

RESCUE DRAMA OF ILLEGAL IMMIGRANTS ON HIGH SEAS

Rabbiter magazine editorial associate Paul Flint with partner Janet Fagg and their friends Richard and Sibyl Wood from Bramley, in the darkness, witnessed a rescue of over 50 people from a rubber dinghy as their cruise ship Sapphire Princess made progress from Ceuta in Spanish Morocco en route to Lisbon.

Paul explained "We were in the theatre when an announcement from the captain around 8.15pm advised that they had spotted a small stationary vessel and following Maritime Law had to stop and check on the situation. Our ship's position was approximately 30 miles south of the Spanish port of Cadiz and it was clear that the small vessel had no lights and did not appear to be capable of making progress."

Looking from their room balcony they were able to watch as the Sapphire Princess (116,000 tons) prevented itself from drifting into the rubber dinghy where people were frantically baling and their outboard engine was not running. The ship used its bow and stern thrusters to maintain a steady position and because of its vast bulk it created a lea shelter from the prevailing wind which made for a much calmer surface.

The dinghy came alongside and was secured by a rope while the ship's crew threw life jackets and blankets to the immigrants huddled together for shelter.

The captain had decided that as there was no imminent danger to life that he would maintain a sheltering position and contacted the Spanish coastal authorities for assistance. They sent out a rescue boat with strong searchlights which came up to the stern of the cruise ship and then manoeuvred to a position approximately 100 yards to the side of the Sapphire Princess. This was presumably to ensure that there could be no dangerous physical contact between all three vessels.

At this stage the dinghy was cast off from the Sapphire Princess and it drifted towards the Spanish rescue ship. The immigrants could be heard shouting and using their whistles and lights from their life jackets as they drifted away from the cruise ship. All fifty or so were safely transferred to the Spanish vessel which it is believed would take them to the Spanish mainland after which they would be returned to the port from which they departed in north Africa.

The captain said that over the past ten years the crews and ships of the Princess Cruise Lines have participated in over 30 such rescues.

The planning appeal for a major site of 40 dwellings in **Cliddesden** (BDBC planning reference 16/04690/FUL) took place on 9th and 10th October. Lots of arguments about the increased flood risk for surrounding properties and, most importantly for everyone in the south west, the robustness of the Borough's five year housing land supply and the pace of housing delivery.

The latest on the **Hounsome Fields** application for a construction access on the A30 at the top of the site, opposite the entrance to Basingstoke Golf Club (BDBC planning reference 18/02443/ FUL) : Hampshire Highways has asked for more information on vehicle movements, traffic modelling, timescales and a safety audit. This mirrors our concerns over this proposed construction access. Although temporary, still more traffic lights are proposed!

SWAG is still very concerned about the proposed location of the primary school and nursery adjacent to the new roundabout on the

A30. Our concerns become ever more pertinent as new evidence appears on the dangers to health and child development from even modest amounts of vehicle generated air pollution. We await a Reserved Matters application to see if there are any changes to the layout of the development.

A planning application for the **Anaerobic Digester** in Garlic Lane has been submitted to HCC. See BDBC reference 17/01876/CMA. The operator wants the increase in vehicle movements which has been in place for two years to be made permanent. SWAG remains less than enthusiastic about this. Waste is now brought in and taken out by HGVs travelling long distances and accessing the plant along residential streets. That was never the original intention which was to be for a "green" development processing agricultural slurry from the Portsmouth Estate and food waste sourced from commercial and municipal sources within 20 - 30 miles. Comments must be made by 16th November:

The "call for sites" as part of the review of the Winchester Local Plan has resulted in the re-emergence of a proposal to build a new town of **6,000 dwellings at Micheldever** near the Blackdown forest. Watch this space for more news on this proposal which would have far reaching consequences for the south west of Basingstoke and for Junction 7 of the M3.

SWAG submitted comments on the July modifications to the plans for **Manydown**. You can see these under planning reference 17/00818/OUT. We have been told that we can expect a further Transport Addendum in October/November. As Hampshire Highways has put it : **"The highway authority has identified several** *areas where substantial further assessment is required*". Hear, hear to that!

THE MAN WHO MADE MECCANO (AND HORNBY TRAINS AND DINKY TOYS)

Everyone put their hands up to the question - who had played with some of the brand names in this heading? The man behind such famous products, Frank Hornby, was the subject of a talk given by John Hollands to the Probus Club of Basingstoke.

Frank Hornby was born in 1863 and Liverpool was his lifelong home ending up as Conservative MP for Everton. He was a cashier for a wholesale food business and had a small workshop at home that allowed him to develop some of his ideas. Having been impressed by a book about inventors and their many failures Frank Hornby appreciated that perseverance was the key to eventual success.

He wanted boys to take up useful trades and started to develop a construction kit which he patented in 1901. He hoped it would encourage boys to find suitable engineering employment locally.

Initially called Mechanics Made Easy the name changed to Meccano in 1907. Manufacturing was outsourced and were plain metal and not of the highest quality. The product was refined and eventually painted red and green then blue and yellow.

He started manufacturing himself and quickly growing out of two larger work units it was clear that even larger premises were needed. The famous Binns Road factory in Liverpool was opened in 1914 employing up to 2000, mainly women. After WWI Hornby introduced model trains to compete against resurgent German toy manufacturers. Export markets had decals on the trucks and passenger coaches pertinent to their own countries.

So successful were overseas markets that manufacturing plants were set up in France and eventually after a legal case over 9 years to protect his patents in America, he opened a factory in New Jersey.

Meccano magazines were published monthly aimed at boys initially featuring articles on Meccano construction. Frank Hornby was the editor for many years. Over time Meccano Magazine became a general hobby publication aimed at "boys of all ages".

The factory began making model figures to complement the train sets. Using the same scale as the trains they were called Dinky Toys. Vehicles were added to the railway layouts and thus began the third string of this toy manufacturer. No doubt every boy of a certain age, and many girls, enjoyed playing with Dinky Toys.

Increasing competition in the 1960s and 70s for die cast toys came from Mettoy's Corgi and from Match Box toys made by Lesney Products while Mattel developed their "Hot Wheels". Dinky Toys partly responded by expanding their Dinky Supertoys range which included the Mighty Antar transporter made by Thornycroft in Basingstoke.

Meccano Ltd was taken over by Lines Bros in 1964 with Hornby Dublo trains sets combing with the Triang name. Production was moved to Margate in Kent where it continues to this day.

The high cost of manufacturing in Britain took its toll and the Binns Road address closed in November 1979. Within a few years their competitors suffered the same fate.

Today Dinky Toys, especially with original boxes, command extraordinary prices at auction.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT CIVIL PARTNERSHIPS

Following from the news the Civil Partnership Act 2004 was deemed by the Supreme Court to be incompatible with human rights law, Teresa May has now announced that all couples in England and Wales will be able to choose to enter into a civil partnership rather than marriage.

So what will this mean for couples and the law?

A civil partnership is a legally recognised relationship between two people that offers many of the same benefits as a marriage, including the same inheritance rights.

Some feel that marriage promotes more "traditional" gender roles, where men and women are not seen on an equal footing. Whereas there is the view that entering into a civil partnership provides a message of equal unity.

Cohabiting couples are often left unprotected when it comes to inheritance and tax provisions, so entering into a civil partnership may be something to consider for those not wanting to get married.

You can still protect your interests before entering into a civil partnership and there is still a process to follow if a civil partnership should break down.





HATCH WARREN BEGGARWOOD CYCLING CLUB

At Hatch Warren Beggarwood Cycling Club one of our big goals is to get everyone on their bike, whether you are someone that can easily climb the biggest mountain to those just getting back on the saddle, and one of most popular rides is our regular 'Back on your Bike' rides.

Our "Back on your Bike" rides are ideal for beginners and those new to cycling who wish to join a group for a leisurely cycle ride around Basingstoke. Still not sure.... Let's see if we can give you some reassurance with our frequently asked questions.

Q: I don't own a road bike will I be able to join a Back on your Bike ride?

A: Yes you can, these rides are mainly on cycle paths and quiet roads, and we often use the multiuse path out to Oakley and back which is ideal for hybrids and mountain bikes.

Q: I am not a member of HWBCC do I need to sign up?

A: No, as a club we offer 3 free trial rides before we would ask you to consider joining.

Q: I am so slow I don't think I would be able to keep up...

A: Stop right there, no one is ever too slow to join our Back on a Bike ride. We ride to the slowest pace so no-one is left behind. We will usually have two British Cycling level I certified ride leaders, one at the front of the group and one at the back keeping us all together.

Q: I don't own any cycling clothing, what do I wear?

A: The mandatory requirement for all of our rides is that you must wear a cycling helmet. Other than that make sure you wear comfortable clothing, appropriate for the weather conditions, and shoes (trainers are ideal)

Q:What if I get a puncture I don't know what to do?

A: We ask that you bring at least one spare inner tube suitable for your bike. The leaders are able to assist with changing an inner tube and will guide you through the process.

Q: How far will we be cycling?

A:The Back on a Bike ride is usually around 1 hour in duration and we can cover anything from 6 to 10 miles in that period. So what are you waiting for ... come ride with us.

AGE DISCRIMINATION

The talents of more than a million over 50s are being wasted because of age discrimination!

That is according MPs who sit on the Women and Equalities Committee, chaired by Basingstoke MP Maria Miller.

The select committee found that discrimination, bias and outdated practices are prevalent across the business world even though they have been explicitly outlawed under regulations introduced in 2006.

It heard evidence from older workers that they were regularly discriminated against in the job market and were disproportionately likely to be selected for redundancy.

Following the committee's recently published report, called Older People and Employment, Maria Miller said: "Despite age discrimination being unlawful for more than a decade, the scale and lack of enforcement uncovered by our inquiry is both alarming and totally unacceptable."

The report was critical of both the Equality and Human Rights Commission (EHRC) and the Government for failing to enforce the law on age discrimination.

unconscious bias and casual ageism in the workplace were all unlawful under the Equality Act 2010, which replaced the Employment Equality (Age) Regulations 2006.

We've had a great first half term at Hatch Warren Under Fives, the children have been cooking, experimenting and welcoming lots of interesting visitors.

We had a fantastic emergency services themed week - a fire engine visited and the children had an amazing afternoon climbing



aboard and meeting the firemen, a police officer came in and had a lovely chat with the children and a nurse visited and taught the children lots of skills, they particularly enjoyed the bandaging!

A big thank you to our other visitors this term who add so much to our children's learning and development – Louise Weston from Hatch Warren Infant School visited our children for play dough gym, a super fun activity that helps children develop the core muscles they need for writing. And "Debutots" captivated our children with wonderful story telling and drama activities - such a great activity for preschool children, by exploring our stories vocally and physically we really help with their literacy and communication development.

We continually promote British values at preschool, but this term we've had great fun



with "Democracy". This month the children have been voting each day for which book to read

at circle time, they have loved casting their votes and learning about different choices.

Our science experiments are a firm favourite with our children. So far, we've made volcanoes, blown up balloons with bicarbonate of soda and vinegar and learned how rain is formed.

Autumn is one of the most wonderful seasons for children to explore and is always one of our favourite themes. Some of the children have spoken about seeing hedgehogs in their gardens, so to extend their learning we included hibernation as part of our autumn topic (being able to talk about the natural world and show concern for living things is an expectation for a typical child aged 30 to 50 months). Conkers, pine cones and leaves are a great resource at this time of year - we've been on walks in the woods where the children have collected lots of natural resources and looked at the changing colours on the trees. We are embracing the seasonal changes in Year R by going for an Autumn walk looking at all the beautiful colours in our surrounding areas and our wildlife area. The children have met all the Oxford Reading Tree Family and have made their very own first reading books to start them on a wonderful journey into what we hope will be a life long love of reading. Year R will use this time to introduce the children to Big Build, where they have a chance to build with logs, bricks, planks, sticks, crates combined with all our large construction. I'd heard of it but didn't know exactly where it was. Fortunately Madam had been with her friend and had been upset about a report in the Basinsgtoke Gazette about derogatory wording chalked at the car park entrance.

