## PROBUS CLUB SHOWN MODELS VALUED AT £150,000

Four hand built models of the Royal State coaches housed at Buckingham Palace and one of Prince Phillip's "Eventing" carriages were demonstrated to the Probus Club of Basingstoke by expert model maker Peter Smith. He is a member of the Guild of Model Wheelwrights that although based in Britain has many overseas members, and has been presented with a Gold Award for his outstanding quality of craftsmanship. In twenty years of entering his models in competitions under the auspices of the Model Engineering Exhibition he has achieved nineteen medals and one highly commended certificate.

The models displayed are part of ten precision models he has made of the coaches held in the Royal Mews. They are unique in being the only set of scratch built 1/8 scale (1½ inches to one foot) models ever made of the State coaches and only came about after Peter was initially granted permission to take the measurements from the 1838 State Landau at Windsor Castle. When the model was completed he took it back to show the staff at Windsor Castle. They were so impressed at the quality of workmanship that he was summoned to show the model to the Crown Equerry who subsequently gave Peter permission to go to the Royal Mews. HRH The Prince Phillip no longer uses his "Eventing" carriage in competitions but is today used for shooting parties in Windsor Great Park and at Royal Ascot. Peter took 15 months to make this model but it was the door opener to him being able to make what he describes as his Royal Collection.

The Scottish State coach was built in 1850 and is used by HM The Queen and the Duke of Edinburgh. The model took about sixteen months to make of which about a quarter of this time was used in its painting. The Queen Alexandra State coach is used for the State Opening of Parliament. Whenever HM The Queen uses it then only Windsor Grey horses are used. The model has bevelled glass windows that fully open.

King Edward VII had a landau built in 1902 as a town coach made to suit his bulky size but he died before it was completed. It has been used for the wedding of HRH The Prince Charles and



Lady Diana Spencer and more recently for the marriage of HRH The Prince William and Miss Kate Middleton. The model took twenty months to complete and had five coats of paint and six of varnish. Each layer was rubbed down with the smoothest emery paper with each coat left to harden for at least a week.

The Irish State coach was built in 1838. A quotation had been issued for £850 and even though Buckingham Palace had not responded the carriage manufacturer in Dublin proceeded thinking that the quotation had been accepted. When the finished result was seen by the representatives of the Royal household they decided to pay the quoted price. Peter made 40 pages of detailed drawing and measurements before then taking six weeks to make the final detailed working drawing. The model took two years to make and has been valued at £50,000. The National Trust valuer described it not as a model but as a "Fine Work of Art".

In fact the ten models in the Royal


Collection have a value of £300,000 and have been seen by the Queen, Prince Phillip, and Princess Anne while on display at the Royal Windsor Horse Show. They have featured on TV and in numerous magazines and newspaper articles. However the stipulation from Buckingham Palace is that the models in the Royal Collection cannot be sold

but must be bequeathed to the Royal Household when Peter passes away.

Peter lives in Bourne End in Buckinghamshire and is a carpenter by trade. He started making model horse drawn vehicles in 1977 and worked his way through sixteen of the Guild's plans before developing his own measured models.

The Guild of Model Wheelwrights, whose patron is HRH The Prince Phillip, Duke of Edinburgh KG KT, is a group of enthusiasts who are devoted to the construction and promotion of precision scale models of all types of horse drawn vehicles. The range includes agricultural machinery, carts and wagons, light and heavy commercial vehicles, passenger and road vehicles, gypsy caravans and many little known but fascinating vehicles that are of great historical interest.

#### **ISSUES!**

There is so much going on in the area at the moment it is hard to know where to start. One big piece of news is that the outline application for development at Hounsome Fields was approved by the Council's Development Control Committee. The application includes around 750 homes plus a primary school, nursery and community centre. In the Local Plan Hounsome Fields was designated as one of the sites to take gypsy and traveller provision. The developers argued against this but councillors led by Cllr Potter of Popley and Cllr Cubbitt of Basing insisted that some pitches for gypsy and travellers should be included, and this was eventually agreed by the committee.

The application was only an outline so there will be further iterations coming forward and there is not yet an indicative date for work to start. As part of the outline approval the application includes a road which would run through the estate and link up with the south of Manydown.

