### PROBUS CLUB LEARN ABOUT THE OLD INCENSE ROUTES

Richard Tanner, a retired head teacher from North Waltham, gave the Probus Club of Basingstoke an informative insight into the ancient Incense Routes that were so important to the Middle East well before and after Christ. The nativity story of the baby Jesus receiving

gifts from the three Kings of gold, frankincense and myrrh is well known. To hear that incense had a value, weight for weight, greater than gold puts some perspective to the importance of this commodity. How was incense produced and where did it come from? And the Oueen of Sheba comes into the story too.

Richard's interest in the topic came whilst he was teaching geography at the 'Royal' school in Amman, Jordan. This teaching post gave him the opportunity to travel throughout the region.

The term incense, that includes both frankincense and myrrh, refers to a substance that emits a fragrant aroma when burned. Resins are collected from certain tree barks during winter which were found only in the arid regions of Southern Arabia and to a lesser degree in Eastern Africa. As early as the 8th century BC, incense was popular across the ancient world for sanctifying religious ceremonies and masking the pungent odours of burned flesh – from cremations and human sacrifices - and sewage.

Richard described the route taken by incense traders, at first by sea along the coast of Dhofar to the port of Qana in Yemen. The prospect of continuing by boat up the Red Sea was dismissed due to difficult wind patterns and the threat of pirates. The inland route chosen, using camel trains, had extremely difficult terrain with robbers determined to get their hands on the valuable cargo. For some 1500 miles it followed a route parallel with the Red Sea through Medina and on to Petra, thence to Gaza on the Mediterranean coast.

The inhabitants along the route were Nabataeans. They were experts in trading and desert agriculture with skill in water management with its collection and storage in reservoirs. They played a central role in controlling the incense trade route. They built 65 fortresses and resting stations in strategic points along the route to serve and protect the convoys set at a distance of a day's walk, while



the journey could take three months. The 'Incense Route'

reached its peak during the 2nd Century AD. At this time the Romans had succeeded in sailing directly down the Red Sea to

Southern Arabia. From the 4th century AD when Christianity became the official religion, the practice of sacrifice and cremations was avoided and there was a return to ordinary burials leading to a significant reduction in the demand for incense. Finally, following the Moslem conquest of the area in the 2nd half of the 7th century, heralding a further decline in the demand for incense, the trade route died out and the resting stations along the route gradually fell into decay and were deserted.

And the Queen of Sheba? She came from the kingdom of Saba, in present day Yemen. Legend has it that she travelled up the Incense route to Jerusalem to seek the Wisdom of Solomon. And she brought the same gifts the Magi afterwards brought to the infant Jesus.

### ANAEROBIC DIGESTER – UPDATE

Since June, when the County Council Regulatory Committee gave permission for an increase in HGV movements along Woodbury Road, local residents and others have been working with Tamar trying to ensure that the timing and routing restrictions are adhered to by the hauliers. In this period, 14 potential infringements have been reported, of which (at the time of writing) 5 are still unresolved. Of the others, Tamar have actually turned away deliveries or declined collections on a couple of occasions, and have banned 6 drivers from their site completely. They have also warned several hauliers that they are now pursuing a zero tolerance policy. Hopefully this will have the required effect, although we shall have to wait until September to see whether the progress can be maintained when the school run restrictions apply again.

There have been worrying reports of lorries bound to or from the digester going along Beggarwood Lane and Cliddesden Lane (leading to several of the driver bans), and even through the village of Cliddesden, and the temptation to use these banned routes will no doubt increase over the next months and years, as the planned works on the A30 between junction 7 of the M3 and the Brighton Hill roundabout cause massive disruption and delays on that stretch of road. If anybody sees any lorry or tanker they think may be connected with the digester, anywhere other than on Woodbury Road, please let me know; date, time, direction of travel, company, numberplate and, if at all possible, a photo, would be helpful. samthetax@yahoo.co.uk.

Odour from the site. Tamar continue to state that, apart from a very few isolated cases, they are not responsible for any odours afflicting Kennel Farm, Beggarwood or Hatch Warren. A local resident is now coordinating odour reports, so if you become aware of anything let me know and I'll pass the details on; date, time, type of smell, duration and, if possible, wind direction and strength, would help.

Liaison Committee. This Committee is now managed and more under the control of local residents, and will hold quarterly meetings at Hatch Warren Community Centre. If any local resident has any issues they wish to raise in person, or that they wish me or Councillor Terri Reid to raise, please let me know.

### **BACK TO SCHOOL? A GUIDE FOR SEPARATED PARENTS**

When parents separate, it can sometimes be confusing as to which parent should be the main "contact" on the children's school records, which parent gets the school report, which parent goes to parent's evenings and so forth. Below are some ideas to help separated parents overcome these issues.

 Complete a ""Parenting Plan". A template is available on www. cafcass.gov.uk. The Plan is intended to help any parent whatever your situation and provides details of services that can help with developing skills, understanding your child's needs, and getting support to make an agreement. It can help provide a structure in terms of who the school will contact when the children are ill and who will collect the children from school.

 Children of Junior School age or younger often have a narrow perception of the world and feel that everything happening around them is in some way related to what they have thought, felt, said or done. As a result, they often struggle with feeling responsible for their parents separating. It is important that you keep your children's school informed as to the circumstances at home, so that they can provide the children with any support they may need. Many schools offer an "ELSA" (Emotional Literacy Support Assistant) and

these can prove to be a pillar of support for the children.

