PROBUS VISIT TAG AVIATION FARNBOROUGH



A chilly but sunny day greeted a privileged group of members of the Probus Club of Basingstoke on what was to be an extremely informative and interesting insight into the modern day VIP operations on this airfield.

Farnborough airfield is perhaps best known for being the venue for the world renowned SBAC (Society of British Aerospace Companies) Farnborough International Air Show. However, this is a much biased view of what has been one of the most important, albeit non operational, airfields in the UK. Farnborough's part in the early development on military aviation and its subsequent involvement with testing and evaluation has secured its place in British aviation heritage.

Farnborough Common was chosen by the British Army in 1905 as a site for His Majesty's Balloon Factory to manufacture the new dirigible type of balloon. It had plenty of space and was nearby to existing manufacturing facilities at Aldershot. An impressive balloon shed was built followed by gas holders and workshops plus the establishment of a balloon school. The Farnborough Air Sciences Trust (FAST) was established in 1993 and has been instrumental in the preservation and safeguarding of this part of priceless aviation legacy.

It was on the common on 16 October 1908 that saw Samuel Cody achieving the first sustained powered flight in England flying British Army Aeroplane No I and in April 1911 the site became the Army Aircraft Factory. With the expansion of the RFC during WWI the site became known as the Royal Aircraft Factory (RAF). The name changed, however, in April 1918 with the formation of the Royal Air Force becoming the Royal Aircraft Establishment (RAE), and it was in this guise of aviation related research and development that Farnborough remained primarily concerned with until 1985.

Encroaching environmental issues with housing and the overcrowded airspace surrounding the airfield had put pressure on military flying research and development activities. However, a reprieve from total closure was gained because of the site's value as an ideal venue for the SBAC Show and the lack of an alternative. Part of the airfield was released by the MOD for general and business aviation use and an aerospace park was established in the 1990s.

Following further closure arguments, due mainly to poor general aviation uptake, it was decided to sell the site. The company TAG,



(Techniques d'Avant Garde), a Luxembourg registered company only formed in 1977, secured the airfield for a multi-million pound price tag.

Significant capital expenditure was made by TAG in modernising the airfield in keeping with bespoke VIP business jet operations and Civilian Aviation Authority regulations. These included a new control tower, radar unit, spacious specially designed aircraft maintenance hangars and an extensive aircraft apron for multi jet parking, servicing

and operations. The 2440 metres runway was resurfaced. In line with attracting business users TAG also commissioned a luxurious terminal building that provides the very best hospitality in spacious and beautiful lounges for both VIP passengers and Aircraft Crews. Besides customs, immigration and security facilities passengers may drive directly to their waiting aircraft.

The TAG operation at Farnborough supports the employment of over 1000 people and 28,000 aircraft movements. This is to be increased to 50,000, gradually being phased in over the forthcoming years.

THE STAG AND HOUNDS PUB & RESTAURANT

Despite living on the south western side of Basingstoke for nearly twenty years I had only been in the Harvester Stag & Hounds once, a couple of years ago. I'd been impressed on that occasion so when madam's birthday approached and her family suggested having lunch there I looked forward to the experience again.

Placed on the old part of Winchester Road leading to Pack Lane it doesn't have a large frontage wedged between Hobby Craft and what had been Home Base, now in the new guise of Bunnings warehouse and facing Home Bargains. For many years I hadn't realised that tucked away at the rear was a Travel Lodge hotel. I had only seen the frontage with its large umbrellas to protect the smokers from the elements. However inside is a bit like a Tardis with an expansive dining area with tables and booths for different party sizes.

The menu options are extensive and clearly follow the Harvester principle of catering for the whole family with good choices for children and adults alike. Help yourself to the salad bar, as many times as you like, which the hungry teenagers in our party did, as well as the bottomless soft drinks system where they were presented with an empty glass and off they went, again several times, for various cola, lemonade and orange beverages. The Early Bird special is a bit of a misnomer as it is on offer from 11.30 am to 5.00 pm Monday to Friday, and at £7.49 is great



value with the unlimited salad bar and an array of grilled chicken, gammon, ribs, plaice and various burgers all served with chips or alternatives. Sweets are extra, with either sundaes or chocolate fudge cakes to cheesecakes. After 5.00 pm the full menu offerings are there to tempt you should you be so inclined as to dine out in the evening.

They have a breakfast menu up to 11.30 am as they have to cater for the hotel guests, which, having studied the menu, offers great choices from a simple continental breakfast through to a full English. When we have a free morning it is definitely in our plans to try this out.

