HATCH WARREN BEGGARWOOD CYCLING CLUB



It's been a busy summer of riding with Hatch Warren and Beggarwood cycle club (HWBCC). We now have over 150 members.

At the end of July over 40 riders took part in the St Michael's Hospice Big Wheel 25. So called as it was the 25th year of the Big Wheel event with a whole range of rides. The club had riders over all the distances from a club member's 4 year old daughter riding the mini wheel a week after learning without stabilisers, all the way through to a group who did the 60 mile route.



On Sunday 10th September HWBCC celebrated our 2nd birthday. As a cycling club this involved a range of rides all finishing in Oakley so that all abilities could ride out, the short or longer ways to get to the club birthday cakes — yes, "cakes" as cycling seems to create an appetite for eating cake and so all sorts of scones, cakes, teas and coffees were waiting for riders in Oakley.



Whilst most of our cyclists set off on 20 and 30 mile routes, we also hosted the club's first family ride cycling along the multi-use path from Beggarwood Co-op into Oakley. The event has been carefully planned to only involve 2 road crossings and a number of cycle leaders. For a number of the younger children this was their longest ever ride and all should be extremely proud as the weather on the way home was not very kind. The club as a whole is looking into having those who are aged 16 and 17 joining rides and also at the other family safe routes where members can accompany children.

As autumn arrives we will be starting a series of cycling related film and pizza nights. The first in mid October will be about Lance Armstrong (The Armstrong Lie). Just like last winter assuming it is safe to do so, rides will continue on Tuesday evenings and weekends.

Over the last couple of years, since our founding, we have gained a wonderful reputation of being an inclusive and very welcoming, social club. We genuinely welcome all new comers and try to offer something for everyone. If you've got a bike gathering dust in the garage, do think about riding with us — we offer shorter, social rides as well as longer distances. We offer people thinking about joining up to three rides before asking for a commitment to membership. We have a great social diary that offers something for everyone (and plenty of cake). Come ride with us!



St. Michael's Hospice in Basingstoke is celebrating its 25th Anniversary this year and invites everyone to come along and mark the occasion at Winchester Cathedral on Friday 6th October. Guests are invited to arrive for 19:00 and the service will start at 19:30.

The Basingstoke Hospital Male Voice Choir and Ooh Mama Ladies will be performing accompanied by the Basingstoke Heritage Light Orchestra. Tickets aren't being issued but the Hospice asks you to register your interest by visiting their website at stmichaelshospice.org.uk.

It is hard now to imagine a time when there was no adult hospice in North Hampshire but thanks to the vision and drive of local residents in the late 1980s, the story of St. Michael's Hospice began when a committee led by former borough Mayor, Cllr Margaret Weston, began its work. 25 years later the Hospice has

seen over 5,000 patients on its in-patient unit, 2,000 more have been cared for in their own homes, and countless more have been into the Hospice during the day for therapy. In addition, the Hospice now works supporting local care homes to improve their end-of-life care and has a partnership with Odiham Cottage Hospital to befriend local residents.

St. Michael's doesn't just care for people during their final days but can be there for patients for years; from the time of their diagnosis of a terminal illness through supporting their loved ones with bereavement counselling for as long as they need.

To mark all of this, and to thank the thousands of volunteers and supporters who have made this remarkable journey possible, you can join in the celebrations in glorious Winchester Cathedral.

13 Aug saw 2 HWR teams of 4 take part in the Hart 4k Relay. The idea of this race was to run as many 4k laps in 4 hours; both teams did very well.

Jeff Mitchell took part in Salisbury 54321 50k on 13 Aug and achieved a time of 5

hours and 52 minutes – an amazing achievement!

Other events HWR have taken part in since the last report - 5k Brutal Pyestock, Beat the Train (in North Wales), Maidenhead Half Marathon, Fleetwood Half Marathon, Farnham Pilgrim Trail Marathon, New Forest

10k and Andover Trail 10k, Half Marathon and full Marathon. We also had 3 Hatchies run the Great North Run on 10 Sep,

although they didn't quite catch Mo Farah! On 9 Sep Hossam Ashraf took part in a ½ Iron Man. This consisted of a 1900m swim, followed by a 90k cycle ending with a 21.1k run. This is definitely not for the faint hearted, but Hossam completed this in 6 hours 53 minutes – fabulous!

One notable date in the HWR calendar is the Basingstoke Half Marathon on 1st October. The club is already in training so many of the runners will be taking to the hills as this race is a tough but rewarding one on home ground. If you see us out and about give us a toot or shout out to spur us on!

From the Archives – it was 4 years ago on 3 Aug that the official Hatch Warren Runners tshirt was launched; since then hundreds have been worn across the world and in some high profile races!

BASINGSTOKE CIVIL SERVICE RETIREMENT FELLOWSHIP

At the meeting held on 6th September the Chairman, David Cowling, welcomed all those present and introduced 3 new members and 2 visitors. The Secretary, Tony Brazier then reported that the Mystery Trip on Wednesday 25th October was fully booked but that the next outing to the Festival of Christmas at Portsmouth Dockyard on Friday 1st December still needed some more people to ensure that it went ahead.







