MERRY CHRISTMAS FROM HATCH WARREN BEGGARWOOD CYCLING CLUB

I can't believe it's that time of year again, Xmas is here and 2019 is round the corner:

At HWBCC we've had a brilliant year, we celebrated our 3rd birthday, and our membership continues to grow with us now at over 170 cyclists, & rides happening 2 or 3 times a week every week, all year round.

Our membership is open to cyclists of all abilities and we are passionate about helping everyone to reach their goals, whether that be getting on a bike for the first time in years, to cycling a few miles or climbing the tallest mountains or the longest distances.

Normally people look back and do a review

of 2018, but we thought we'd tell you about our plans for December 2018 and into the first part of 2019 and how you can get involved.

Well December we've got our HWBCC Xmas party, so not strictly speaking cycling related, during this event 100 of us will pull on our glad rags and dance, eat, and maybe have a drink or 2!...

We also have our now legendary Xmas rides... have you ever seen Santa riding a bike? Well you will! Fancy coming along? Break out the fancy dress and join us on the 22nd December.

In January, everyone will realise how the excesses of Xmas have affected them, and they'll start to plan for the year... the first few

SWAG SNIPPETS (South West Action Group)

The planning application for the relaxation of transport conditions for the **Anaerobic Digester** in Garlic Lane is now being considered by HCC. See BDBC reference 17/01876/CMA and HCC reference 18/03001/CMA. The operator wants the increase in vehicle movements which has been in place for two years to be made permanent. SWAG has objected strongly to this. We believe that only by a continuing reassessment of all the conditions associated with the planning permission for this Plant can we be sure that they will be monitored and enforced. Food waste is brought in and digestate taken out by HGVs travelling long distances and accessing the plant along residential streets. We have proposed further restrictions on the hours that HGVs can travel along Woodbury Road and that the number of movements should be reduced.

The latest on the **Hounsome Fields**. The application for a construction access on the A30 at the top of the site (BDBC planning reference 18/02443/FUL) is on hold : Hampshire Highways asked for more information on vehicle movements and safety. Traffic counters were installed for a week on the A30 and we await the outcome from these measurements.

No more news on the proposed Gypsy and Traveller pitches but a planning application has been submitted for the detailed design and layout of the first 96 dwellings in this 750 dwelling estate (BDBC reference 18/02513/RES). These houses are to be built at the top of the site, opposite the Golf Club entrance. SWAG and Dummer Parish Council will be meeting the planning officers to make sure the requirements of the outline planning permission have been carried through into this detailed application. We will also be looking for the outcomes of the archaeological investigations that were carried out earlier this year.



months are all about getting people out on their bikes and riding, sadly the weather isn't great in Jan & Feb, but we all come together and push each other to get out there... you never know we may accidentally fall into a cafe for cake, and to keep warm!

There are 2 big events that we attend each year, during April we take a group of people to somewhere in Europe for one of the Cycling Classics, and in May we take a large percentage of our membership to the Isle of Wight to cycle around the Island during the Bank Holiday weekend.. Last year over 50 of us crossed to the Island.

Each week we have 2 or 3 rides, from rides with distances between 8 & 50 miles, and we welcome anyone over 18 years of age as long as they have a bike and a helmet!

Even if you haven't been on a bike for years, please come along and ride with us!

Did you know? Women represent over 20% of our club membership and that percentage is increasing every year.

SWAG is still very concerned about the proposed location of the primary school and nursery adjacent to the new roundabout on the A30. In October the Royal College of Paediatrics and Child Health called for a ban on the building of playgrounds, schools and nurseries in pollution hotspots. The outputs from the traffic counters will be relevant to this.

We have heard that a proposal will be put to the members of **Basingstoke Golf Club** in late November for the sale of the current Course to a developer and the purchase of a nearby Golf Course. The existing site is in the Local Plan for a major development of 1,000 houses. The proposal envisages planning consent by 2020.

Over 200 people attended a meeting in Micheldever about the proposal to build a "new town" of **6,000 dwellings at Micheldever** near Blackwood forest which would have far reaching consequences for the south west of Basingstoke and for Junction 7 of the M3. A Winchester City Councillor told the meeting that a proposal for 6,000 dwellings was far in excess of what was required as part of their Local Plan Review.

We understand there is to be a further consultation on a revised traffic and transport plan for **Manydown** before Christmas. You can watch out for these documents under planning reference 17/00818/OUT.

The deadline date for the consideration of the proposed **MSA at Junction 6** has been put back to 31st January. The applicant and Highways England are still locked in discussions on traffic volumes and junction structures. The traffic predictions for Manydown and the Leisure Park also feed into this.



PROBUS HEARS OF "SO FAR SO GOOD"



At its last meeting the Probus Club of Basingstoke was entertained by Malcolm Wells MBE with a lively, often highoctane account of three facets of his life experiences. He took the audience of retired professional and business managers through his 25 years in the army as a musician (playing cello on state occasions and at banquets), the 15 years spent as National Speaker for Canine Partners and his current role

as Ambassador for the Plymouth based charity Literacy in a Box. Throughout he offered many amusing stories, funny anecdotes and witty jokes to illustrate his colourful history in public service, and charity work as a volunteer. In 1998 he was awarded an MBE by the Queen for services to children's charities.

