### PROBUS HEARS ABOUT RADIO TIMES

The Probus Club of Basingstoke, the social group for retired professional and business managers, listened with interest about radio broadcasting memories in the era of 1930s - 60s. It was presented by John Pitman, who grew up during WW2 on a farm near Winchester, where the "wireless" was the main form of information and entertainment.

Like many places in those days his home had no electrical supply and the radio was powered by an accumulator, an early form of battery consisting of glass phials filled with acid and it had to be taken away weekly for recharging. Some readers may remember "crystal sets" which were usually homemade and did not require an electrical supply. However radio broadcasting goes back to the turn of the twentieth century after the invention of valves made it possible to receive electrical signals. The first broadcast took place on Christmas Eve 1906 from the New York Metropolitan Opera House but the only listeners were ships moored in New York harbour. 1920 saw the first radio news broadcast by the Marconi Experimental Station at Writtle near Chelmsford in Essex followed two years later with regular entertainment programmes. The British Broadcasting Company, whose main station was 2LO, morphed into the Corporation in 1926 becoming the BBC. Many memories were stirred as old radio programmes were recalled, ITMA (It's that man again - Hitler during the war) with Tommy Handley and Mrs

Mop asking "Can I do you now sir" and

Worker's Playtime was broadcast from

factory canteens. Have a Go starred Wilfred Pickles with Mabel at the Table and in later series Violet Carson, of Ena Sharples fame, playing the piano. Ray's a Laugh with Ted Ray was the fastest joke teller on radio, Much-Binding-in-the-Marsh, with Kenneth Horne and Richard Murdoch was broadcast from a fictitious RAF station. Hi Gang in the war became in peacetime Life with the Lyons with American Ben Lyon with his English wife Bebe Daniels and Vic Oliver. Take it from Here starred "Professor" Jimmy Edwards, Alma Cogan with Dick Bentley and June Whitfield playing the dim witted engaged couple whose famous phrase was "Oooh Ron; yes Eth?".

Dick Barton Special Agent was on every weekday evening while Journey in to Space with Jet Morgan was on Monday evenings. In Town Tonight was a Saturday teatime current affairs and personality show "We stop the roar of London's traffic to see who is in town tonight". Sunday lunchtimes had Two Way Family Favourites with Cliff Michelmoore in London and Jean Metcalfe in Germany followed by the Billy Cotton Band Show which opened with the phrase "Wakey wakey".

The Goon Show had Peter Sellers, Spike Milligan, Michael Bentine and Harry Secombe while Round the Horne had Kenneth Horne, Marty Feldman with Kenneth Williams and Hugh Paddick as Julian and his friend Sandy. Mrs Dale's Diary was always worried about Jim and The Archers the everyday story of country folk is still on air today.

Who would believe that a ventriloquist's dummy would have a successful radio



show called *Educating Archie!* It couldn't happen today but stars of the day appeared like Beryl Reid as Monica but introduced herself in a Brummie accent "Good evening each, my name's Marlene" and Max Bygraves had two catch phrases "I've arrived and to prove it I'm here" and "Good idea, son".

The New York Opera still broadcasts on Christmas Eve but today over 300 radio stations around the world carry the programme.

### WHEN MEDICAL TREATMENT GOES WRONG

The standard of medical treatment in the UK is largely very good but there are unfortunate occasions where you may have received negligent treatment and there are options available to you.

In the first instance, you should go through the complaints procedure of your hospital/surgery/dentist/care provider. The second step is to make a claim for negligence against the treatment provider.

What can compensation include?

Compensation is tailored to each individual case and awarded according to the extent of the loss. The aim of compensation is to put the person back in the financial position they would have been in,

had the negligence not occurred.

A successful claim would include an award for pain, suffering and loss of amenity and also takes into account loss of earnings and other expenses.

Factors such as age, your job, life expectancy, the potential need for future care, therapy, treatment, travel expenses, prescriptions, aids and equipment and other foreseeable expenses can be included in the calculation. The compensation can also include the loss of earnings of a partner or family member who have provided care for you or escorted you to appointments and treatments.

Where the future is uncertain and symptoms may be ongoing as a result of the negligence, our solicitors are guided by medical opinion to give a prognosis, which

will be considered in any settlement reached. Any further operations or treatments with additional recovery time off work and care will be considered.

### OLD DOWN AND BEGGARWOOD WILDLIFE GROUP

Both Old Down and Beggarwood have a new bird record! In early January 2018 a few members of the Group were on

Old Down carrying out the fortnightly bird count and a Hawfinch was seen the UK's largest and rarest finch. This is the first time a Hawfinch has been seen and recorded on Old Down and it is not possible to describe how taken aback and excited the members were to have such a sighting. Then a few days later four were seen on Beggarwood – again very exciting. Although the Hawfinch is a shy and wary bird it is quite easy to spot because of the flash of its white-tipped tail as it flies. Hawfinches are fairly scarce in the UK, usually staying in central Europe, so these sightings are something special. However, this winter there has been a marked increase in numbers coming into the UK and as a consequence there have been sightings locally, such as around Romsey and Goring, which is most unusual. As you can see from the photo below, the *Hawfinch* is a very smart brightly coloured bird.

Another first sighting on Beggarwood was a Wigeon (!) seen strutting about on the grass near to the new community hall. Wigeons are waterfowl that like to be in a flock, so obviously this one was off track and lost and he did look a bit confused and bemused being on his own with no water nearby.

We had snow on Old Down and Beggarwood over the Christmas and New Year season, enough to enjoy and for some children to make snowmen, the remains lasting several days.

By the time you read this, the *snowdrops* should be showing on both sites. More were planted by the work parties last year so hopefully more will be coming up.



For Old Down, we meet outside Old Down Hall every Thursday 10-12 noon. But always check our website just in case there is a cancellation or change.

For Beggarwood, we meet monthly at The Maze, usually on the third Saturday of the month 10 -12 noon, however the Group is uncertain about the future arrangements of the Beggarwood work parties as the usual leader has left so please check our website for confirmation. If anyone is interested in helping to lead the Beggarwood work parties please contact the Group to discuss. There is a lot of litter around Beggarwood so if anyone is interested getting a litter pick session set up please contact the Group to discuss.





### SPIRITUALLY SPEAKING

Doesn't it feel as if Christmas was a long time ago! In church terms, Christmas doesn't actually finish until Candlemass which is on Sunday 28th January when we celebrate the Presentation of Christ in the Temple. And we then move swiftly on to Lent which begins with Ash Wednesday on 14th February – Valentines Day!

Valentine's Day might be quite a good clash with the beginning of Lent. When we celebrate love (this is what is said on the origins of St Valentine's day: several martyrdom stories associated with the various Valentines that were connected to February 14, including a popular account of Saint Valentine of Rome which indicated he was imprisoned for performing weddings for soldiers who were forbidden to marry and for ministering to Christians, who were persecuted under the Roman Empire. According to legend, during his imprisonment, Saint Valentine healed the daughter of his jailer, Asterius, and before his execution, he wrote her a letter signed "Your Valentine" as a farewell). Of course, at the end of Lent, we celebrate Easter — Good Friday being the demonstration of the ultimate gift of Love from God in Jesus' death on the cross. The most important weekend in the Christian calendar.

During Lent the church enters a time of penance – traditionally a time when something is given up or something extra is done. We remember Jesus' time in the desert being tempted by the devil.

Lent begins, as I've mentioned, with Ash Wednesday; a day when traditionally Christians have an ash cross marked on their foreheads. At Immanuel, as with many other churches, we use the ash from the burnt palm crosses of last year. As the priest makes the sign of the cross on the forehead of each person she or he says 'Remember you are dust, and to dust you shall return.' — we remember our mortality. Nadia Bolz-Weber says this about Ash Wednesday:

'In the rest of our lives it seems that we are consumed by the hopeless project of ensuring our own immortality. As though we can live forever or fend off the insult of aging with the right combination of exercise, diet, self-care and if we can afford it, elective surgery. Face creams, hair die, yoga. The offers of false promise are all around us. Luring us into the delusion of endless youth as though we can buy our way out of the foundational truth of who we are. Mortal......the desert we journey through in these 40 days of Lent. The wilderness of the truth

deep within us. A wisdom which is not of this world. We journey with Jesus through the desert of Lent but it's almost as though we have to clear through a whole lot of brush to even get to desert. Lent is about hacking through self-delusion and false promises. Lent is about looking at our lives in as bright a light as possible, the light of Christ, to illumine that which moth and rust can consume and which thieves can steal. It is during this time of self-reflection and sacrificial giving and prayer that we make our way through the over grown and tangled mess of our lives. We trudge through the lies of our death-denying culture to seek the simple weighty truth of who we really are.'

So Lent isn't actually about giving things up! It's about a time of self reflection — and in doing that we may sacrificially give (we may stop doing something if, on reflection, that would be good for us during this time and good for others). I would urge us all to take time out of our busy lives this Lent and reflect. Reflect on who we are, remember that we are mortal, that we won't live for ever, that none of us are Superwoman/superman\* (insert superhero's name!) and that we are here, on this earth by the grace of God.

At Immanuel on Tuesday 13th February we're having a Pancake Tea at 4.30pm for all the family; young or not so young and on Wednesday 14th February at 7.30pm we have a service to mark the start of Lent with the imposition of ashes (the signing of the cross on our foreheads). We'd love to see you.

I wish you a blessed and thought provoking Lent.

### COUNCILLOR UPDATE

**NUMBER 12 BUS SERVICE:** Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council is working with HCC and Stagecoach to avoid damaging reductions to the number 12 bus service which is used by local residents in Hatch Warren and Beggarwood. I have stressed the importance of this service.

**NEWS ON THE MOTORWAY SERVICE AREA:** Applegreen, the developers of the proposed Motorway Service Area close to Junction 7, had agreed to a pre-application briefing with Basingstoke and Deane councillors which was due to take place at the end of January. They have refused the suggestion of early engagement with local residents as they say the plans are not far enough advanced, and have also declined to attend a public meeting for the same reasons. I will update everyone as soon as I have any information.

**SCHOOL PARKING:** Had a very positive meeting with the new head at St Mark's School who is very aware of the problems of school run parking and is keen to work with parents, local residents and representatives to develop strategies to improve things.

**PARKING AT BEGGARWOOD CENTRE:** I have made continued representations to the owners of the car park serving the

surgeries, shops and nursery regarding the proliferation of trade vans and vehicles parked in the car park all day. A representative from the owning company, Grainger, has undertaken to work on the problem.

**ROADS:** All local BDBC and HCC councillors were invited to a briefing with HCC Highways at the end of January to hear more about proposals to improve travel in the area, I will update in the next Rabbiter.

**BEGGARWOOD SURGERY:** News of the verdict from the return CQC inspection of the surgery in December is still awaited.


**ALLOTMENTS:** A planning application for the proposed new allotments at Beggarwood Park is expected soon.

**TRAFFIC CAMERAS:** The number plate recognition cameras monitoring HGV traffic through Woodbury Road to the anaerobic digester are operating again.

**UPDATE FROM HCC:** Our local County Councillor is seeking a meeting with Highways officers to develop options on the A30 corridor in the light of development pressures, and especially around the Brighton Hill roundabout.






