

Being in town on a Thursday we decided to have lunch in The Angel which is on the edge of Festival Place, past the Vue Cinema. Exiting the Festival Place cark park I have driven by this hostelry umpteen times since the building of our town centre shopping mall fifteen years ago. I realised that while it had originally been called Lloyds Bar it has for some time now been a Wetherspoon establishment called The Angel. I hesitate to call it a pub because it is a very popular eating place.

Having never visited before I was unsure what to expect. Arriving just after 12.00 noon I was surprised how full this extensive place was. It was frequented by many families and pensioners with a few employed people popping in for their lunch from nearby Basing View.

Like other Wetherspoon establishments it had an extensive menu which contained many attractive deals, some of which included a drink within the price. Others had the two for a discounted price offering. Not setting out as a fine dining experience there were ample choices dependent on how hungry you were and the quality and service was excellent. There is apparently a children's menu selection.

I decided to have the British beef chilli con carne which came with rice, tortilla

chips and a pot of sour cream. Madam had chicken and avocado salad with maple cured bacon and a slice of ciabatta garlic bread. This dish came with a drink deal so she had a gin and diet tonic and I had a pint of Kronenberg lager.

Pudding for me was a warm chocolate brownie with vanilla ice cream and chocolate sauce and my better half had Bramley apple crumble and custard. And we both had a large mug of LavAzza Americano coffee. We were replete after a very satisfying and good quality meal. And it wasn't expensive at £24.34p with the bill showing promotional savings of £6.30p.

Of real interest is that every item on the menu, including drinks, showed its calorific value. Within the company magazine placed on each table was an article about a customer who had dined regularly using this menu and had lost nearly six stones in a little less than a year. It just goes to show that people can be trained to eat more sensibly provided they are aware of how many calories are in each dish. Pity I didn't realise that before I had my brownie.

HOW DO I KNOW IF MY RELATIVE HAS THE MENTAL CAPACITY TO MAKE A WILL?

When a relative is diagnosed with a debilitating condition, such as dementia or Alzheimer's, it is important to put their affairs in order at an early stage. This will include ensuring that they have a valid Will and making a Lasting Power of Attorney. This needs to be done as soon as possible, before the question of whether or not they have sufficient mental capacity arises.

Mental capacity, in the context of making a Will, broadly relates to whether a person is capable of;

- Understanding what making a Will means and its effect;
- Appreciating the extent of his or her assets; and
- Considering potential beneficiaries in a fair and objective way, unaffected by any condition that might affect his or her judgement.

It is not always straightforward to decide whether or not a person is able to make a Will. Mental capacity, particularly in the earlier stages of a condition such as dementia, can fluctuate from day-to-day and the extent of a person's understanding may not always be clear. Where there is uncertainty it is advisable to obtain a medical certificate of capacity from a GP.

To avoid mental capacity becoming a problem do not delay in seeing a Solicitor to start the process of making a Will. You

should also discuss creating a Lasting Power of Attorney giving a friend or relative power to look after your loved one's affairs when they are no longer able to themselves.

LASTING POWER **OF ATTORNEY**

The prospect of losing your mental capacity is not a pleasant thought.

But with the odds of one in three over-65s developing dementia, it is not an issue that should be ignored.

It's a growing issue as according to the Alzheimer's Society around 850,000 people live with dementia in the UK, with numbers set to rise to over one million by 2025. The society says this will soar to two million by 2051.

Many of these people will eventually reach a point where they can no longer make decisions for themselves.

If this should happen to you, don't think that members of your family can simply visit a bank and access your money to pay for your care, because they can't, unless Lasting Powers of Attorney (LPA) have been set up. This is a legal tool that gives another adult, usually your spouse, partner or one or more of your children, the legal authority to make decisions for you, if you are unable to make them yourself.

There are two types of LPA. The Property and Affairs LPA allows your Attorney to deal with your finances, such as paying your bills, collecting any income and benefits that you might be entitled to, manage investments and possibly selling your home should the need arise.

The Health and Welfare LPA allows your Attorney to make decisions about where you might live and your day-to-day care and talk to medical professionals. They would not be able to do so until you had lost mental capacity.

This may all seem a long way off and you may think that it does not apply to you. However, it is better to plan ahead because once you have lost mental capacity the time for you to make these decisions for yourself will have passed.

If you want to decide what should happen to you if you were to lose mental capacity, then you ought to make plans now.

Should you fail to do so, your family or friends would have to apply to the Court of Protection to become your Deputy – a Court appointed Attorney – which is a more time consuming and costly process.





SPIRITUALLY SPEAKING

I am writing this in the gentle warmth of a beautiful spring day, with the sun shining and a few scattered clouds in the sky. The daffodils are out and there are signs of spring in the air, although we've also had a healthy mix of cold grey days too!



As we prepare for Easter Day on April 16th,

we enter the second half of Lent, traditionally a time of fasting, reflection and study in the church. Many give something up and each week a small number of us have met for a Lent Course based on the film 'The King's Speech' entitled 'Finding a Voice'. As we worked our way through the film, watching selected chapters, it has been a time of self and group reflection that I, myself have found valuable.

I see this a lot in the time I spend with pupils of St Mark's School and also in the short amount of time I've spent in Brighton Hill School where Mr Edwards, their new Head Teacher is making a positive impact in making the school a place that both pupils and staff are proud to be a part of. It is early days, but in respect of Brighton Hill, I sense a feeling of new and positive beginnings. In respect of St Mark's, at the end of Summer the school will be saying farewell to Sally Jenkins, who has led the school for the last eight years and made a significant impact on many. I know that I , for one, will be sad to see her leave, but it will then be time for someone new to lead the school.

