BEL AND THE DRAGON AT THE GEORGE

Dining at the Bel and the Dragon in Odiham turned out differently to our expectations. Receiving a £100 gift voucher for this establishment, I checked their menu on line and realised that at their price levels this voucher would not extend to having an expansive meal.

The menu for June was enticing but a fillet steak at £33 or sharing a rack of lamb for £63 gave a clear indication that with starters and puddings a bottle of wine would be out of the question.

Booking a table on line was easy and they were very efficient in sending an acknowledgement and the day before a reminder was received. The dining room was a modern rear extension to this old coaching inn, designed in a bistro style with several booths and various sized tables. They must be able to cater for around eighty diners and the Friday night we attended there were only two tables not occupied. A large opening to the kitchen was an interesting feature.

We were placed at a table next to an open door to the outside garden. With a slight breeze it was draughty so a move to another table was accomplished without bother.

Madam had various marinated beetroots with goat's cheese and the delightful presentation was matched by its taste. I had four, fairly thin, grilled English asparagus which were slightly too al dente for my taste.



Our main courses were crab linguine while I had suckling pig which came with duck fat roasted potatoes, a small pot of apple sauce and a miniature jug of gravy. Madam had a side dish of heritage tomatoes, avocado and gem salad and I chose samphire, petis pois and sugar snaps. We both had lemon tart with a shot glass of limoncello, the Italian lemon liqueur. The food was delicious.

A bottle of fizzy mineral water, (their description) and a 175 ml glass each of house Sauvignon blanc completed our selections. A decision had to be made about having coffee as the evening had been spoilt by a very noisy party of fourteen that made any conversation between us impossible. The waitress and the manager apologised but it was difficult to understand them due to the cacophony. Our initial decision was to leave at that point but we were presented with two LaVanna coffees "on the house". Our bill came to £92 plus optional 12.5% service charge. My voucher having been under spent by £8, I decided, in view of the circumstances, not to make an addition.

No doubt, on another occasion, we would have had a peaceful and therefore more enjoyable experience.

Having published a Trip Adviser post on this visit the management have subsequently offered us a free light lunch as compensation for our poor experience.

Hay Making Anyone?

HNG would like help from a "team" of volunteers for end of season hay making on at least one of the small wildflower meadows we are restoring in Hatch Warren. This is preferable to using a Council



machine that cuts and takes away the grasses and wildflowers all in one action thereby "hoovering up" insects and wildflower seed that we want to remain. We need a community "team" because the task has to be done over a short period, weekdays or weekend, at short notice, dictated by the weather. One site should take about I days effort if there are 6 people. Haymaking is labour intensive, but good exercise and sociable! Children are welcome if supervised by a responsible parent.

We will use a scythe mower to cut the grass. Seed and insects are encouraged to disperse through hand raking, not necessarily on the same day. Wild-flower seed left on the ground, will either add to or renew the stock of plants in subsequent years or feed overwintering birds, small mammals and other wildlife during the Autumn and Winter: **hatch.nature@gmail.com**

UPDATE FROM YOUR COUNCILLOR

There are a number of fairly weighty issues around the area at the moment. Here's a quick update on a few.

Beggarwood Surgery I imagine everyone is familiar with the ongoing problems at the surgery. There have been regular reports from patients of lack of availability of appointments etc. Then we heard that five GPs had left almost simultaneously, and then came the conclusions of the inspection from the Care Quality Commission which raised further concerns and put the surgery into special measures. I have met with the practice manager, who also runs Rooksdown Surgery. She told me that Beggarwood has a clear plan in place to deal with the difficulties, and that she is working with the CCG (Clinical Commissioning Group) to address the problems. There appears to be nothing public about this plan however and I have not been told of a timeline.

I'm still waiting (after a month) for a meeting with the CCG to discuss further. There is a date in the diary for the end of the month but this has been changed previously. I also hope to attend a meeting at Beggarwood Surgery with the Patients group in the next couple of weeks.

If any residents have new or ongoing concerns about the surgery please let me know, it is further evidence in the continuing campaign to get better provision for Beggarwood.