The speaker this month was Tony King who spoke about "Vanished London". He illustrated his talk with many photographs of places around London that were mainly photographed in the 1800s but that sadly no longer stood today either because of ill thought out reconstruction or through bombing during the war. Many of the photographs were taken by Henry Fox Talbot (1800 - 1877); a British scientist, inventor and photography pioneer; who had the foresight to use his newly found technique to record many of the landmarks of London. Some of the streets have completely disappeared or been drastically changed as was Regent Street whose wonderful colonnades were removed in 1925, many buildings hotels and bridges have been demolished and rebuilt or as in the case of London Bridge shipped to America as a tourist attraction. The coming of the railways was a considerable cause of disruption with 76,000 people being displaced, houses demolished and great new architectural structures being built as railway stations which themselves have undergone changes throughout the years. One place which has, however, survived all of this is The George Inn, Southwark, now owned by the National Trust, where both William Shakespeare and Charles Dickens reputedly drank and wrote.

The next meeting is on 4th October when the speaker will be lain Kennedy on "Cuba Libra". The group meets on the first Wednesday of each month at Brookvale Village Hall from 10 am to 12 noon and all retired Civil Servants and their partners are welcome. BASINGSTOKE NEIGHBOURCARE NEEDS YOU!

DRIVERS REQUIRED

We provide a service for elderly people in YOUR community. Particularly for those who find it difficult to use public transport or lack the confidence to go out on their own. We provide a driving service to pick them up from home, take them to their appointment and bring them home again, using our volunteers own car. We also take clients shopping, to social events such as lunch clubs, helping them remain part of their community.

We need drivers who can spare a few hours a week during the day time, Monday to Friday, and who have a car that is comprehensively insured and suitable for carrying an elderly person. In return we will cover your petrol cost from home currently we pay 45p per mile. Some of our driver currently work shifts and can only offer I or part of a day per week but even this amount of time can help us. You can choose what hours/days you are available and what duties you undertake.

BEFRIENDERS REQUIRED

Would you have an hour a week free? Many elderly people would love to have someone to come and see them for a cup of tea and a chat. You could be the first person they see that week who has time just for them! You will gain great satisfaction and help them to relieve their loneliness. We try to find you someone who lives near to you so that if you do not have your own transport you can walk to them. But if you have to use your car or public transport we will reimburse your costs.

We need people who have time and patience and like talking to elderly people. You need to have good listening skills and be able to show empathy. We will provide you with training and support and match you with one of our clients. Our befriending co-ordinator will take you to your first meeting with our client and support you as necessary.

WHERE THERE'S A WILL THERE'S AN LPA?

Have you considered how your financial affairs or your personal welfare would be looked after if you are not well enough to do it for yourself?

Have you ever heard of a Lasting Power of Attorney? This is a legal document by which you, as the donor will formerly appoint another person, the attorney, to act on your behalf to look after your affairs if you are mentally or physically unable to manage them for yourself.

Lasting Powers of Attorney come in two forms, one for Property and Financial Affairs and one for Personal Health and Welfare.

The Property and Financial Affairs document will allow your attorney to buy or sell any property on your behalf and deal with your bank accounts, shares, investments and pensions and

any other financial investments that you may have. This document may be used whilst you have mental capacity to give your instructions, but can also be used in the event that you lose mental capacity.

The Personal Health and Welfare document will allow your attorney to make decisions about your well-being, but only in circumstances where you do not have the mental capacity to make decisions for yourself.

The documents last for the duration of your life and upon your death, the documents die with you, at which stage your Will (if you have prepared one) appointing your executors will come into effect.

If you decide not to prepare Lasting Powers of Attorney and do not have a valid document in place at a stage in your life when you require one, then your family will need

to apply to the Court of Protection for a Deputyship Order. A Deputyship Order is a formal document which is authorised by the Court of Protection to appoint someone on your behalf to administer your affairs.

OLD DOWN AND BEGGARWOOD WILDLIFE GROUP

We are now into autumn – the summer flowers and butterflies are now over and leaves are turning

colour and the evenings drawing in. Many of our bird species will have now migrated to warmer climes - such as swallows, swifts, reed warblers, sedge warblers and ospreys. You might be lucky enough to see an osprey flying south especially around the Romsey area. But this is the time when many bird species return to Britain - such as geese, swans, great grey strike, fieldfare and redwing. Fieldfare and redwing are winter migrants to Britain and often fly and roost together and both are often seen on Beggarwood Park and Old Down and around local gardens. The redwing is easily identifiable having a boldly patterned face with a creamy white stripe over its eye and a splash of rusty red on its flanks. Both species feed on fruit such as windfall apples and berries such as hawthorn and rowan.





