HATCH WARREN BEGGARWOOD CYCLING CLUB



It's been a busy time for the club this month, and with the weather gradually improving we are seeing more and more people joining the regular rides, which is fantastic. The Tuesday evening rides are now running at a number of different speeds, using more varied and longer routes, now that we have the light to do so. The weekend rides have expanded to include an additional social ride every month, a café ride once a month of around 50 miles at a moderate pace, and an additional ride on the second Saturday of every month, which gives our members the choice of longer distances at variety of speeds. Full details of our new ride calendar can be found on our website or in the events area of our Facebook page.

In addition to expanding the regular weekly rides we have seen a large increase in the number of ad-hoc rides our members are organising through our Facebook group. It is great to see friendships developing and for people to make - and beat - their cycling goals. I hear stories of members setting themselves distance challenges for the year and having to increase them, because they have achieved them 5 months into the year! The primary purpose of the club, when we set up, was to bring people together and get them interested in this activity; so they could make new friends and build upon the community spirit within the local area. It is truly wonderful to see this happening.

On the 30th April the club attended the IOW Randonnée, an annual 70-mile ride around the coast of the Isle of Wight, which is organised by the Wayfarer Cycling Touring Club. Approximately 3000 cyclists take part in the day and enjoy this beautiful ride around the island. 25 members of HWBcc signed up and met up on the ferry. The atmosphere at the start of these events is always infectious and we



were all in high spirits. The weather forecast was typical for April —as a result there were some very classically British conversations about what we should and shouldn't be wearing, and if or when it would start to rain... Personally, I love seeing how friendly the group is and how well everyone gets on, especially considering this is a group of people that didn't know each other eighteen months ago.

We left the ferry looking forward to a good day's cycling, and after the obligatory group photo we set off and settled into smaller groups at varying paces. The route this year was set to go clockwise around the island, meaning you start with lots of short, but steep, hills. It's a far more challenging route than you would expect, but very enjoyable. The views as you approach the far west of the island are of the type that make you stop and just take it all in. The rain finally found us and the last 30 miles of the ride became more of an adventure around surviving the conditions, getting back to the ferry and a nice warm cup of tea! A wonderful day, spent with great people, in an inspiring corner of the UK. If you get the chance I wholeheartedly recommend you give it a go.

I will close by saying: if you own a bike of any type and keep telling yourself that you should use it more, then join us and make some new friends in the process. We offer rides ranging from social, gentle rides around 8 miles in length through to 50-mile rides at a fast pace. We work hard to ensure there is something organised that will suit you and will support you in any way we can to attain your individual cycling goals.

KEMPSHOTT CONSERVATION GROUP

In Down Grange Meadow we have cut down and removed the dead remains of last year's growth in the three areas that were scraped a few years ago for wild flower sowing. Our petrol driven scythe cutter makes this work so much quicker and easier. We are very much looking forward to another season of colour to remind us of something once commonplace in fields and meadows everywhere.

Our battle with the bramble in the meadow continues. Whilst plenty of blackberries are always welcome, bramble needs to be kept under control by cutting back and digging out roots as it can quickly take over to the detriment of other things.

Why do we have stripy grass in the Meadow? It's because we asked the Council leave strips of grass uncut, an experiment we are carrying out for a number of reasons.

The grass is normally cut in late autumn or even early winter, but leaving it until early spring means the meadow does not look so bare over winter. The grass is about to get into growth so in about four weeks from cutting it will be back to looking like its old self. Also, as the grass has had time to die back over winter, the volume of cut grass to be handled is much less.

Why the stripes? Some strips were left untouched to make sure that disturbance to the healthy population of field voles was minimised by retaining an adequate amount of their natural habitat. As the cutting took place in early spring, the vole population was not in evidence at all. This, perhaps, is another good reason for leaving the job until much later.

Even if we decide to have the bulk of our cutting in early spring, there will still be some cutting done in the previous autumn. This is when we need to prepare the ground for seeding with wild flowers. These do best when seeded or planted in autumn and have the winter to become established before coming up in spring.

