LOCAL DEMOCRACY WEEK

Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council took part in Local Democracy Week recently. The idea is to encourage wider interest and participation in local democracy, especially among young people. The heart of this was a debate at Queen Mary's College, with the main participants being the students.

The Council's Democratic Services team arranged the event working with QMC. Cllr Nigel Pierce and I were asked to go along and speak on the role of the local councillor, with Cllr Pierce also speaking about his post as Chair of the Scrutiny Committee. I mentioned my Cabinet role and gave some examples of ward work, but my main point was to stress the importance of young people engaging with the political process, voting and making their voices heard.

We then handed over to the students. They had been set the task of debating the EU referendum. One student put the case for continuing membership, and another for coming out. The students then had a vote which was organised by Democratic Services complete with ballot slips and a voting booth. The students voted by a large majority to stay in the EU.

It is so important for local people to feel a part of the process and for young people to gain the habit of voting and participating. My heart always sinks when I knock on a door and am told that the residents never vote. I've studied the suffragettes and they are very dear to my heart. Democracy and the vote were dearly won and should be cherished.



A quick dash to the crop field and a polite request to start the ploughing at the far side of the field, and all was well!

And, as always, the weather was kind, showing off our beautiful countryside in

the best light.

In other news, our new C25k starts on Monday with 25 people signed up ready to start their running journey. The cross country season has started and we are hoping to achieve some great results again this year in the league. Finally, our annual 24 hour run in memory of local school boy Jayden Wilson who lost his battle with cancer two years ago, will take place 25-26 November. 














HELLO FROM CVP!



PROBUS CLUB HEARS TELLING TALES

Amusing anecdotes kept coming Iswhen Susan Howe gave a talk to





had nothing to do with anything equine but was about her wide experiences of life and with the ability to recall minute details that made the talk so interesting.

She had been working as a cook on a yacht in the Mediterranean in the 60s when she met Bridget Bardot's ex-husband, Gunter Sachs, who was one of the original playboys. She went to work for him and his celebrity guests in his chalet in St Moritz. During her time there she met several well known people including the Formula I World Champion, Jackie Stewart, the film director, Roman Polanski, several members of the Bismarck family and the last king of Morocco. Susan admitted

"I couldn't really cook but the good thing about very rich people is that they dine out a lot."

In the early 70s Susan worked for Sir John Betjeman, soon to become Poet Laureate. She stood in for his long-standing PA for a year and met his famous teddy bear, Archie and Jumbo the toy elephant. A well known eccentric John Betjeman had many visitors including Mary Wilson, wife of Prime Minister Harold Wilson, who was a published poet. Barrie Humphries of characters Dame Edna Everage and Sir Les Patterson fame was a regular caller.

Various men of the cloth came seeking financial support for their particular church. If they were from what he considered to be the lower sects of religion, Methodists or Baptists, he would not let Archie sit in on their discussions in case it affected its thinking. On another occasion Susan recalled that the great poet had made a theatre booking with pre-performance supper for himself and Archie. That night he didn't think that Archie was feeling up to it so Susan had to change the bookings.

When John Betjeman got married he arrived, on his wedding night, at his bedroom door wearing a long nightshirt and carrying Archie and Jumbo under each arm. When his new bride commented about what she saw he made it very clear to her that she was very much in fourth position in his life. When Susan left his employment he bade her farewell with

"Gosh we've had fun – what a shame you couldn't type!"

During this time she shared a flat in London with Jan who was the daughter of a vet in Thirsk called Donald Sinclair. He was the partner of the vet who used the pen name James Herriot to write "All Creatures Great and Small" that became a successful TV series. Apparently Jan knew he was so incensed by the character Siegfried Farndon, played by Robert Hardy, that he refused to watch the programme.