Our experience was very positive, with attentive servers who took our selections on a hand held device, good quality food, promptly served and value for money. With seven in our party and everyone having a sweet and drinks the bill came to £108. Not too shabby, and because they had run out of candles, the staff went across the road to Home Bargains to buy some more so that when the sweets were presented madam had the privilege of a lit candle on her cheesecake and we all sang "Happy Birthday". That really was excellent customer service.

WHEN MINI BREAKS JUST DON'T CUT IT

Employment Appeal Tribunal has held that compensatory rest breaks must be at least twenty uninterrupted minutes long in length not as a series of mini-breaks.

This warning comes after Network Rail was found to have failed to facilitate full 20-minute rest breaks despite the employee being in a role that has special provision for alternative arrangements.

All workers are entitled to an uninterrupted 20-minute rest break away from their work station after six hours of working under the Working Time Regulations (WTR).

Minimum rest periods are there for the protection of health and safety and this ruling demonstrates, once again, that employment tribunals will not allow employers to shirk their responsibility or alter a worker's statutory rights to fit around business needs.

As with all terms of employment, the starting point should be a clear policy that everyone knows and understands, especially in environments in which prescheduled breaks are hard to operate, or workers are working alone. It's important to re-evaluate regularly and see if problems are arising, and take steps to ensure that breaks are being taken. You also need to be proactive about it, as arguing that a worker never asked for a break is not going to let you off the hook.

If you have a situation where it is difficult to give workers an uninterrupted break, away from their work station, then it's worth reviewing the position with some specialist guidance, as the alternative may be an expensive tribunal claim.

BASINGSTOKE VOLUNTARY ACTION

February has been a busy month here at BVA with a well attended Voluntary Sector Forum discussing the work of the Basingstoke and Deane Health and Wellbeing Partnership and how voluntary organisations can work together on these issues, particularly increasing social connections, and also on issues relating to older people living in our community. BVA's group development team continue to support local groups with advice on grant and other funding applications, and also to help you recruit volunteers that you so need for your work.

We have also run various well attended training courses – Trigger tool training, digital learning and cyber security, data protection and how to prepare for GDPR. We would like to draw your attention to training events coming up on Social enterprise – to help groups develop their income and trading activities, and the popular volunteer training event in April "attracting, keeping and supporting your volunteers", together with a number of courses which will be of particular interest to groups working with young people – do look at BVA's website for details. At the VSF we also announced that Action Hampshire will shortly be publishing two very interesting surveys — one on the State of the voluntary sector across Hampshire and the second on Commissioning experiences — BVA plans to use both of these to help shape the support we give to local voluntary organisations in the coming year, and to help Action Hampshire's work with local commissioners. The new year kicked off with DaveWarman running the 25th Anniversary Walt Disney World Marathon in Florida. This was close to Dave's heart as he lost

both of his Grandmothers over the past 18 months and wanted to do something they both would have approved of. It was a hard race which started at 0530, but there were character stops and rollercoaster rides along the way, so also good fun — well done Dave on your achievement; your Grandmothers would have been proud!

6 Jan saw Jamie Dunkerley take part in 'The Fan Dance' in the Brecon Beacons. It is a gruelling 24k SAS Selection test march staged on Pen y Fan, the highest mountain in the Brecon Beacons, but civilians can also do it for fun! Jamie decided to go 'clean fatigue' which means survival kit only (some runners had 40kg packs). The race goes up to the summit, descends down Jacobs Ladder to a checkpoint, back up Jacobs Ladder then down Pen y Fan. The weather was cold, snowy and icy, but Jamie finished in 10th position for his age group — an amazing achievement!

Gloucester Marathon was next; Kevin Biles ran for the Fire Fighters Charity, well done Kevin! This was closely followed by Farnborough Half Marathon on 21 Jan, where 25 runners ventured out in snowy and sleety conditions.

27 Jan was Tony Nicholls 100th parkrun in Basingstoke. This was a very special event and an awesome achievement as Tony has been blind from birth. Tony was guided by Candy Wong and took part in the celebrations and refreshments after. Tony was also awarded a badge from the Mayor, who attended this special event.



On 27 Jan Rob Stait took part in his first ever half marathon. Lee Valley Velopark is usually a cycling venue but on this day was

used for a selection of running events. Rob ran the race in 1.45, which is a fantastic time for a first half marathon - well done Rob!

19 runners also took part in Romsey's 5 mile race on 28 Jan and on 4 Feb, 14 runners travelled to London for the Winter 10k run, so lots of venturing out this month!