UPDATE FROM YOUR COUNCILLOR

Beggarwood Surgery: At the time of writing I had just spoken to a senior director at the CCG re concerns and rumours around the operation of Beggarwood Surgery. The CCG stated that they are in contact with the surgery and supporting them to ensure that services are maintained. I have requested a meeting between the CCG and local representatives to discuss difficulties at the surgery and future planning. The surgery has just undergone a CQC inspection and the results are imminent.

Planning updates: The applicants for the proposed Motorway Service area close to junction 7 have applied for leave for an enlargement of the footprint of the application. This would mean, most likely, an earlier run off from the motorway, perhaps to offset concerns about weaving distances. It could also mean that the service area could stretch from opposite Hatch Warren, prior to the motorway bridge, to opposite Beggarwood, beyond the bridge. Grainger developments have held a public consultation on their proposals for the Island site at Beggarwood. The initial plans include a potential new surgery, perhaps providing large premises for the Beggarwood dental practice, older persons accommodation and a new pub. The next step will be for a planning application to be submitted. If the dental practice were to move over to new premises, it would make sense for the Beggarwood doctor's surgery to expand into the extra space left behind and therefore build in extra capacity. This is something I would like to discuss with the CCG at the proposed meeting.

"Prince Harry trained to be an Apache helicopter pilot here." John Essery, a Brighton Hill resident who was on Warden Duty, told us the day of our visit to the Museum of Army Flying at Middle Wallop. He had the unusual service record of flying helicopters in the Army Air Corps as a Major and when his service came to an end he joined the RAF as a Squadron Leader to continue his helicopter journey.

A chilly day greeted our group of twenty consisting of members of the Probus Club of Basingstoke and several wives to the museum on the edge of this airfield. RAF Middle Wallop opened in 1940 as a Fighter Command Station during the Battle of Britain, then used by the USAAF and returned to the RAF after the war. In 1957 when British Army Aviation became independent of the RAF, Middle Wallop was transferred to the new Army Air Corps. It became the school of Army Aviation, to which it remains to the present day.

The museum tells the story of British Army flying from the early days of military ballooning spanning nearly 150 years of military flight to the modern Army Air Corps. The collection was started in 1946 at RAF Andover but later moved to Middle

Wallop and first opened to the public in 1974. Today it houses over 32 types of aircraft, both early fixed wing and rotary, with an array of support machines and memorabilia and charts the history of military flight both at home and the many theatres of operations abroad.

Kempshott resident and Probus member retired RAF Squadron Leader Chris Perkins MVO was on hand to talk about the exhibits. Aircraft range from a First World War biplane to a Huey Cobra attack helicopter equipped with eight missiles and a Lynx helicopter that could reach 200 mph. There was the famous WWI Sopwith Pup, with later Auster and Chipmunk fixed wing airplanes and examples of every glider from the D Day Landings including one that could carry a light tank.

On display were early rotary experiments

including the Rotabuggy which was a converted Jeep with helicopter additions and an aircraft tail to aid manoeuvrability. With displays of the Victoria Cross holders, various uniforms, the evolution of the flying helmet and several field guns and support vehicles the museum even has a 1940s house with most domestic items bringing back memories to visitors.

After lunch in the Apache café we then had the privilege of a private showing of a film about the changing role of helicopter operations in today's troublesome world.

MY SUMMER HOLIDAY APPLICATION WAS REFUSED! WHAT ARE MY OPTIONS?

Can your employer refuse your holiday request?

The simple answer to that is yes it can. Every employee is entitled to a minimum of their statutory holiday of 28 days inclusive of the eight bank/public holidays if they work on a five day per week basis – pro rata for different working patterns. Contrary to the general belief there is no statutory right to actually have any bank/public holidays off work although this is often contractual. Employers are actually entitled to designate when holiday has to be taken.

For example, it is legal for a company to have a shutdown period when holiday must be taken or to designate a busy period when no holiday may be taken at all. Many companies only grant holiday requests on a first come first served basis to ensure cover in every department. If you are refused holiday for one of these reasons you need to check what the provisions are in your contract of employment

and check that the company has a clear and transparent holiday usage policy, which it is operating fairly and without discrimination. Simply granting time off on a grace and favour basis is not an acceptable way for an employer to behave.