So off in support we went on a wet Monday lunchtime and found it behind the Gillies Health Centre and next to West Basingstoke Baptist Church on Sullivan Road in Brighton Hill.

Set up as a charity seven years ago as a community café to provide training for young adults with learning difficulties they have twenty people on their books going through a minimum two years programme that builds confidence and life skills that will benefit them as they progress through adulthood. Some work now in the café at Waitrose and at Sainsbury's Kempstott.

There are two full time staff, ex hotel manager Carl Manners is in daily charge ably assisted by Denny. She joined on the interesting date of 11.11.11. within a couple of weeks from its opening. They average 60 meals each of the weekdays they are open. There are also other mature volunteers that ensure food is cooked for individual orders from an extensive varied menu. From soups and starters through all style of sandwiches, baguettes, panninis, baked potatoes and sweets. All types of non-alcoholic beverages are on offer and Madam had Earl Grey tea while I had a diet Pepsi.

I was peckish so had a potato and leek soup with half a baguette followed by panninis for both of us. Mine was Coronation chicken and Madam had tuna melt. The fact today they were in fact made from baguettes did not deter from their enjoyment.

The café also produces the sandwiches and snacks for meetings held at the Basingstoke & Deane council offices which provides a regular income. Our total bill came to a very attractive figure of only \pounds 14.20.

Worth going? Certainly. And we shall go again.

For those of us, who are in the autumn of our lives it's a good time to consider whether we have led fruitful lives – have we made a difference and are going to leave a good legacy behind? It is also the perfect time to give thanks to God that we have experienced many peaceful years in our land and have known times of innocence and freedom in our childhood the like of which our children and grandchildren may never know. We have seen awesome changes in our world such as space travel and an amazing and rapid growth in technology. During life's autumn, we have a broader perspective and can count more blessing than ever which we can share with our children and grandchildren.

As Christians, we know God does not change He remains always dependable and loving. His truth, ways, and purposes do not change. Jesus Christ, His Son, does not change. *"He is the same yesterday, today, and forever" (Hebrews 13:8).*

COUNCILLOR'S UPDATE

BEGGARWOOD SURGERY:

No updates at present although at time of writing I am awaiting confirmation of a meeting with the CCG to discuss.

ANAEROBIC DIGESTER: Hampshire County Council have received an application from Biogen, the new operators of the Anaerobic Digester in Garlic Lane, to make permanent the increase in HGV traffic from the temporary permission which was granted last year. POWERLEAGUE: Many local residents have expressed concern about the potential loss of this facility following the problems with the operating company. I understand that positive moves have been made to identify a potential new operator, and it is clear that BDBC, HCC and Brighton Hill school all understand the value of the facility to the area and are working to find a solution.

POST OFFICE CONSULTATION: The Post office has announced the wish to move the central post office facility at the Top of Town to a concession within WH Smiths at the Malls. If anyone has any thoughts or comments on this, please let me know so that I can feed that back into the consultation.

BROADMERE RD: The Highways Director at HCC has informed me that agreement with developers to finally adopt part of Broadmere Rd is now with the legal teams drawing upon an agreement. This is certainly not before time. Unfortunately this will not be the whole of Broadmere which is adopted immediately, there is apparently an issue over ownership of some drainage channels in part of the road, but it should cover the part which includes the entrances into Candover Court and the shops/ surgeries area. Once finalised, this should mean that we can look at getting some parking restrictions in place as this seems to be becoming an increasingly difficult and busy entrance to navigate.




