directly sow annuals like Zinnias and Foxgloves in your beds. Not forgetting your autumn bedding if you want to start it from seed such as Bellis and Wallflowers. As your seeds start to germinate thin them out to prevent competition from other seedlings. Vegetable seeds can be sown directly into the soil and containers now. Runner beans and climbing French beans make great arch ways with the help of bamboo canes to provide support. These can also be mixed in with Sweet Peas and Nasturtiumeas to create beautiful scent and colour. Don't forget you can also eat the Nasturtiumea flowers as well as Marrigold. You can use the flowers as decretive garnishes on salads in the summer months. You can now plant out your summer bedding too like Sweet Peas. A fun way to display them is by making 'wig wams' and creative shapes, tying in the Sweet Peas to the canes creating all sorts of shapes and even arches. Courgettes can now be planted out but make sure you leave lots of space as they get very big. Courgettes are also very heavy croppers so think of some great ideas to use all the produce. Courgette bread and Courgette cake are some great ones to try out. Plant out your tomatoes outside now and ensure that you pinch out the side shoots and support them with canes. Once the tomato plant has reached the top of the cane pinch out the top shoot to stop it from growing higher. This put energy into the fruits rather than the growth.

Seeds you can sow now are Butternut Squash and Pumpkins as well as your bedding plants ready for the autumn. Herbs can be sown now too. Start off Basil, Coriander and Lemon Grass from seed. These herbs like the warmer months, with a sowing temperature of about 15 degrees plus so shouldn't be placed outside until the temperature is warmer. Keep them in a green house or on a warm window sill but check for watering daily and make sure they get lots of fresh air to help keep diseases and pests away.

Fruit trees should be in full flower now so make sure you feed your trees and keep them watered to ensure you get lots of fruit set. You can also pick your first Raspberries and the last of the Rhubarb, as well as any early Strawberries. Strawberries need as much sun as possible to ensure they are sweet. They also need watering as much as possible to make sure they are juicy. Watch out for slugs and snails and keep picking off as many older leaves as possible. Keep an eye

out for the strawberry plants setting runners and 'nip' them off. This will encourage more flowers to grow and form more fruits.

You can also turn your attention to your lawn now as well. You can sow grass seed on patches and start to water them when needed. Keep an eye on all of your seedlings as the sunshine in the afternoon can dry them out. Keep the patches well watered. You should now be mowing your lawn about once a week but still keeping the mower on a high setting to help the grass recover from the winter months. If you are rejuvenating areas, make sure you barrier these areas off for about two weeks to give the grass a chance to germinate and establish.

May is also the best time of year to harvest the last of any wild garlic before the flowers come through. When foraging for wild plants you must be sure what you are collecting with the correct identification. All foraged greens leaves and flowers should be washed well before eating. Wild garlic is particularly delicious when stirred into pasta and rice dishes during the last minute or two of cooking, when added to sauces for meat and fish dishes. Wild garlic can be used as an alternative to parsley, and also cooked with nettles as an alternative to spinach. It makes an excellent pesto sauce. Rocket, Dill and Tarragon as well as other green salads leaves can add different flavors and textures. Other things to watch out for whilst walking the country side. Fox gloves will be setting seed soon. Foxgloves seed is used in heart medication so ensure children stay out of reach of the seed and if you have lots of young children in the garden its best to pull out the foxgloves or ensure you chop off the flower spicks after flowering.

Keep an eye on any shrubs that have finished flowering such as Forsythia, Ceanothus and Clematis. Now is the best time to prune them back ready for next year's flowers. Plants that flower in spring time set their flower buds on the previous year's growth after the winter so this is an ideal time for any shaping or restructuring you feel needs doing along with any tying in. Keep an eye on other shrubs in the garden and for any additional pruning that may be needed. Look out for birds nesting in shrubs and trees and ensure they have left the nests before pruning and disturbing the wildlife.



### SPIRITUALLY SPEAKING

I love this time after Easter where we hear the various stories of the disciples of lesus encountering him after his resurrection. It reminds us that the disciples and close friends of Jesus, whilst called to proclaim the Good News and carry on Jesus' work were ordinary people with faults and flaws.

There's Thomas who, for over 2,000 years has been tarred with the nickname 'Doubting Thomas'. Thomas didn't have much of a mention in the gospels but that one moment of him wanting to see and touch Jesus' scars has meant the unfair (in my opinion) labelling of his belief! Then there's Peter. Such a key figure in the church but someone who would speak first and think later. It was Peter who denied that he even knew Jesus three times at a time when Jesus needed him the most. But still lesus would refer to him as a 'rock' on which his church would be built.

In the early days of the church, the infamous Christian hunter, Saul who was to become Paul had a conversion experience on the road to Damascus. He then spent the rest of his life proclaiming the Gospel. From chief persecutor to leading evangelist.

At the end of April at Immanuel five people (two young people and three adults) were confirmed. They confirmed their faith for themselves and committed themselves to following Jesus. As a church community we

rejoiced as Bex, Phillip, Julia, Emma and Fe made their commitments. God calls them as he calls you and me. God has a calling for us all and walks with us each and every step of the way. It's good for us to remind ourselves that we are not expected to be flawless, to be perfect; because God knows us and calls us because of who we are. In following lesus we step out trying to live better lives but also aware that we will make mistakes along the way and that life is far from perfect.

This wonderful passage from Isaiah 43 is a great strength: 'But now thus says the Lord, he who created you, O Jacob, he who formed you, O Israel:

Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are mine.

When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you; when you walk through fire you shall not be burned, and the flame shall not consume you. For I am the Lord your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Saviour.

God has a calling for us all just as he called Thomas, Peter, Paul and many others before us. How will we respond to His calling?

### THE IMMANUEL **BIG KNIT**