A very popular event for HWR is Bramley 10/20. This took place on 11 Feb and runners can run either 10 or 20 miles. This year the club had 36 running 10 miles and 14 running 20 miles. LASTING POWERS OF ATTORNEY (LPA)

The term Lasting Powers of Attorney (LPA) may sound like an exciting TV series, but it is in fact a very useful legal document that people really ought to consider having in place alongside their Will.

An LPA is a way of giving someone you trust the legal authority to make decisions on your behalf should you lose mental capacity in the future or if you are worried about managing your affairs in the future. This person is called an Attorney.

You can have more than one Attorney and these can be anyone you chose such as family members or close friends. Clearly, they should be people you trust explicitly. One could be a professional adviser, such as a solicitor, who could oversee the activities of the main Attorney.

There are two different types of LPA. One of them covers decisions about your property and finances, and the other covers decisions about your health and welfare. You can choose to have one or both.

You can appoint the same person or persons to be your Attorney for both LPAs or you can choose different Attorneys.

The LPA will only be valid if you have the mental capacity to set it up and have not been put under any pressure to create it.

It must be countersigned to this effect by a trusted third party and registered with the Office of the Public Guardian.

If you are married or in a civil partnership do not assume that your spouse will automatically be able to deal with your finances and make decisions about your healthcare. This is not the case as, without an LPA, they will not have the authority.

We recommend that everybody has an LPA in place as mental capacity can be lost or diminish suddenly, as a result of a serious accident or suffering an illness.

An LPA can certainly provide some peace of mind for all concerned.



SPIRITUALLY SPEAKING

'God's love for us is as excessive as rain falling forever on the ocean."

Sara Miles 'City of God'

It's a very early Lent and Easter this year. Ash Wednesday and the start of Lent took place on Valentine's Day and Easter Day is on April Fools Day! I've reflected on the significance that there might be with those two days in particular! Winchester Cathedral had a whole day on Ash Wednesday with

the theme of 'Love is all you need'. I took part as the cathedral opened its doors and got rid of their admission charge for the day, offered prayer stations and 'ashes to go'; reminding people of God's love at the start of Lent; a time when Christians traditionally reflect, fast, pray, study and spend time getting closer to God. With Easter day being on April Fools' Day, perhaps we should think about the foolishness of God's love for us — love without bound and possibly too great to understand — the foolish love of God!

At the end of this month we enter the most holy of times in the church year when we remember Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem on a donkey and the week leading up to his arrest and crucifixion. At Immanuel we use to use this time for reflection and have that growing sense of building up to Easter and the emotions of remembering Jesus' trial, crucifixion and resurrection. The climax of a life that was a demonstration of God's love for each and every one of us, without exception. We will be having a full range of services during Holy Week for all. On Maundy Thursday, we'll gather to remember Jesus' last supper with his friends - we'll remember it by having a meal ourselves followed by communion and enter into a solemn time of reflection as we move into Good Friday. We have a time for all ages (and in particular children) on Good Friday morning at 10am, and then at midday we remember the three hours of Jesus on the cross with a time of reflection and contemplation.



On March 11th, we celebrate Mothering Sunday which is on the fourth Sunday of Lent, when we're almost able to catch sight of Easter (note that it's Mothering SUNDAY! Not Mother's Day - which is a festival celebrated elsewhere around the world). Mothering Sunday is always on what's known as Laetare Sunday; the meaning of which is 'rejoice!' - with Easter almost in sight, a day where people stop their fast or take a break from whatever they've given up; so if you've given up something for Lent, on March 11th you can take a break for the day (great if

you've given up chocolate or something similar!).

Mothering Sunday is an opportunity for us all to take stock, to rest from whatever we've given up if that's what we have done, and reflect. It's a good opportunity to think about those around us whom we love and need to be thankful for; not just our mothers. During our worship on Mothering Sunday at 10am, we will be giving thanks for all those who have taken on the mothering role in our lives as well as remembering and walking along side those who have suffered pain and loss as mothers or lost their mothers. Who will you be giving thanks for on Mothering Sunday?

Toward the end of Lent, on March 25th we come together for Palm Sunday, with a procession of palms and all-age communion service at 10am, we will have a full programme of services for Holy Week, including services on Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and a big Easter Day Celebration. COUNCILLOR UPDATE

BEGGARWOOD SURGERY:

As many residents will have seen, the surgery achieved an improved rating from the CQC inspection in December. The CQC continues to express concerns however, mainly around how embedded the improvements are and how sustainable the new leadership will prove. 
BEGGARWOOD COMMUNITY CENTRE AND CAFE IN THE PARK:






