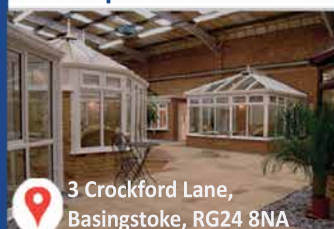

PROBUS LEARN OF "THE FORGOTTEN BATTLE" - THE BATTLE OF THE SCHELDT ESTUARY IN OCTOBER AND NOVEMBER 1944

Retired RAF Squadron Leader Chris Perkins MVO, from Kempshott, is himself a member of the Probus Club of Basingstoke the social organisation for retired professional and business managers. He gave a presentation to members about his recent activity tracing his old squadron's role in supporting the Allied Forces in their campaign to free Belgium and Holland from German occupation during WW2.

Based for many years at RAF Odiham, 33 Squadron is today more familiar to the residents of Basingstoke for flying the Puma troop carrying helicopter and Chinooks from other squadrons based at this station. However, during the Second World War it operated the Supermarine Spitfire in the ground attack role in the support of the army.

In the course of following the fortunes of both air and ground crews in their journey from the Normandy landings, Chris has uncovered an incredible story regarding a battle, almost completely overshadowed by the tragic events occurring at that time at Arnhem.

The Battle of the Scheldt was a military operation in northern Belgium and the south western Netherlands to secure the port of Antwerp, essential for allied re-supply use. The First Canadian Army was given the task of clearing the Scheldt area of German occupiers. Believing the retreating troops to be demoralised and lacking in fight, the initial attacks in September proved otherwise. Hitler had told every member of his forces dug in around the Scheldt estuary that they had to defend their positions to the last man and bullet. Their families would be held as retribution if they failed to do so.

Under the command of General Crerar, the First Canadian Army was international in character. In addition to Canadian infantry and armoured troops, it included the 1st British Corps, and the 1st Polish Armoured Division. At various times it also included American, Belgian, and Dutch units. The First Canadian Army in north western Europe during the final phases of the war was a powerful force, the largest army that had ever been under the control

of a Canadian general. The strength of this army ranged from approximately 105,000 to 175,000 Canadian soldiers to anywhere from 200,000 to over 450,000 when including the soldiers from other nations. It was totally volunteer in nature.

The enemy opened the sea locks and flooded the whole countryside making what some historians considered to have been the most difficult battlefield of the Second World War. With flooded and muddy terrain and the tenacity of the well-fortified German defences made the Battle of the Scheldt especially gruelling and bloody. At the end of the five week offensive, the victorious First Canadian Army had taken 41,043 prisoners, but suffered 12,873 casualties (killed, wounded, or missing), 6,367 of whom were Canadians.

And what of 33 Squadron from RAF Odiham? At that time it was also an international unit and consisted of many volunteer pilots from around the world. The Spitfires were used to support the ground troops by attacking enemy positions. Unfortunately many pilots lost their lives. Chris located a number of these brave young airmen now resting in remote cemeteries. Two graves were for 22 years old New Zealander Warrant Officer George James Roney and that of Flt Lt Godfrey Argument a 23 years old Canadian.

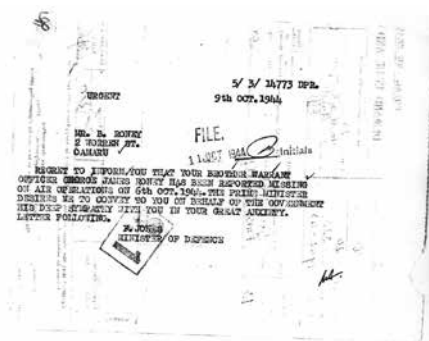
WO George Roney took off at 15.00 on 6th October 1944 as part of a three Spitfire armed reconnaissance sortie. Good weather favoured the German air defence batteries and all three aircraft were shot down after encountering heavy flak. George went down with his Spitfire near the hamlet of Schoondijke. On 9th October 1944 his family received a "Missing on air operations" telegram. His remains were not recovered until 9th

June 1948 as were his personal possessions which included a "penny" or tin whistle which he brought with him from the other side of the world as his family all played musical instruments. On 12th June 1948

WO George Roney was given a proper burial in the local cemetery where he is the only Commonwealth War Grave and has been adopted by children from the local school.