Island Site Readers will know that a full planning application is expected from owners Grainger for the site. These plans are expected to include a pub and accommodation for older people. In the mean time however the site has been turned into a temporary car park etc. There was no planning agreement for this. Grainger have put in a retrospective planning application instead.

Digester We have reached the end of the year of the temporary permission granted by HCC for the increase in vehicle movements through Hatch Warren to and from the digester. They have now submitted an application to Hampshire to have the temporary increase become permanent. Anyone wishing to view or comment on the application can find it on the HCC website under planning.

Bookbench As part of the #sitting with Jane art trail project Portsmouth Estates have paid for a backbench to be installed at Beggarwood Park for the summer. The project celebrates the life of local girl Jane Austen, and money raised will go to The Ark Charity.

SHARED PARENTING TO MAKE THE SUMMER HOLIDAYS LESS STRESSFUL

Shared parenting can be tricky at times and it is inevitable that separated or divorced parents may encounter difficulties in agreeing arrangements for the children especially during school holidays. To avoid stress in the summer holidays, a detailed parenting plan or agreed schedule for contact can make life easier for both the parents and the children.

- Plan early put together your plan for the 6 weeks holidays earlier in the year to allow time to discuss or make changes.
- If you have any family events or you want to plan a holiday away, communicate with your ex-partner promptly to avoid any clashes or issues.
- A detailed plan for the holidays and half terms will also help you organise any holiday you need to obtain from work and also highlight where you may need additional childcare from family, childminders or holiday clubs.
- Agree on holidays abroad for example how long will you allow for your child to be out of the country, is it one week? Or two weeks? How will you keep in contact whilst away? Are there any countries or places you would not be comfortable for your child to visit? If your children have a different surname to the parent they are travelling with, remember that some airport securities will expect a letter of consent from the mother or father. This is a simple letter to say that you agree to the child being taken out of the country for that period.
- While often a touchy subject, it is important to discuss when it is appropriate to include new partners in holiday time.
- Discuss your child's clothing and belongings.
 Children may wish to take certain toys, games or devices to the other parent's house. It is important that this is agreed on and that items are looked after and returned. With electronic devices such as phones, tablets or game consoles it is important that both parents try to value the

- same rules about usage, downloads and 'screen time'.
- Finances depending on your financial agreements upon separation, you may need to discuss how children will be financed during the holidays. For example, who will be paying for the holiday clubs?
- If you are having difficulty discussing these points with your ex-partner, Mediation can be a very useful forum to manage and promote positive discussions surrounding the arrangements for your children.

Most importantly is to put the children first and make sure that they are safe, secure and happy throughout their school holidays.

RECYCLING TAKEN TO THE NEXT LEVEL

Many readers have probably seen the afternoon television programme that gets things from a local tip, refurbishes them and sells them on, giving the profit back to the person who donated the item.

Something similar is going on at Dummer Down Farm, host of the cricket school, where in one of the small workshops, Tony Poetz and his son Will run a business called The Eco Worksop. Their ethos is to turn the unwanted into wanted and they refurbish, repurpose and recycle household articles that may have been destined to end their lives at the tip. The new look item is either sold or returned to the owner who pays for the work that has been carried out. An interesting side to the business is that they run a range of workshops. Tony explained "I recognised the need for



people to learn some basic skills, which allows them to refurbish their own items. This includes basic woodwork, furniture painting, decoupage and stencilling."

SOCIAL MEDIA - BEWARE -DON'T LOSE **YOUR JOB!**

Social media can help you keep in touch with family and friends, but beware there are significant boundaries between home and work.

Gill Brown, Head of Employment Law at Phillips Solicitors is warning all social media users that these boundaries can be easily blurred and could lead you into trouble and even dismissal from your employment.