After completing the notoriously demanding two years course she passed the exam set by the London Tourist Board, qualifying as a Blue Badge Guide which enabled her to guide at all the major London sites. London Blue Badge guides can also guide in other parts of UK which meant she could be away for up to three weeks. She accompanied an amazing array of specialist groups

ranging from Hymnologists studying hymn writers to Mills & Boon authors specialising in the Regency period, and from Debt Collectors to the American Bar Association and the 200 strong Yale Alumni choir. Immediately prior to her visit to Probus she had accompanied the Bishop of North Dakota around London.

Not content with acting as a guide in Britain she has taken painting tours to Zanzibar, riding tours in the Rockies, wildlife tours in Africa and tiger tours in the jungles of India.



SPIRITUALLY SPEAKING

I love books and I love cooking but rarely have time to read or cook! In my study there is a pile of books collected from various places over the course of the last six months or so just waiting to be read. There are some authors who do take priority and as a result their books are read fairly quickly. Other books, which I have bought because they look interesting or on a subject I'm interested in often lie around before making the transition to my over-full bookshelves. There are plenty of books that are still waiting to be read!

One book that I bought a little while ago and read quickly was 'Accidental Saints' by Nadia Bolz-Webber. This is the second book I have of Nadia's and it was read quickly; I've seen her speak and she's somewhat of a hero of mine; heavily tattood with a mouth that uses expletives rather liberally. She's also a Lutheran Pastor and leads a church called 'House for all sinners and saints'.

The book begins with Nadia explaining that early on in her church's history, they began a tradition of making 'saint cookies' on All Saints' Sunday. She goes on to tell of an experience where she had discovered that another woman, at the turn of the century had planted a church in Denver; years before her church had been established.

She says; 'I didn't know of many women who had set out to start churches all by themselves, much less at the turn of the twentieth century, so, desperate as I was for someone I could place in the category "hero" and "role model" (since I too, was setting out to be a female pastor of a new church in Denver), I pulled out my phone and Googled....."Alma Bridwell White was the founder and a bishop of the Pillar of Fire Church" I went on to read that in 1918 she became the first female bishop in the United States. She was noted for her feminism (yes!) and her association with (wait for it....) the Klu Klux Klan, her ant-Catholicism, anti Semitism, anti Pentecostalism, racism

and hostility to immigrants (f***)."

"The next day I called my Episcopal friend Sara to tell her the story of how I though I had a hero only to find out she was just a lousy racist. Sara's response? "Email me her name, I'll add her to the Litany of Saints along with all the other broken people of God.....I didn't want her name on the Litany of Saints...I want racists to stay in the 'racist' box. When they start sneaking into the 'saint' box it makes me nervous. But that's how it works. On All Saints Sunday I am faced with sticky ambiguities around saints who were bad and sinners who were good."

At the beginning of November the church celebrates the festival of All Saints. We also remember, at the end of October, all those who have died at our All Souls service. It's a time of remembering and as Nadia Bolz-Weber describes, saints aren't or weren't actually perfect human beings; they've all got their faults. You see, God works through all of us as imperfect beings. He chose one of the most vicious early Christian persecutors in Paul to become the person who travelled far to spread the good news of Jesus Christ. Paul who had hunted down Christians to try to put an end to this early sect. Even Peter whom Jesus said was the rock on which he would build his church denied Christ three times when it really mattered and asked some really stupid questions.

So, as a church we remember all the saints; their faults and their gifts. We remember before God that we are all set aside and chosen by him because we are who we are. And so, at this time, I'd ask you to think of who the saints are in your lives. Give thanks for them and rejoice that they are who they are.

I'd also strongly recommend Nadia Bolz-Weber's book, 'Accidental Saints'. The language is strong, but it's all about real life.

At Immanuel, at the end of November things will be getting a little busier. We've the Advent Activity Morning for all on Saturday 26th November from 10am and a busy Christmas Season (see our poster for full details). If you've lost a loved one in the past and would like to remember them by lighting a candle, we're having our All Souls service at 6.30pm on Sunday 30th October. All are very welcome. Full details are on our website and Facebook page. We'd love to see you.