The "penny" whistle is now on display in a war museum in the Zeeland area of Holland.

The North Hampshire Downs Ramblers group, is part of the Ramblers Association, we walk mostly in Hampshire and the surrounding countryside. In the last few months our group has enjoyed both walks and social activities including a Christmas Lunch and our Christmas Jumper walk.

The group walk on both Tuesday and Saturday and cover areas in and around Basingstoke as well as sometimes going further afield. We have had some lovely winter walks over the last few months and are now looking forward to bluebells and Spring.

Our Tuesday morning walks, which are typically 6-7 miles continues to attract quite a number of walkers. We have recently walked around Hartley Wintney, Oakley and Hannington to name but a few. We usually end up with an end of walk pub stop, to give people time for a catch up.

Our Saturday walks tend to be longer, with fewer walkers, and can sometimes take most of the day. This last quarter we have enjoyed walks around Tisbury in Wiltshire, done parts of the Thames Path, and walked from Overton to Whitchurch with a bus back.

As well as the walks, the group also enjoys some social activities, this includes an Annual Summer Picnic, Boys lunches and the group occasionally organise weekends and days away. This May there is a coach

trip planned to Bourton-on-the-Water and also a break in Paignton in June, which will involve 4 days of organised walks

The group have an active path patrol group, who report problems to the local council and also do some work on the paths, which can be as varied as checking waymarking and replacing waymarking discs, minor clearing or even repairing stiles and gates. The latest tasks were replacing a rotting sleeper bridge at Ashford Hill, and replacing a stile at Hannington with a Kissing gate

The operators of the nearby Anearobic Digester will be holding their annual public open day on the morning of Saturday 18th March. There will be tours of the facility and there will also be the opportunity to ask questions of staff. Work on the very long awaited Beggarwood Community Centre is finally due to get underway. Pre-commencement works are due to start on 20th February with work properly getting underway from 20th March. If all goes to plan the centre should be ready to be opened before the end of the year.

South East Water have announced that as part of their upgrades to the local water system they will be installing 447 metres of new main around Hatch Warren roundabout and part of Winchester road. HATCH WARREN RUNNERS

February can be a dreary month and with a daily average of just 2 hours sunshine, we all need a means of boosting those endorphins. Running can be just what the doctor ordered!

Spurred on by an England Athletics initiative our Coaching Coordinator, Helen Brooker, currently out of 'running action' after sustaining a broken leg, organised a 'run and talk' event.

Also supported by Mind, the mental health charity, England Athletics are encouraging people to #runandtalk to improve their mental well-being through running and to break down the stigma associated with mental health by getting people talking about it. A fellow club member Matt Holman who is also a Samaritan, joined over 40 other runners for a 4 mile all abilities run finishing with a social gathering at The Portsmouth Arms. It was unanimously agreed the evening was a real hit and HWR are planning to make the #runandtalk event a regular date on the monthly club calendar.

On the 5th of February a hardy 'Hatchie' Nathan Pitsch (pictured) completed the 'Thames trot' 50 mile endurance event. Nathan signed up for it soon after recovery from a hernia operation after being persuaded to do it by fellow HWR member. Nathan had a few problems with logistics for the day as his lift/ race team fell ill. However, the race director was very helpful, and although Nathan was running his first ultra, with no other Hatchies, he had been advised the 'ultra-community' was very welcoming and he had made sure he had completed



plenty of long runs. The route was very muddy due to rain the week before, but the support staff were very helpful and there was very good race food at the checkpoints. The course tested his map reading skills but the high spirits of everyone and team work kept him going. Nathan would recommend 'Thames trot' 50 but says do take a head torch (Nathan didn't!). You also need training buddies and he did a lot of his training with fellow Hatchies Jeff Mitchell and Elliot Holt who gave him lots of tips and inspiration. Without them he didn't feel he would have risen to the challenge!

