SWAG SNIPPETS

There was a good turnout at the various public consultations on the proposals for Brighton Hill Roundabout held in early September. HCC's preferred option involves the closure of the Western Way access to reduce the number of arms entering the roundabout and the widening of the gyratory itself to make four lanes all the way round. This would reduce the size of the green space in the middle but retain the underpasses. https://www.hants. gov.uk/transport/transportschemes/a30brightonhillroundabout

HCC is promising to carry out work at Kempshott and Hatch Warren roundabouts as well. That will probably involve still more traffic lights!

SWAG is fortunate to have a hard working representative on the Liaison Committee for the Anoerobic Digester. The Liaison Committee is working with the Biogen plant manager to overhaul the highway signage to ensure that the 44 tonne juggernauts visiting the plant can safely navigate their way through the Hatch Warren estate. A number of arriving HGVs are still entering Woodbury Road during the exclusion time (before 7AM). We have requested that HCC move the automatic cameras to the Kempshott Roundabout to record offenders but HCC is reluctant to take action. We hope our local councillors will help to get the cameras moved to a more meaningful location than their current siting half way along Woodbury Road. Odour complaints from the residents of Kennel Farm settlement continue to occur at regular intervals.

The planning appeal for a major site of 40 dwellings in **Cliddesden** (BDBC planning reference 16/04690/FUL) is set to take place at the Council Offices on 9th and 10th October starting at 10.00 a.m.

The latest on the Hounsome Fields development is that an application has been submitted for a construction access on the A30 Finally, come to **SWAG's AGM** on Saturday 17th November at 3.00 p.m. to be held in Old Down Hall. We would love to welcome at the very top of the site, opposite the entrance to Basingstoke Golf Club (BDBC planning reference 18/02443/FUL). The obvious issue new members and anyone who would like to become a member here is the danger of slow moving HGVs attempting to exit the site of our committee.

- and then turn across the A30 to travel back towards the motorway. SWAG has submitted comprehensive and detailed comments on the July modifications to the plans for Manydown. You can see these in full under planning reference 17/00818/OUT. SWAG believes that the modifications still do not address sufficiently the sewerage and transport impacts. Here is a summary of our criticisms.
- Inadeguacy of the evaluation of the visual impact of the development on residential areas to the south west
- · Lack of a sense of identity as part of the built form to counteract the development being simply an extension of urban sprawl
- Inadequacy of proper planning for the foul drainage infrastructure and mitigation of the risks of flooding
- Inadequacy of the transport and travel plans, especially in the areas of
- Cycling infrastructure
- Likelihood of severe traffic congestion at key junctions especially Fiveways
- Lack of any examination of the potential for rat running as a result of the congestion especially along the narrow road from Oakley to Junction 7 of the M3 known as Trenchards Lane. We hope that Oakley residents are ready for this!
- Failure to propose any realisable and measurable policies that will drive modal shift. Such modal shift is absolutely essential, as the TA appears to show that this development will result in the total gridlock of the road system to the west of the town.

November sees the centenary of the end of the Great War, the war to end all wars in which the dead from British and Empire forces reached 1,244,000 with more than another 2,000,000 wounded. Many have travelled to see the battlefields to gain a sense of what their forefathers endured during this appalling period in history which cost the lives of nearly 20,000,000 and 23,500,000 injured from all sides over four years.

Even on the morning of 11th November 1918, 853 Allies and 3000 Americans were killed or wounded before the cease fire at 11.00 am.

As well as seeing evidence of trench warfare, visitors have seen the War graves, those silent battalions who lie in such tranquillity. Fewer people realise how these outstanding scenes came about and who were responsible for those temples of serenity so admired today.

Rhydian Vaughan, who is Vice President of the Bramley Royal British Legion, has been Battlefield Guiding since 2000 with eclectic groups, large and small, old and young. Passion is his driving force and bringing history to life: his strap line is "Without a passionate Guide a battlefield is just a field."

The Probus Club of Basingstoke was enlightened to hear about how Sir Fabian Ware, who at 45 was too old to enlist, was, in 1915, leading a Red Cross unit in France. He recognised that no system or process existed for registering the dead who were buried in unconstructed graves near to where they fell. He anticipated future concerns would be expressed by a grateful nation at the lack of respect for the men who had made the ultimate sacrifice. Well connected he was able to influence the establishment of the Graves Registration and Enguiries Commission so early in the war.