Misuse of the internet and social media is thought to cost our economy billions of pounds every year through theft of time used engaging in social media instead of working, defamation of businesses and their products and cyber bullying of other people often leading to absenteeism. employer has the right to protect itself and although you do have certain rights to freedom of speech and protection from invasion of your privacy, these rights have to be exercised with caution.

your employer's Social Media Policy. These vary as some companies allow and even embrace it as part of a working day. More commonly, however, there are strict rules on its use during working hours or even a complete ban on its use. These rules are separate of course to your legal duty not to make defamatory remarks about the company or work colleagues, or to make comments, that even unintentionally, might bring your employer into disrepute. Most company policies make it clear that breach of their Social Media Policy will lead to disciplinary action and even dismissal.

You must remember that it is not safe to rely on social media privacy settings because comments can and often are copied, shared or forwarded on and quickly get into the public domain.

Just be aware that in a recent case the Employment Tribunal upheld a company's right to dismiss an The first thing to do is to check employee, who made derogatory

remarks about her company. The employee's defence was that she did not know that her Facebook page could be seen at work and she denied that she was talking about her employer. She also said that the company should have taken into account that she had been with the company for many years and had a previously clean disciplinary record. In spite of all of this, the Employment Tribunal found that it had been within the band of reasonable responses for the company to dismiss her given the derogatory nature of the comment, which was clearly aimed at the company.



SPIRITUALLY SPEAKING

I'm writing this as the sun is shining and we're set for a beautiful weekend of weather. However, all is not well with the world. It's a week after the General Election where a ridiculous amount of money was spent on another political 'game' that backfired. It's also a couple of weeks after the country was rocked with terror attacks in Manchester and London and a day after a horrific fire destroyed a tower block in west London where enormous wealth sits cheak-by-jowel with the disadvantaged.

There are a great many times when it is perhaps difficult to make sense of the world. Where we question - we question ourselves but also wonder what on earth to make of things in faith or religious terms. The world seems to be a dark place and we naturally have lots of questions.

I am reminded of the last letter that was never completed of a particularly saintly man who founded a religious community determined to seek peace amongst Christians and in the world. The day after he dictated some of the letter he was murdered during evening prayer surrounded by the brothers of the community and thousands of young people gathered as a 'pilgrimage of trust on earth'. This is what Brother Roger of Taizé has to say:

"I leave you peace; I give you my peace."

What is this peace that God gives?

It is first of all an inner peace, a peace of the heart. This peace enables us to look at the world with hope, even though it is often torn apart by violence and conflicts. This peace from God also supports us so that we can contribute, quite humbly, to building peace in those places where it is jeopardized.

World peace is so urgent in order to alleviate suffering, and in particular so that the children of today and tomorrow do not live in distress and insecurity. In his Gospel, in a dazzling intuition, Saint John expresses who God is in three words: "God is love." If we can grasp only those three words, we shall go far, very far.

What captivates us in those words? The fact that they transmit this luminous conviction: God did not send Christ to earth to condemn anyone, but for every human being to know that he or she is loved and to be able to find a road to communion with God.

But why are some people gripped by the wonder of a love and know that they are loved, or even cherished? Why do others have the impression that they are neglected?

If only everyone could realize that God remains alongside us even in the fathomless depths of our loneliness. God says to each person, "You are precious in my sight, I treasure you and I love you." Yes, all God can do is give his love; that sums up the whole of the Gospel.

What God asks of us and offers us is simply to receive his infinite mercy.

That God loves us is a reality sometimes hard to comprehend. But when we discover that his love is forgiveness above all else, our hearts find peace and are even transformed.....

All who choose to love and to say it with their life are led to ask themselves one of the most compelling questions of all: how can we ease the pain and the torment of others, whether they are close at hand or far away?

But what does it mean to love? Could it be to share the suffering of the most ill-treated? Yes. that's it.

Could it mean having infinite kind-heartedness and forgetting oneself for others, selflessly? Yes, certainly.

And again: what does it mean to love? Loving means forgiving, living as people who are reconciled. And reconciliation always brings a springtime to the soul.....

In the heart of each person, Christ still whispers today, "I will never leave you all alone; I will send you the Holy Spirit. Even if you are in the depths of despair, I remain alongside you."