Q. What's your Job Title?

A. Fire Fighter

Q. What does this entail?

A. I respond to emergency calls. These can include fires, road accidents, assisting the ambulance, rescuing people and animals. We also carry out 'Safe and Well' visits to make sure the elderly are getting the care that they need. The list is endless. When we are not responding to incidents we have lots of training to complete, which makes us better at dealing with the incidents when they occur.

Q. What's the most unusual situation you've encountered in your daily work?

A. Difficult one to answer - I am stuck on this one. We mainly go to nasty things. Or kids with things stuck on their heads!

Q. What made you join HWR?

A. I started to run with a friend after having children. She heard about HWR and suggested we join. I was not sure that I would like running in a group of people but instantly saw the benefits.



There is such a variety of training/run sessions every week and also great support when I having a bad run. I have made some wonderful friends too.

Q. What's your current running goal?

A. I would like to get my distance back up to half marathons and get quicker at the shorter distances. I would like to do a half 'iron-man' (triathlon)

Q. If you could run any event, anywhere in the world, what would it be and why?

A. would love to do an endurance event; anywhere just to have that amount of fitness would be amazing.

Q. What's the most useful piece of advice you could give to a new runner?

A. Running never gets easier as your goals will always change. Just get out and enjoy it.

SUPPORT GROUP FOR HOME EDUCATED CHILDREN

There are a large number of home educated children in Basingstoke and quite a few right here in Hatch Warren and Beggarwood. While they benefit from many classes and activities as family groups, drop off facilities for younger age groups have been non-existent. Until now. Starting in April, Home Ed Hub will be a new weekly drop-in session for home educated children aged 5 to 11. Held in The Warren Youth Club at the Hatch Warren Community Centre, it will have a

different theme each week. Sessions will also run through school holidays and half terms so will be open to school-going children too on those dates.

The idea is that home educated children's learning can be supported by people who share the same educational outlook and values and whose home educated children will also be present on each session.

Hatch Warren resident Vanessa Deakin is organising these sessions. "Being a home educating parent is hard work and can

prove to be exhausting. I felt that many home educating parents will welcome a safe environment where they can leave their children for a few hours together with their peers."

UNMARRIED COUPLES NEED TO PROTECT THEMSELVES

A recent landmark victory in the Supreme Court has seen an unmarried woman win a share of her former partner's pension. This is likely to add impetus to the drive for greater rights for unmarried couples. But, in the meantime, cohabitants should face up and formalise arrangements, rather than keeping their fingers crossed.

Such difficulties play out all too often for cohabiting couples, whether in relation to shared property or what happens to their assets when they separate or die. Many still believe in the idea of so-called 'common law marriage', assuming they have legal rights like married couples or civil partners on death, only to discover the harsh truth when problems arise.

It may seem unfair; but cohabiting couples do not have the protection that comes with marriage or civil partnership. Currently, the onus is on the couple to take action if they wish to protect both parties in case of death, separation or other life changes.

There are three main areas where couples should look to protect themselves, and each other; and that's with a cohabitation agreement, formalising how property is owned and each making a will. These all help to avoid uncertainty if the worst happens.

A cohabitation agreement is a formal arrangement setting out what will happen if a couple separate. This can also set out day-to-day matters,

such as who is responsible for household expenditure and in what proportions. It should be drawn as a deed, independently witnessed and with both parties able to demonstrate there was no duress and each was able to seek independent advice, if required.

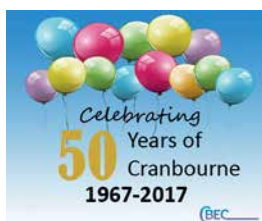
NEWS FROM CRANBOURNE

Bird Box Roundup

All ten boxes in Down Grange Meadow have now been checked. 2016 was a particularly bad and stressful year for birds. Having had the second warmest winter on record, only 1869 was warmer, with slightly above average rainfall, it was looking good going into March. March and particularly April were, however, colder and wetter than average. This had the effect of killing off or suppressing the emergence of caterpillars and other insect larvae, the type of food that parent birds feed their chicks, just at the wrong time.

Results

In analysing the contents of the nest boxes, a number of them appeared to have been reused. The first (bottom) nest had very little to show apart from the occasional unhatched egg. This may imply that the parents abandoned the nest through disturbance or lack of food. The results from the second or top nest were very poor. Out of ten boxes, only two had no remains of dead chicks and/or unhatched eggs. One cannot even say that an empty nest was a success, as it could have been abandoned without producing anything. Unfortunately, unlike Robins or Blackbirds, our Blue and Great Tits generally only raise a single brood, which is why they have so many eggs in a clutch, typically between 8 and 12. To summarise:

2014 - No dead chicks were found and only 1 unhatched egg remained

2015 - 9 dead chicks and 9 unhatched eggs were found

2016 - 12 dead chicks and 13 unhatched eggs were found

Nest Material

We are constantly surprised at what material gets woven into a nest. Those boxes along the Northern Belt (between Down Grange Meadow and the sports pitches) all had coloured wool. What was surprising was that each female will use one predominant colour, which varied from box to box. Presumably, having found a source of wool, the female would return again and again to raid the same source? The boxes along the Insect Walk (parallel to Winchester Road at the bottom of the meadow) used a soft woolly felt like material, very similar to that used to cover tennis balls. The colour range we found precludes actual tennis balls, but what the material was, and where it came from, is still a mystery.

FESTIVAL TO CELEBRATE JANE AUSTEN AND OTHER HOME-GROWN TALENT

'Born in the borough' has been announced as the theme of the sixth Basingstoke Festival, which is set to be the best yet.

YOU CAN'T CHOOSE YOUR NEIGHBOURS

They say, 'you can choose your friends, but you can't choose your family.' The same could also be said of neighbours.

Neighbour disputes can be particularly fraught; apart from the old adage that 'an Englishman's home is his castle,' there are some obvious reasons for this. Firstly, it is the parties' home and family lives that are directly affected which inevitably makes them highly 'personal.'

Secondly, parties are necessarily living side by side and as a result don't have the luxury of space and time away from the problem, which can often serve as such a sobering influence in a dispute. It is that much harder to approach matters calmly and practically when confronted on a daily basis with the problem and often matters escalate needlessly as a result.

There are a number of ways disputes can arise. If handled properly though, there is every chance of avoiding formal litigation, which can be lengthy, extremely costly and is always highly stressful for the parties involved.

Boundaries are a common source of discord. Whether it is by the land

physically changing over time or by the boundary being poorly recorded, any ambiguity over the position of a boundary can lead to conflict. Boundaries features themselves can also cause problems; whether it is in establishing whose responsibility it is to maintain a boundary feature or whether anything can be done about an offending boundary feature, for example one that blocks sunlight from a neighbouring property.

There are probably endless other ways that could be found to fall out with a neighbour, but the most common other problem areas concern rights of way, parking, and nuisance, for example, excessive noise. Cases all turn on their particular facts and we will be able to advise you clearly as to where you stand in law and what your options are.

Where disputes become heated it can be sensible to avoid a direct approach and seek professional help. In extreme cases where there is any fear for anyone's safety you should in the first instance consider involving the police.

Whilst it remains unresolved, any dispute will directly affect your

property. If you wish to sell, you will have to disclose the issue which could have a negative impact on the marketability or even the value of your property. It may seem that by instructing a solicitor you are escalating a dispute, but in most cases it is the best way of moving towards a solution quickly and calmly. Dealing with a difficult neighbour directly, perhaps over the back fence can make matters worse.

We advise that the best way to resolve disputes is by focussing solely on the legal issues and practical solutions. In fact our advice is to keep actual litigation through the courts to a minimum. If entered into prematurely the court process will be lengthier and more costly and in the vast majority of cases can be avoided altogether.





HATCH WARREN UNDER FIVES PRESCHOOL

It's March already and officially the start of Spring, so it's time for us to get outside again at Hatch Warren Under Fives for some educational and fun springtime activities. 1. Recognise the numerals 1 to 5 so perhaps they will call out the numbers whilst pressing the buttons on the calculator.
2. Select the correct numeral to represent 1 to 5, then 1 to 10 objects. Our little ones enjoyed buying fresh vegetables from our Farmers Shop, matching the amount of vegetables to the number they pressed on the calculator.
3. Our Key Carers can ask the children to say a number that is one more than the given number...can they then find the matching number button?

Along with the calculators we received 3 new sets of weighing scales so the children can enjoy adding and subtracting as they measure various resources.

We also used the counting theme in our Chinese New Year celebrations. We opened a Chinese restaurant where the children used chopsticks to taste Chinese food and count out (and then eat) prawn crackers. The children also had great fun using their chopsticks to find treasure hidden in rice.

The month of March brings us more special days to celebrate. We'll have a daffodil theme for St David's Day and there'll be shamrock shapes and every shade of green in preschool for St Patrick's Day. But our favourite celebration this month is of course Mother's Day. We will be talking about the importance of family with our little ones and we'll also be hosting our "Bring Your Mum to Preschool Week" for all of the Mummies to come in and have some fun with their little ones, with a few little treats and surprises along the way... And then there'll be Easter to look forward to – such a busy term!

MARCH IN THE GARDEN

March is such an exciting time in the garden because you can finally get out and start the jobs. With the daffodils starting to stop flowering, dead head them in your garden to give the leaves energy to store for next year's growth.

After dead heading them give them a good fertiliser with a general feed. A granular brand is best as it will release the energy over time and allow the daffodils roots a chance to soak it up from the surrounding soil naturally.

Plants in the garden can do with a tidy up now. After leaving the growth on certain plants over the winter months to protect the new growth, they can now be cut back. For example, Fuchsia, Bujelia and Hydrangeas can have their old heads chopped off now, and allow the new growth to take over. Hellebores need their leaves cut away to show off the last of their flower blossom. Make sure your roses and other trained plants are still attached to walls and have not received any damage over the winter months.

Other areas of the garden will benefit from a good fertiliser feed too. Plants such as Roses, Raspberries and Fruit trees should receive a good granular fertiliser at the base of the plant or in their pots. Acidic loving plants such as Blueberries, that are in pots will especially appreciate this treatment. There are lots of fertilisers out there and lot of brands. You want to look for a fertiliser with Nitrogen, Phosphate, and Potash. These three ingredients will help to promote shoot growth and provide your roots with a boost for structure. If you have a good healthy plant it will help to guard against drought or diseases.

Now is a great time to start planting seed based vegetables. If space is limited you

can plant onions and garlic in pots around the garden. Seed potatoes are also now available for Chitting. You should always buy seed potatoes if you are hoping for a good quality crop. It's very tempting to save last year's potatoes or use shop bought ones that have sprouted in the cupboard. They will still produce you some potatoes, but you will have a lot less, and they will be prone to rotting in the ground before you have a chance to harvest them. Chitting them before putting them in the ground helps the eyes develop and you will get a better crop from them. Place them in a tray in a warm, light place that's frost free. Within a few weeks you will see them starting to sprout.

Towards the end of the month you can plant out your potatoes. If you are planting directly into soil dig trenches about one spit depth and place out your potatoes about 1 foot apart. Cover the potatoes with soil, making sure you have space for a small trench either side of the rows. This is so you can heap the soil when the leaves start to show through to protect against potential frost damage. If you are planning to plant your potatoes in pots, fill them with some multipurpose soil about two foot deep. Place your potatoes in the tub and cover over with soil. Try to leave some space at the top so when the leaves start to poke through you can top up with soil, covering over the leaves and once again protecting them from frost.