SPIRITUALLY SPEAKING

At the end of August, I attended Greenbelt at Boughton House in Northamptonshire as I have for the last 7 or so years. Greenbelt describes itself as a 'faith and arts festival'. It's a coming together of a broad spectrum of people; those who have faith, are having challenges in their faith and of no faith, at a beautiful listed site. The programme is mixed and varied; speakers, arts, singers and theatre. Everything stops on Sunday morning and the site gathers for communion; 12,000 or so people gathering in and around the large, central, circus tent

to share and remember the last supper Jesus had with his friends. $\,$

This year the theme was 'bring a body'; recognising that our bodies are all different and that whatever their shape or how they manifest themselves, we are all made in the image of God. The worship itself was led by those with disabilities; the reading transmitted from the house of someone with ME that is so debilitating that the reader is often confined to their house. This is what Greenbelt had to say in its introduction to the service:

"Our whole nature, extending from the first to the last, is, so to speak, one image of Him Who is." (Gregory of Nyssa)

Christians say, sometimes lightly, that we are "made in the image of God." What do we mean by that? Sometimes we speak as if God's qualities are amongst the colours in the palette from which we are painted. Gregory of Nyssa teaches us to think quite differently.

The image of God is not a characteristic, like our height or our blood group. Instead, the whole of each person expresses the whole image of God. I am the picture: God is all the colours. God is all the ingredients in the recipe that is me. So if I am tall or short, male or female or something else, my height and gender speak of God. I may be a body that people deem to be perfect; or I may be profoundly disabled by the standards and practices of my culture. Either way, my body fully reflects the body of God.'

The sermon was delivered by Becky Tyler who is almost 15 years old, who has Cerebral palsy and talks through a computer generated voice (like Stephen Hawking). Becky talked about how, when she was younger, she didn't think that God loved her because when

she read the bible she couldn't relate or find mention of anyone

like her; but when she was directed to a passage in the book of Daniel that talked of God on a throne with wheels she was able to relate to God in a wheelchair!

The main thrust of Becky's talk, though, was that she

The main thrust of Becky's talk, though, was that she found out that her condition was as a result of a mistake at her birth, but she did not let this define or restrict her. She told us 'please don't let your mistakes stop you from giving your best to Jesus, he can even use your mistakes for His glory.'

We are all made in the image of God. There is so much pressure on us and in particular our young people to conform to a certain image, to perform to a certain

academic standard – and in all of this we might sometimes forget to affirm each other when perhaps things are quite as we expect or things go wrong (however significant or insignificant). Whether you have a faith or not, to paraphrase Becky, please don't let mistakes prevent you from giving your best. Mistakes can be used for glory. With blessings,

PROBUS CLUB HEARS ABOUT BRITISH FORCES BROADCASTING



The Probus Club of Basingstoke enjoyed a presentation by Alan Grace about the life of a programme maker living with our armed forces whose broadcasts allowed them to maintain morale by keeping contact with families in UK and also provided them with much needed entertainment.

Many people of mature age will remember Two Way Family Favourites on Sunday mornings. Then known as the wireless it was broadcast on the BBC Light Programme. It was claimed that this was the only radio programme that had the smell of roast beef and Yorkshire pudding. The German end was run by BFBS (British Forces Broadcasting Service) with Jean Metcalfe there and Cliff Michelmore in London.

In World War 2 both the German and Russian military had radio services for their troops and after the Americans joined the war effort the British War Office was persuaded by Col David Niven and supported by Glenn Miller that our troops would benefit from a similar operation. The first military broadcast services saw life begin in Algeria in 1943 and run by the Army Welfare Service. The only drawback was that there was no money, no equipment and no staff. And it was firmly established that editorial control was to be independent of the Ministry of Defence and the armed forces themselves. By some miracle they were on air in seven weeks. It was set in a former harem but the fully glazed floor and wall tiles had to be draped in army blankets to deaden the appalling acoustics. The first requested record was the famous German wartime song, Lily Marlene.

In the following years over 100 radio stations were set up from Aden to Zeltweg. Some of the earlier stations

were mobile housed in ten ton trucks with transmitters, generators, record library and studio. They followed troops through the Italian campaign and then into mainland Europe. Fixed sites were based in a range of extreme locations from the magnificent Musikhalle in Hamburg that had escaped bombing, down to an old cow shed in Cyprus, tents in the Canal Zone and shipping containers at Camp Bastion in Afghanistan.

Some of the people involved became household names. Cliff Michelmore, Frank Muir who was a photographer but volunteered to be a writer, Peter Sellers, Brian Moore who went on to become a top sports presenter with ITV, and Roger Moore who was told that as he could not act he should go back to being a male model for knitting patterns. He later sent a postcard to the producer who had dismissed his talent which said that although he could not act he had still had a good life and signed it 007.

In 1957 Alan Grace started working with what then was BFN in Cologne as an announcer and sports producer, while a national serviceman in the RAF. Over the next four decades he experienced life throughout the world's trouble spots where British forces were involved. Such places of conflict had radio and then television services provided for service personnel and their dependents worldwide. Places of interest included Palestine, Cyprus during EOKA, Kenya in Mau Mau times, Aden with terrorist troubles, Cyprus, again, during the Turkish invasion, Hong Kong, The Balkans, The Falklands, Gulf Wars I and 2 and Afghanistan.