There are times when all of us are shaken by a personal trial or by the suffering of others. This can go so far as to undermine our faith and extinguish our hope. Rediscovering the trusting of faith and peace of heart sometimes involves being patient with ourselves......Seeking reconciliation and peace involves a struggle within oneself. It does not mean taking the line of least resistance. Nothing lasting is created when things are too easy. The spirit of communion is not gullible. It causes the heart to become more encompassing; it is profound kindness; it does not listen to suspicions.

To be bearers of communion, will each of us walk forward in our lives on the road of trust and of a constantly renewed kind-heartedness?

On this road there will be failures at times. Then we need to remember that the source of peace and communion is in God. Instead of becoming discouraged, we shall call down his Holy Spirit upon our weaknesses.

And, our whole life long, the Holy Spirit will enable us to set out again and again, going from one beginning to another towards a future of peace."

She included many of the traditional characters such as ludy's ghost, Hector the horse, Pretty Polly, the Doctor, loey the clown, the Constable, lack Ketch and the Crocodile and went on to explain how following a slight decline in popularity at the end of the 19th century a revival came with the railways and bank holidays when people went to the seaside and the Punch and Judy show followed.



PROBUS HEARS FROM EX UK AMBASSADOR TO SYRIA

The greatest human disaster in the 21st century is how Adrian Sindall sums up the situation in Syria. And he should know because he can see the differences today to when he was our man in Damascus twenty years ago.

Today Syria has become an international proxy war with US, Russia, France, Turkey and the EU involved; sometimes in military action but also attempting a diplomatic solution. This is hindered by 1500 factions either for or against the Syrian



government and also fighting amongst themselves. The statistics of this conflict, now in its seventh year, are staggering. 300,000 dead, 1,000,000 wounded, half the population, 6,300,000, living in refugee camps in Syria and 4,900,000 refugees in neighbouring countries.

It was never a straightforward situation in Syria and the surrounding Middle East. This whole region was divided up by the French and British after the First World War following the fall of the Ottoman Empire. Syria was further sub-divided by France to include an area dominated by the Kurds. The Second World War saw Syria support the Palestinian cause with later increasing Russian influence, both militarily and commercially where Syria adopted a Marxist command style economy. Over the years various types of relationships were developed in the region by the dividing powers with increasing support from US.


Syria felt betrayed that Egypt signed a peace accord with Israel and thought it necessary to strengthen ties with Iran. Similarly Iraq was supported by the US. And there were all kinds complicated cross supporting alliances that if charted looked more confusing than an electrical wiring diagram.

After the end of the Cold War and the collapse of the Soviet Union, Syria was left almost isolated and needed to develop relationships with western countries. It had helped that they had supported the allies in the Gulf War. When President Assad died and his eldest son having previously been killed in a car crash, the second son, Bashar, was in London training to be an ophthalmogist. He returned to Damascus to become leader of the Ba'ath Party and President.

With the rise of the Arab Spring movement in 2011 across several countries it soon became the turn of the Syrian government to defend its position. At that time the US considered that Assad should not benefit from any western assistance as Russia was increasing their influence and Iran wanted to keep him in power. Then Turkey and Qatar and the Muslim Brotherhood put in their pennyworth but this upset Saudi Arabia.

Today, with direct Russian military support Assad appears to have turned a corner in this highly complicated conflict. Looking at a map of the current situation appears confusing to the layman but the reality is that while ISIS and their acolytes occupy 75% of the land mass it only contains 25% of the remaining population whereas Assad controls 25% of the land, mainly by the coast, and this is the important bit, 75% of the population.

In recent times there has emerged an international feeling that Assad might stay in place and therefore should be involved in the diplomatic process of finding a solution. Any US/Russia joint initiative has hit a snag because of a US law that prohibits cooperation between these countries. There then comes a question of who will be in charge of those parts of the country after ISIS has been defeated. Shades of



Iraq and Libya where there was a failure to have a proper exit policy. The toll on Syria, both culturally with the destruction by ISIS of World Heritage sites like Palmyra and economically, has been substantial. Only time will tell if it ever recovers.

Adrian Sindall summed up the overall situation that Syria is rather like a Rubic's cube when compared to a cross word puzzle.