Now is the perfect time to continue seed sowing, pricking out, and potting on larger seedlings. It's always a juggling act to find space, getting everything ready to go out. To prick out your seeds they need to have germinated so the first set of leaves have fully formed. You may be concerned about the size of the leaves to prick out, but you need to move them out of the seed tray as soon as possible. This is because seed soil

only has a very basic nutrient content and the seeds will soon start competing with each other for what nutrients are left, as well as space, water and light. By potting on into smaller cells you can be sure they are getting good nutrients, and can fully root out before going outside. I like to use a multipurpose soil at this stage and then add any fertiliser when watering if needed. You can tell if your seeds need fertilising because your leaves will start to go yellow and sometimes the edges start to roll over.

To prick out a seedling carefully place a thumb and finger on to one of the leaves. Using a Dibber, or bamboo cane, scope out the soil around the base of the seedling ensuring you get as many of the roots as you can. Lift the seedling out gently. Make a hole in the seed cell tray, and place the seedling in, ensuring you cover all the roots and the plants leaves are sitting just above the soil surface. If you can grade your seedlings making sure larger ones are at the back. This will help with light competition. Keep a close eye out for pests as well. Aphids and white fly love a nice young leaf to eat. You can help prevent this by spraying your plants with a solution of water and washing up liquid. Coating the plants in a thin layer of solution that makes it difficult for pests to cling to them. You can also put out yellow sticky traps which attract the pests to the colour rather than the plants. Once they get trapped this attracts further pests, trapping more of them. Make sure you change these as they become full. These pest yellow sticky traps are great for Scarred Fly.

Have fun and see what you can grow this month.

For many years I had driven down the hill passing the Fox Inn so it seemed logical that this interesting looking country pub, with an air of a Swiss cottage, ought to have the benefit of my patronage. So on a Wednesday lunchtime in the middle of February that's exactly what madam and I did. And it was a very pleasant experience with well cooked, nicely presented food in generous portions.



Lucy Tuffs is the chef/patron having taken on the lease of this free house two years ago and has worked hard at presenting a good selection and standard of food which is steadily building up the business.

"I only cook food that I like" explained Lucy. "I am not into the gastro pub concept. My menu has all the traditional British fare that people enjoy but with a few international dishes for added interest".

The previous night, being Valentine's Day had been a sell out so there was no liver and bacon available so I had to study the extensive a la carte menu. I selected beef lasagne with chips and salad and madam had one of the day's specials of barbecued pork loin with sautéed potatoes, salad and homemade coleslaw served on a large square plate. The food was tasty and hot and madam was impressed with her meat.

Dessert was toffee apple crumble and fresh custard for me and a baked vanilla and cherry cheese cake with whipped cream for the distaff member. She was very complimentary about her dessert as it reminded her of her time when she worked in Germany.

With six coffees on offer we both had Americano which came with a mint crisp – a nice touch for a pub lunch. With a pint of lager for me and a large slim line tonic the bill came to £46.30. Not cheap but probably about right for the quality supplied.

There was a light lunch menu of baked potatoes and sandwiches as an alternative choice and a children's menu has something to tempt most kids.

Sunday lunches are usually fully booked and they do have special nights. On Tuesdays there is a Mexican deal of chilli, rice and nachos with a drink for £10 and on Friday nights it is steak night when the meal for two is £27.99.

And at the weekend cooked breakfasts are available from 10.00 am. A quiz night is planned for Thursday 2nd March and a Psychic supper will occur on Monday 6th March however it is advisable to book.

The Fox Inn is a proper country pub serving quality home cooked food, fine wines and real ales. Families and dogs are welcome. There is a roaring fire and a dart board: what is more traditional than this?



• Fake news or Good News – which would you rather have?

• We've all heard about "fake news" - the stories which certain politicians and certain parts of the media invent, or wildly exaggerate, in order to push their own agendas, or boost their own profits.