Malcolm wrung an amusing story out of his MBE award, normally a formal, serious occasion. At that time he was involved with setting up a new band for the Royal Electrical and Mechanical Engineers (REME) in Portsmouth. What to wear? He requested a REME uniform but none was available so his dressers produced a variety of uniform items from different regiments. In Malcolm's words he turned up at Buckingham Palace dressed 'like a Christmas tree with more regalia than Prince Charles'. But the 'fun' didn't end there as he was approached by the actress, June Whitfield, who said to him 'Excuse me, where's the ladies' room?' clearly mistaking him for a member of the Palace staff.

Army stories were in abundance and included recall of Malcolm's time as a cellist for the celebrated Royal Artillery Orchestra. He was asked to produce a programme of music for the Queen's 'Monarchs' Dinner', choosing a suitable piece for each country represented there. He struggled with Denmark but came up with 'The Ugly Duckling': at the unforeseen rendering of 'the King was in the altogether', the reaction of senior members of the British Royal Family was sheer horror, but the band agreed to keep the story quiet. Despite this, page 6 of the next day's edition of the 'Daily Mail' referred piously to the 'totally inappropriate music' played at the dinner:

On another occasion, Malcolm's band was invited to a 'march and play 'at an England v. Brazil match at Wembley which included the pre-eminent Pele. The band was instructed that pre-match it was to play the 'Match of the Day' theme music. Needless to say, the TV producers were not happy as the game was being broadcast on ITV! The evening went downhill fast as the band had not anticipated the Brazilian anthem going on 'for ever' and all subsequent programmes were severely delayed.

Malcolm recalled his time as National Speaker for Canine Partners, a charity which trains dogs to support those with a range of disabilities: they assist with a range of practical tasks and can be taught to use a washing machine! Malcolm made the point that the dogs choose their partners, not the other way round; this was illustrated by the story of Graham, a wheelchair user, who tried to 'beat the system' by positioning himself near to a black Labrador which he wanted as his partner. But the lab, wasn't playing ball and Graham ended up with Noodle the Poodle who made 'an immediate change' to his quality of life.

Malcolm ended by describing his current work as Ambassador for the Literacy in a BoxTrust which runs in partnership with the Rotary Club. This provides educational kits, each costing £325 to produce, for schools and children in Zambia and sub-Saharan Africa. Probus members were pleased to make donations to this worthwhile cause.

Hatch Warren welcomed four guest to our meeting on 1st November where we had a change to our speaker. Debbie Reavall from Basingstoke Heritage Society spoke about the 'Blue Plaques' that are put on building of historic interest around the town. It is known that Jane Austen danced until she was 21 years old at the Assembly Rooms at the Angel Inn in the Market Square which is now Barclays Bank, before she then moved to live in Bath. There is a statue of Richard Aldworth from the Blue Coat School who gave money for boys to be given an education. A plaque to George Willis who had a shop in Wrote Street and now the original front of the shop is to be seen at Milestones. Sir James Lancaster left money to form a small school by St. Michael's Church. Burberry's Emporium came in 1856 and became a large employer in the town. A plaque to Oliver Cromwell who stayed in Basingstoke at the Bell Inn. There are also plaques to be seen to Sir Harold Gillies for plastic surgery, John Attwood and John Arlott. A very informative talk that will have us all walking around to discover the origins of our town.

October saw eight members enjoy an evening at Holybourne Honey's W.I. where we tried Flamenco dancing and enjoyed lots of lovely tapas. The Autumn meeting at the Anvil saw our member Sandra Christie's entry to the Lady Denman cup competition 'The Day that Changed my Life' go through to National. There will be an outing to see the Winchester Christmas Fair and lunch for members to attend the end of November.





COUNCILLOR'S UPDATE

COMMUNITY LED PLAN: A community plan enables local residents to work together to identify the key issues affecting them, and helps to gather evidence which can be used to influence decisions by the Borough and County Council and by developers. Kempshott published its plan this year, and other areas have brought forward a community plan or are working on one. We had an attempt at this in 2015 with a public meeting but not enough people came forward to form a steering group, but with all the development going on around us, and with the new facility at Beggarwood up and running, this seems like a really good time to make another attempt at forming a group and getting a plan going. The first step will be an engagement process across with the area with various groups, leading to a meeting to discuss and set up the steering group. I will keep everyone informed of potential dates, but please let me know if you would like to know more or to be involved, support at this early stage would be great.

TRANSPORT PROBLEMS: With surgeries in the area going in to partnership there seems to be increasing problems for patients without their own transport in terms of accessing services when they have to travel to a different practice. Please contact me if you have had any difficulties in this area as this is something I am trying to feed into discussions with the CCG, the Borough Council and Stagecoach.

BINS: The new contract with Serco is underway but I have picked up some concerns/ complaints in the last couple of weeks. Please let me know if you have had any problems.

DIGESTER: Comments on the application to make permanent the increase in HGV traffic through the area have now closed, and the application is likely to go to the Hampshire County Council Regulatory Committee in January. If you have concerns about the traffic and would like to be part of the delegation attending the meeting to oppose it, please let me know. Any support would be very welcome and there is strength in numbers.

COMMUNITY LUNCH: Please come and support our Community Lunch at the lovely Beggarwood Cafe on Wednesday 5th December at 12.15pm and enjoy some festive food and a lovely, friendly atmosphere!

RESURFACING OF A30: At the time of writing there is no new date but the proposed work on the Winchester Road close to the Kempshott Roundabout was postponed from November 9th due to bad weather and will now take place overnight to reduce congestion and rat running.