Applegreen working with the Portsmouth estates are bringing forward an application for a motorway service area on land close to the digester at Farleigh Wallop. The service station would be on the south bound carriageway. The developers have given an undertaking that there would be no road access except from the motorway. If this is the case then it would allay some fears of rat running through Beggarwood and Hatch Warren, but we will need to see the finer detail as it comes forward. I still have concerns and feel it is a further unnecessary and unwanted development close to the estate.

Kennel Farm building is well under way now including the sewerage works which have necessitated pipe being laid through the edge of Beggarwood Park. Roadworks associated with the development will continue through to next spring. These will run to the same timeframe as improvements to the A30 roundabout which is due to begin at the end of September.

There is also an application coming forward for an infill development of houses at Beggarwood close to Longcross Lane and Oceania Crescent. The application numbers are 16/03048/FUL and 16/03049/FUL. I will be putting in objections and asking for the application to be taken to Committee.

An application to build a new retail park on the old Smiths Industries site on the A30 is going through consultation with residents and councillors. If given permission the site would include a new Aldi store, some furniture outlets, a coffee shop and a Nandos and some other stores yet to be confirmed.

And of course work continues to monitor HGVs to and from the digester, and there are still complaints coming in from residents of breaches in traffic movements and odour emissions.

#### MOTORWAY SERVICES AREA PLANNING DAY

At the "Planning Day" presented at Hatch Warren Community Centre on 14th September by the Irish company, Applegreen, that proposes to build the Motorway Services Area;

Applegreen were absolutely insistent that there is no possibility at all of any "rear access" to the site from Garlic Lane. They said that the only possibility of non-motorway access would be if it was deemed necessary for the emergency services to have off-motorway access, and that would be a locked gate to which only the emergency services would have a key that Applegreen would never have a key. On the issue of staff access, of a nondriver from Beggarwood having to travel somehow up to junction 6 and then back down, to get to work, they were adamant that would be the journey - no staff access from Garlick Lane, even by foot or by bike. They stated that they would provide staff transport - such as a minibus from and to Beggarwood - if there was a need.

They were unable to confirm how the construction traffic would access the site. They **thought** there would be a

"very short" period when construction traffic came through Hatch Warren or Beggarwood, until they had built enough of the access and egress roads to enable all further construction access to be solely from the M3. They are going to provide further clarification on this point.

The question was raised of whether there is actually any need for another services here, given Fleet, Winchester and Popham, and Applegreen claim there definitely is such a need, because there must be no more than half an hour between services, and they thought it likely there could be traffic hold-ups making the trip time for the 22 miles between Fleet and Winchester more than half an hour (maybe they know something about future plans for messing about with traffic flows on the M3 that we don't!). They insist that it is a vital safety issue that drivers are able to take a break and obtain refreshment without having to travel the whole distance from Fleet to Winchester services. However, they could not answer the question of why an MSA is so necessary southbound, while drivers going north will still have to struggle the enormous distance from Winchester to Fleet services without being able to get

Applegreen also claim that they will take any measures they can to mitigate the effects of their site lighting on the residents of Beggarwood, but that in any case the lighting will be designed to be as unobtrusive as possible.

They maintain that there are no safety issues of "lane weaving", given the proximity to the site of junctions 7 and 8, and of having people buying coffee at the proposed drive-through coffee shop, then charging back out onto the M3 with a cup of hot coffee in hand.

They have employed a very high-flying and no doubt expensive PR company to present their case - which indicates they are concerned about their image. So, **if** they **are** as good as their word, then the major potential issue, access through Hatch Warren and Beggarwood, shouldn't be a major problem. It's a very big if, though.

#### OCTOBER IN THE GARDEN

October is the time of year for tidying the garden up and preparing for the colder months ahead. Cleaning out and preparing your green house or sheds is a good idea before placing lots of plants in them. Checking for holes in the base of sheds and greenhouses will reduce the chance of any mice or other animals that may damage your plants during the winter months.

You can also lift, split and move larger plants, such as Dahlias and Fuschias. Moving them to a more protected location will ensuring they are able to continue growing next year. Larger herbaceous perennial plants, such as Hemerocallis and Crocosmia can now be cut back, split and moved to give them more space in the flowers beds. Preparing your flower beds for the winter months is essential now and will ensure it gives your plants a really good start in the New Year. This doesn't have to be an expensive. Reusing your waste, either in the compost bin or by using a small chipper is a great way to recycle essential nutrients.