• The other name for it is "lies". Whether it's a promise of NHS funding painted on the side of a bus, or a non-existent "massacre" used as an excuse for banning immigrants, such lies are more and more common.

• It's bad enough when people get fooled by those lies. It's worse when people make decision based on those lies, because those are inevitably bad decisions – the only people who benefit are the liars. Worst of all is that the liars can then cry "fake news" even when presented with the truth, leaving everyone confused, and making it much harder to find out what is real news, and what is lies.

• In the Gospels, it is Pontius Pilate, the cruel and cynical Roman politician, who asks Jesus "what is truth?" just before making the politically expedient, but wrong, decision to have Jesus executed. Pontius Pilate may have thought that the truth could be distorted, hidden, or killed, but God had other ideas. Jesus said of himself "I am the way, the truth and the life". His life conquered death: Jesus rose from the dead, and the truth was revealed – Good News, not fake news.

• We have a choice: fake news, or the Good News; lies or truth. It's a choice we need to make all the time: will we continue to buy and read 'newspapers', or support politicians, who peddle lies and hate, or will we make strenuous effort to seek the truth, even if it's uncomfortable?

• Jesus also said "the truth will make you free" so to choose truth is to choose life and freedom. To turn a blind eye to 'fake news' is



• to choose death, and enslavement to those who peddle the lies. So what will you have: fake news, or the Good News? The choice is yours.

• In terms of the church calendar, Lent starts on Ash Wednesday, 1st March. There will be a simple Communion Service at 7.30pm at Immanuel with the imposition of ashes. Ash Wednesday comes from the ancient Jewish tradition of penance and fasting. The practice includes the wearing of ashes on the head. The ashes symbolize the dust from which God made us. As the priest applies the ashes to a person's forehead, these words are said: "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return."

• Every Wednesday in Lent beginning 8th March at 7.30pm, we'll be running a Lent Course based on the film 'The King's Speech' with a simple bread and soup supper. Everyone is very welcome.

• Mothering Sunday is on 26th March. At Immanuel we will celebrate the gift to us of all who care for us, and the mothering nature of God. Everyone is welcome to our service for all.

• Our popular film night continues on Monday 20th March at 7.30pm, with the next film being the award winning 'I, Daniel Blake' by Ken Loach. A film about a 59 year old carpenter recovering from a heart attack befriending a single mother and her two kids as they navigate their way through the impersonal, Kafkaesque benefits system. With equal amounts of humour, warmth and despair, the journey is heartfelt and emotional until the end. All welcome to join us. Bring a bottle and enjoy the film on the big screen.