 Liaise with the school in terms of what they can offer to separated parents. Many schools now have a system which allows the children to have two named addresses as their "home", and school reports and newsletters can be emailed to both parents.

### SEPTEMBER IN THE GARDEN

September is the time of year for the last harvesting to be done. Many fruits and vegetables such as Raspberries, Apples, Courgette and Runner beans are still producing fruits and vegetables. Keep an eye on your pumpkins and squashes and start to place the fruits on plates to keep them off the ground reducing chances of them rotting before they are ready for harvesting. They will soon be ready for harvesting in the next few weeks. You can now start to plant out your autumn vegetables. Such as purple sprouting Broccoli along with Onions and Leeks. Start to tidy up any plants, fruit or vegetables that have finished fruiting such as summer Raspberry canes. Each clump should have a maximum of 5 canes coming from it so choose the ones you don't want and cut them away to the ground. Now is also a good time to feed raspberries and re mulch to help to reduce weeds right through until the spring months. Check any trained fruit and vegetables that are tied in to walls or wires and ensure they are tied in correctly and any trimming back that may be needed.

September brings shorter days and longer nights where there is still plenty to be doing

in the garden. Seeds heads from plants like Foxgloves, Sedum and Lavender will start to turn brown and produce seeds. Try collecting seeds by simply cutting off the seed heads and placing them in a paper bag, allowing them to dry. By allowing them to dry it will ensure the seeds are ripe. To use them the following year keep them in a cool dry place and watch out for any rotting as this can quickly spread to the rest of the seeds. Keep your flowering containers and roses flowering by dead heading and keeping on top of pest and diseases. This will make your plants continue to flower until the first frost start to come.

Now is a good time to think about renovating your beds and ensuring you have all year round interest. You can now start splitting your perennials and re-planting elsewhere in the beds ensuring plants have enough space. This also allows you to look for overcrowding and any plant gaps where additional interest may need to be planted. Try planting some chrysanthemums and Sedums to fill out the gaps providing colour for September. For additional winter colour think about planting Euonymus and Cornus. This will provide you with some colour interest during the winter months. You can also sow hardy annuals seeds right now such as Poppies and Stocks making them into bigger plants for next year. Start to plant your bulbs in the ground now, such as Daffodils and Tulips, giving them lots of time to establish before shooting in January.

Take the time now to protect your ponds for the coming months. Remove any bog bean ensuring the water is clear from the plant's summer growth. Leave the plant material on the side of the pond for a few days allowing any bugs caught to climb back into the pond. Place netting over open water to protect the filter and pumps from getting clogged. Ensure that you raise up submerged plants in nets to stop them from freezing and so they can be removed later. Place bricks around the edges of the ponds to allow animals to climb out if they fall in. Start to drain and remove any unneeded hose pipes and place them away for the winter months to prevent freezing.

Towards the end of September, you will need to think about protecting your plants from any of the first frosts. Any tender plants may need to be covered or moved inside a shed for additional protection.



David Cowling, Vice Chairman, opened the meeting on 3rd August in the absence of John Lambeth, Chairman, by welcoming 52 members. Christine Broadbent, Welfare Officer, gave her report in which she welcomed back those who had been unwell and gave up-to-date news on the members she had been in contact with, including John, who was recovering well from a recent hip replacement operation. Alan illustrated his talk by playing recordings of interviews made by the BBC with some of the women involved in these undertakings and he also had with him some WW1 mementos.



### **KEMPSHOTT CONSERVATION GROUP**

**The Cinnabar Moth**. The familiar yellow Ragwort (Jacobaea vulgaris) flowers from mid July into September and is the food plant of the Cinnabar Moth (Tyria jacobaea), one of the few insects that can cope with the alkaloid toxins stored in the plant.

The adult moth will lay her eggs on the plant in early Spring. Once the caterpillars hatch they start munching their way through the Ragwort plant, ingesting the toxins, to which they are immune. This build-up of toxin is passed on to the over wintering pupae ready to be propagated to the next generation of adult moths. Consequently the adult Cinnabar Moth is claimed to be the most poisonous moth species in Britain.

The adult is a striking red and black moth that is often seen flying in the daytime, because no self respecting bird would dare try eating it. The caterpillars also wear their yellow and black striped jackets with impunity, as a warning to other predator birds or insects.

The early part 2016 was a difficult year for insects. Normally, we would expect to see the caterpillars in July and even by the end of the month they had not put in an appearance. However, despite the County Council trimming the sides of the path, the caterpillars started to be seen on 1st August.



With few predators, one would think that this would lead to huge larval populations. They are, however, their own worst enemy. They are so voracious that they tend to eat themselves out of a sustainable food supply. It is not uncommon to see patches of ragwort stripped bare with caterpillars wandering around aimlessly looking for alternative sources. A large caterpillar population one year can, therefore, lead to many not surviving to pupation due to a lack of sufficient food supply. To crown it all, if there is no ragwort available, they are not above eating each other.

While the plant foliage is toxic, the nectar isn't and the plant provides a magnet for butterflies, bumble bees and hoverflies.