This time of year is a good time for trimming larger shrubs and hedges to tidy them up for winter. The waste from the pruning can be re used on the garden, or if you have a chipper use it first to break it up and then spread around the garden. If you don't have a chipper you can still cut up smaller waste from branches and place in the compost bin, but this will take longer to break down to make your compost. Chippings can be used to make your own mulch to put back on to the beds to help with weed control throughout the year.

When placing mulch on flower beds be sure that you have prepared them first by weeding and moving any plants beforehand. When the preparation is done you can apply your home made mulch to the surface. To ensure a good covering, place the mulch about 5cm thick. Make sure to remove bark from the bases of larger trees and shrubs to prevent rotting at the base. In the spring months you will need to add fertilizer to the beds to help the soil from nitrogen fixing organisms. This is when bark mulch begins to break down and uses nutrients within the soil to help this process. By adding a fertilizer in

the spring it will ensure the nutrients are evenly balanced in the soil.

Now is the perfect time to think about your winter bedding and bulbs planting. Bulbs such as Daffodil, Alliums and Tulips can now be planted in the ground ready for spring interest. Wallflowers, Violas, Primulas and trailing Ivy can also be planted to help freshen up any hanging baskets and containers for a colour over the winter months. You can also sow any hardy annuals you may have directly, such as Love in the mist, Marigold, Poppies and Honesty. You can also sow your Broad beans directly in to the ground, as well as Leeks, Cabbages, Garlic and Onions from sets. There is still time to harvest lots of fruit and vegetables, such as Pumpkins, Squashes, Melons and any leftover Beans.



#### BASINGSTOKE'S POOR LAW UNION

Basingstoke's Poor Law Union had its first meeting in May 1835. The Union comprised 37 parishes, with a total population of over 15,000 - the third largest in Hampsire. The areas of Hatch Warren, Beggardwood and Kempshott were part of the union.

A new workhouse on a standard design was built on Basing Road, on the site of the present BMI The Hampshire Clinic, at a cost of  $\pounds 7,500$ .

The first paupers entered the workhouse in October 1836. Over the course of its life it was occupied by about 150 to 200 paupers at any one time - most of them were children or sick and elderly people who had become destitute. Most of the poor relief provided by the union was in 'out-relief' in the form of money for rent and nursing care, bread and occasional meat or even brandy for the sick. The poor law unions in England provided the first free medical care for poor people.

The workhouse system ended in 1929, but Basingstoke Workhouse and its new infirmary remained open for many more years, through WW2 and the beginning of the NHS in 1948, until it was finally abandoned in the 1970s. It fell into disrepair and the site was cleared, making way for the new private hospital in 1984.

The book describes in detail how all this happened, from the first meetings of the new Board of Guardians, through the beginnings of our local government system, still in place today, to the demolition of the old workhouse and infirmary.

DISPUTED WILLS AND INHERITANCE ACT CLAIMS

The loss of a loved one is always a sad and difficult time. The situation can be made all the worse if there is a dispute over the contents of a will or if there is another inheritance issue. This is where our Litigation Team can help, working closely with our Wills & Probate Team, providing expert legal advice, with a sympathetic approach and with a minimum of distress.

An example of this is when we are sometimes asked if there is anything that can be done if a will fails to make adequate provision for someone who was financially dependant on the deceased.

Whilst we are generally free to dispose of our assets as we see fit, the law, through the Inheritance (Provision for Family and Dependants) Act 1975, does provide protection for people who have been financially dependant on the deceased. The aim of the Act is to provide legal protection for spouses, children and other dependants, where a person has died without leaving sufficient money for their continued wellbeing. If a will fails to make reasonable financial provision, then you may be able to make an Inheritance Act claim. In this situation the court will take into account the applicant's needs and resources and consider these against what would be reasonable for their maintenance.

Alternatively, there may be various ways in which to challenge a will, for instance when a will has not been

executed properly, where the testator did not have capacity to enter into a will or where undue pressure has been put on the testator from a third party.

If you are considering making a claim disputing the validity of a will or making a claim under the Inheritance Act, it is important that you seek specialist advice at the earliest opportunity. It is worth bearing in mind that to bring a claim under the Act, you must start your case in court within six months of the Grant of Probate being obtained. Permission of the court is required if a claim is made too late.




















#### HATCH WARREN UNDER FIVES



As a church we are constantly looking for ways to show our love in this community – if there's anything more we can do, get in touch as we share God's love in Hatch Warren and Beggarwood.