In our lives how are we encouraged and how do we encourage others? On that first Easter morning, Mary Magdalene went to the tomb to find it empty. She was devastated and so upset she didn't recognise Jesus in the garden. It was only when he says her name that he reveals who he is to her. She is then encouraged to go and tell others what she has seen – the first person to see

the risen Christ, such a significant event.'....go to my followers and tell them this; I am going back to my Father and your Father. I am going back to my God and your God.'

I would suggest that this Easter we all seek out and thank those who have encouraged us in our lives. Recognise that encouragement and take their example to encourage others in order that they may flourish and excel in their lives.

APRIL IN THE GARDEN

April means the arrival of warmer temperatures and fast growth in the garden. With the sunny weather, temperatures can rise sharply in greenhouses and cold frames. To prevent damage to seedlings, make sure your plants are well ventilated and keep on top of watering.

Weed seedlings will appear rapidly this month. Take the time to go over the beds with a hoe and allow the seedlings to die off in the sun, when it's around. To help keep your beds under control in the month to come apply a mulch of well-rotted compost. A layer of soil between 5cm (2in) and 7.5cm (3in) deep around shrubs. Take care not to place it directly against their stems as this can cause fungal rots to take hold. Mulching reduces further weed germination and conserves soil moisture in the summer:

April is a good time to have a sort out of any plants needing to be relocated. Lift and transplant self-sown annuals and perennials into more suitable positions for flowering. Plant summer-flowering bulbs such as gladioli by the end of this month. They need a well-drained position in full sun and may need support once they start to shoot up.

Now is also a good time to give your lawn and other plants a top up on feed ready for the new year's growth. Feed shrubs and roses with a balanced fertiliser such as Growmore or Vitax Q4. Place this at the base and on the soil before mulching to ensure your plants the best start to their new growth.

April is a great time of year full of spring fragrance and colour. Osmanthus delavayi has tubulars, small white flowers that have delicious fragrance. When smelling the flowers close up the scent can be

tantalisingly faint. Give it a position in the sun to encourage best production of the flowers. The lime-yellow flowers of Daphne pontica have an almond essence perfume at dusk; an irresistible lure for night-time pollinators, as well as us. A neat domed habit, glossy evergreen leaves and an ability to thrive in dry shade are among its other admirable attributes.

Corylopsis veitchiana has pendent, catkinlike racemes of small, lemon-yellow flowers with brick-red anthers and the quintessential spring fragrance of cowslips. The white, snowball heads of Viburnum carlesii are sweetly redolent of carnation.

Other good shrubs for spring fragrance include:

- Abeliophyllum distichum
- Azara microphylla
- Rhododendron luteum
- Edgeworthia chrysantha
- · Fothergilla gardenii
- Lonicera x purpusii 'Winter Beauty'

In the vegetable garden, leeks can to be sown directly in the first weeks of April for autumn harvest. Sow directly into a seed bed, or into modules where they can be grown on in a cold frame to be planted out in their final positions in May and June.

Tender vegetables such as tomatoes and sweetcorn under cover, to give them a head start. Plant them out in the garden after the last frosts.

Use fleece or a frame covered in very fine mesh and place over brassicas, to protect against flea beetles that become active now and cause severe distortion and damage to foliage. As soon as the frosts start to ease you can plant out your potatoes, early varietyies such as Charlotte are lovely new potatoes. Broad beans can also be planted out in the garden and are more hardy than the peas. Strawberry

plants made from cuttings last year can now also be planted out in the garden in either tubs, hanging baskets or directly in the ground.

CAMERA MONITORING





Roger Shaw, a member of Henley Probus, gave a talk to the Probus Club of Basingstoke, about the history of the Oregon Trail. He had lived in America for seven years and together with his wife had driven the entire 3,000 miles route in 2013 and 2015.

The American government encouraged immigrants to resettle westwards as the east coast had been swamped by the influx of people from Europe. The attraction was of plentiful and cheap land, originally 600 acres free for a married couple (approximately a square mile) and 320 acres for a single man. The only stipulation was that they had to improve it. Eventually it was sold for \$1 per acre. With the 1849 Gold Rush adding more pioneers, between 1840 and 1860 half a million people, mainly farmers, including 70,000 Mormons and many Irish, made the six months journey from Independence Missouri to the Pacific North West coast. The





Mormons diverted south to Utah to establish their own community having promised the government that they would give up polygamy.

The migrants travelled in huge groups in wagon trains, with the preferred smaller lighter covered wagons christened "Prairie Schooners" pulled by oxen. These wagons, some made by Henry Studebaker, a name subsequently made famous in later years by the manufacture of cars, were capable of floating. Each family had to take their own food and water as there were no trading posts along the route in the early years. They traversed the Great Plains, then across the Rockies to the west coast. They favoured a particular route across the mountains called the South Pass, in Wyoming, which was a gradual ascent up 8000 feet where a trail had been worn over many years by millions of buffalo.

Most people will have seen in films or on TV stories about the Wild West and wagon trains that formed circles at night for protection against attacks by American Indians. The reality was somewhat different and while they did form circles it was so the oxen could safely graze within the confines. Initially the Indians were helpful to the immigrants supplying them with buffalo meat but relations soured as time went by. The real problems started in 1847 when half the nomadic Cayuse Indian tribe and all their children were wiped out by a measles epidemic introduced by the Europeans.

The famous Pony Express was created to act as a postal service and was capable of bringing mail from the Mid West to the Pacific coast in ten days. However failing to obtain a government mail contract and technology, in the form of the telegraph, meant the Pony Express only lasted eighteen months.

The Oregon Trail came to an end when, in 1869, the Union Pacific railroad provided an easier way to complete the journey.