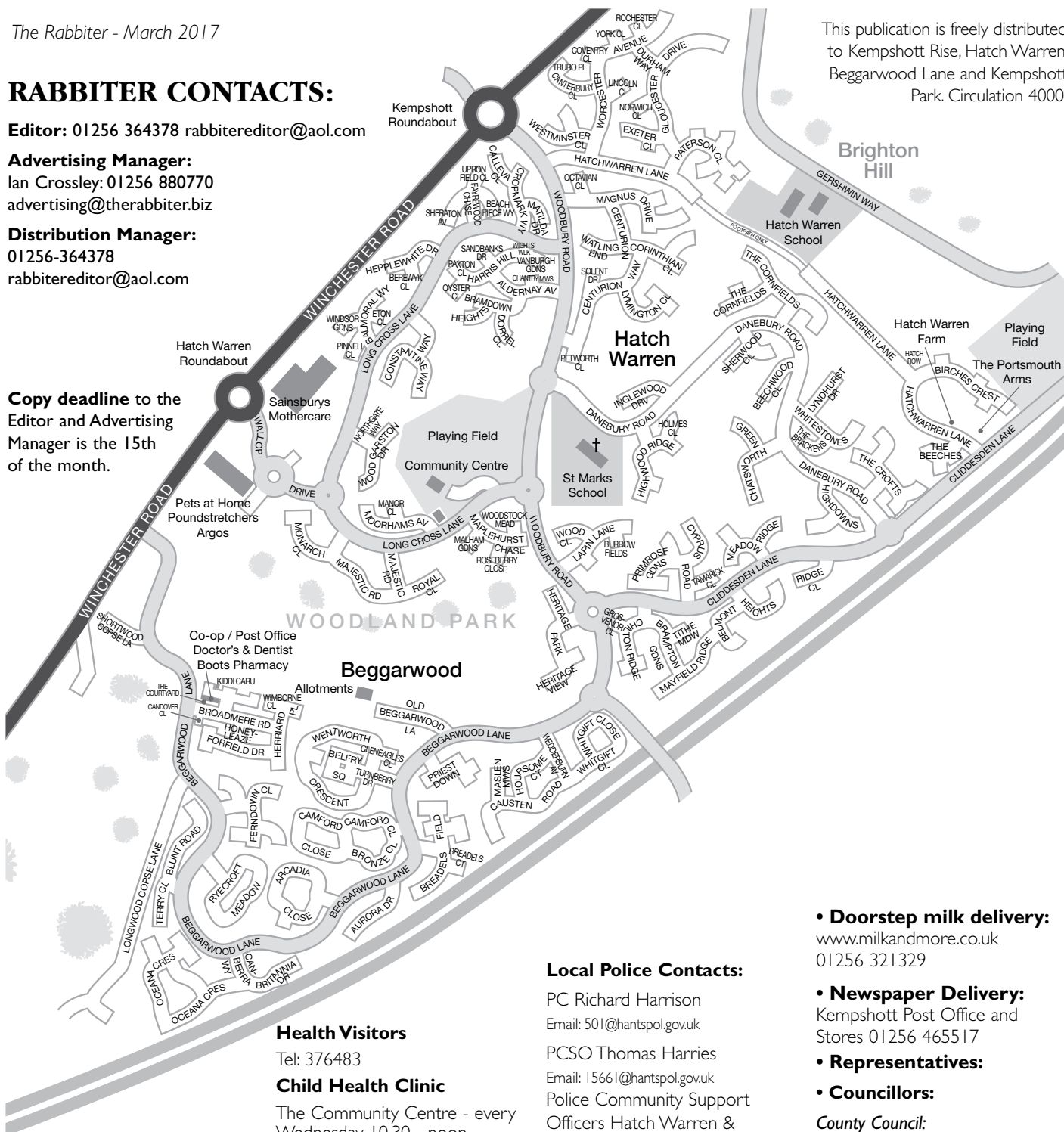

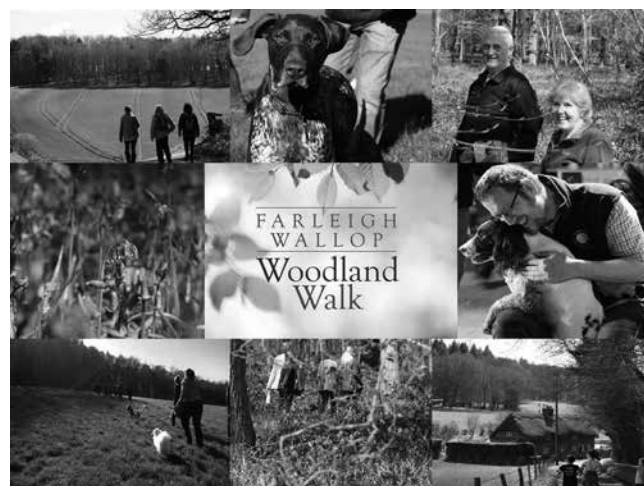

did just that; becoming an Assistant Scout Leader at Hatch Warren Scout Group.

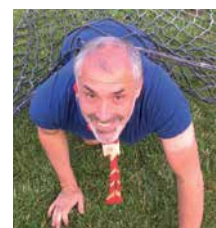

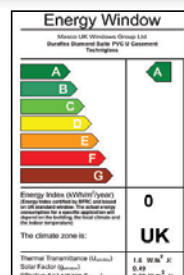