What other rights might you have for taking time off for childcare in the summer holiday?

Dependant leave – You are entitled to take unpaid dependant leave to deal with emergencies relating to your dependants. This usually means for a maximum of one or two days and would cover the emergency of regular childcare arrangements failing and you needing time to sort out alternative arrangements.

Flexible Working – Whilst the company is not obliged to grant your request, it will be obliged to seriously consider any application that you make formally for flexible working. Traditionally this is to reduce hours or days, but there is nothing to prohibit an application not to work

during all or part of the school holidays. Remember, however, that any flexible working request that is approved is permanent (unless agreed otherwise) and you can only make one request in any period of 12 months whether it is refused or granted.

Parental Leave – After one year of employment you are entitled to apply for up to 18 weeks unpaid leave to spend with each of your children before they reach 18. No more than four weeks unpaid parental leave can be taken in any calendar year. The employer can reject the dates proposed and offer alternatives, but cannot completely refuse the request.



SPIRITUALLY SPEAKING

The image on the right has been doing the rounds on my Facebook page news feed. As we approach the General Election and having recently had local elections, the turnout for which wasn't spectacular, there's speculation as to what the turnout for



the General Election might be and that the public may be suffering from 'voter fatigue'. Whether we like it or not, those who turned out for the referendum voted to leave the EU and as a result, the next government must negotiate with the rest of the EU on our exit. There's been some posturing already and the battle lines seem to have been drawn. But the General Election is not just about Brexit. It's about our country, our relationship with nations around the world and our future. And we should be encouraging as many people as we can to turn out on June 8th. Those of course who don't turn out and vote won't really have a leg to stand on if they don't like the government that is elected!

The Archbishops have written a letter to parishes and congregations. Unfortunately it's quite wordy, but worth a read (it can be found here: https://tinyurl.com/klk47cb). Some may argue that religion and politics don't mix, but I don't buy that — I believe that they are intertwined as they affect how we live and how others are treated. In his recent blog, the Rev'd lain McFarlane, makes the following observation:

'In 2016 more people slept each night on the streets London than can be seated in both Winchester and Salisbury Cathedrals alone, this year that number looks to be filling half of Guildford Cathedral too. On average, homeless people die at just 47 years old; which is what I will be this year.

How does that make you feel as representative of Christ's love and justice in the world?

I was hungry, and you formed a humanities group to discuss my hunger.

I was imprisoned, and you crept off quietly to your chapel and prayed for my release.

I was naked, and in your mind you debated the morality of my appearance.

I was sick, and you knelt and thanked God for your health.

I was homeless, and you preached to me of the spiritual shelter of the love of God.

I was lonely, and you left me alone to pray for me.

You seem so holy, so close to God but I am still very hungry — and lonely — and cold.

Does it bother us or are we indeed so heavenly minded that we are of no earthly use.'

That is how perhaps those who believe that religion and politics don't mix might respond to what Jesus has to say in Matthew's Gospel: '[The Kingdom of heaven] It is yours because when I was hungry, you gave me food to eat. When I was thirsty, you gave me something to drink' Jesus' life and ministry was about directing people to those who, in society, were at the bottom end of the social scale. Pointing towards how we love and care for others and society. It is, of course, very easy, to live in our own bubbles and not to think of those whom we don't see. To give to charities that do good works. To put some food in the collection box for the local foodbank (which continues to provide emergency food parcels to more and more people).

We need to think about who and what we are voting for. How it affects not just us, individually, but those around us, the poorest of society, the marginalised. Let's ensure that for the next five years we have a government in whom we trust and know will do the best for the country — not the best just for the richest and the privileged, but for everyone. To conclude with the rest of the passage from St Matthew's Gospel:

"Then the godly people will answer, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry and give you food? When did we see you thirsty and give you something to drink? When did we see you with no place to stay and welcome you into our home? When did we see you without clothes and give you something to wear? When did we see you sick or in prison and care for you?" "Then the king will answer, The truth is, anything you did for any of my people here, you also did for me."



The 'Intro to Soccer School' Firestarters have once again enjoyed a bouyent start under the lively stewardship of coach Greg