By 1917 significant progress had been made and the organisation was renamed the Imperial War Graves Commission. Rather than repatriate the dead it was considered better that they were looked after in local cemeteries in individual graves. Until this time the war dead were often interred in mass graves. It set about planning for the creation of hundreds of cemeteries across all the countries where conflict had occurred.

It was felt that because the sacrifice had been in common, the memorial should be in common also. Whatever their military rank or position in civil life, they should have equal treatment in their graves. This brought about considerable consternation that families could not repatriate their loved ones for private memorials to be constructed.

Three great British architects were selected to lead the artistic interpretation necessary to overcome this antipathy. They were Lutyens, Blomfield and Baker, who headed up teams of younger architects. The teams would be men who had served and would understand the solemnity needed to carry out this task.

The Commission decided that the headstone would be a uniform height of 2 feet 6 inches and 1 foot 3 inches wide and made of white Portland stone. Simple inscriptions would contain the name, rank, number and date killed while regimental symbols allowed for some variation. Each team was responsible for subtle design differences between sites while conforming to the brief of creating the inspiring formation of headstones, memorials and buildings to be seen today.

The memorials have the inscribed names of around half a million missing who have no known grave. These include the famous Thiepval Memorial on the Somme and the Menin Gate, Ypres, where tonight, as on every night at 8.00 pm, buglers from the local Fire Brigade play The Last Post.

Kew Gardens had input on the style of the ground work of the cemeteries. It was decided that the individual headstones should appear to be set on flat turf rather than individual mounds. The garden designer Gertrude leckyll, was part of the committee as was the poet and writer Rudyard Kipling whose only son was killed in the war.

The Imperial War Graves Commission is today called the Commonwealth War Graves Commission whose headquarters are in Maidenhead. Regional offices are France, Belgium, Cyprus, Canada, Australia, New Zealand and South Africa. They have research facilities that aid investigation by families making enquiries about the burial site of relatives who lost their lives in the service of this country.

ARE CHANGES TO THE DIVORCE PROCESS ON THE HORIZON?

Following a high-profile case earlier this year and many petitions, it has been announced that the Government are preparing a consultation on the introduction of a "no fault divorce".

Currently, under the Matrimonial Causes Act 1973 in England and Wales, anyone seeking a divorce must either prove their spouse is at fault through adultery, desertion or unreasonable behaviour, or alternatively if both sides agree, they can part after two years of separation. In the absence of consent or evidence of fault, applicants must wait until they have been living apart for five years.

Concerns relating to the current divorce process have been highlighted by Resolution, who have been

campaigning for a number of years for the Government to focus on and make changes to the outdated and ill-fitting divorce process. The process that is offered currently can lead to conflict, and can create difficulty in reaching a mutually acceptable agreement in relation to the finances or the arrangements for the children.

Our family team experts back the consultation, as it can be clearly recognised in our client base that there is a demand for an amicable and pragmatic way forward, as offered by a "no fault" approach.



OLD DOWN AND BEGGARWOOD WILDLIFE GROUP

Hopefully now that Autumn is here more bird species will be seen on Old Down and Beggarwood as many species are now migrating through on their way south to warmer climes, even as far as Africa - such species as Swallows, House Martins and Flycatchers. And some species will be migrating to the South of England from the North such as Fieldfare and Redwing. In the first week of September two pairs of Spotted Flycatchers were seen over the wooded belt at the top of Old Down. This was a very pleasing and rare sighting. As the name suggests, they eat insects (see photo) and mostly catch them in the air. The number of birds recorded so far this year on Old Down has been

down on previous years - not sure if this is because of the cold spring and hot summer or the disturbance caused by the adjoining housing development. It is hoped that as Autumn progresses we may see some unusual species such as Siskin, Redpoll and Brambling but these would be dream sightings for the two sites.

It was lovely to welcome back our older children and our new children have settled in fantastically! The start of a brand new term can be a difficult time for young children and the first few weeks of settling into a new environment is a time of crucial importance to a child's later happiness within a setting. Our first few weeks are always about settling in and helping our children make new friends and get to know staff. All children are individuals, and while some children will adjust fairly easily and quickly to a new environment and new routines, others will take longer to feel comfortable and secure. 




