COUNCILLOR'S UPDATE

BEGGARWOOD SURGERY

I have been picking up increased concerns and complaints from patients in the last few months which has been exacerbated by the uncertainty over when the running of the surgery will be handed over to another local practice, and who this will be. At the time of writing, there has been no further detail from the CCG. At a meeting at Beggarwood Cafe last month, local patients reported their concerns over the current service and their hopes for the future direction. There may be a Facebook group for patients being set up soon, I will publicise if and when this happens.

GOLF COURSE

The sale of this site to Bloor Homes is apparently going through, and at time of writing I was waiting for confirmation of a meeting being set up for all local councillors to meet with the developer: Early engagement with the local area is vital, especially with such a huge site, and I will report back when I know more. I will be pressing the need for local people to be consulted fully at every stage.

DIGESTER

The HCC decision date on a permanent increase in HGV traffic to and from the digester through the estate has now been put back to February 13th. The meeting will take place in the morning at the Castle, Winchester and a local delegation will be attending to put the case for traffic to still be monitored

COMMUNITY/ NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN FOR HATCH WARREN AND BEGGARWOOD

A public meeting is being planned for either 2nd or 9th March at the Beggarwood Centre to inform residents about the benefits to the community of developing a locally led plan. Please pencil in the dates, one of these will

SWAG SNIPPETS (South West Action Group)

With the help of Councillors Reid we managed to get the Hampshire County Council committee meeting on the traffic for the **Anaerobic Digester** delayed until 13 February at 10.00 a.m. in the Ashburton Hall, Elizabeth II Court in the County Council offices. SWAG will be addressing the Committee. Planning reference 18/03001/CMA. Make a note in your diary to come along.

Hounsome Fields. Take a look at BDBC 18/02513/RES to see the shape of things to come and SWAG's comments. We want to see better cycle provision, clear plans for connection to the main sewer, better tree and habitat protection and, yet again, a reexamination of the proposed location of the Primary School. We are also contacting the Basingstoke Clean Air Campaign to get their help on this issue.

Basingstoke Golf Club has agreed the sale of the current Course to a developer (we understand this to be Bloor Homes). The existing site is in the Local Plan for a major development of I,000 houses. We are still pushing for a full Development Brief to be produced before outline permission is sought.

SWAG has submitted comments on Basingstoke and HCC's **Transport Strategy**. Take a look at https://www.hants.gov.uk/ basingstoketransportstrategy. We have strongly supported the idea of a Mass Transport System (MRT) with segregated and dedicated routes but we want to see this providing through routes, north/ south and east/west, not just hub and spoke routes into the town centre; for example routes from the south west that can get to the hospital without changing buses.

We still await the further consultation on a revised traffic and transport plan for ${\bf Manydown}.$ The Project Director has given



be confirmed very shortly. It is so important, especially with the pressure of development around us, that the local voice is elevated and given a platform which will enable us to influence policy and spending locally. We will need a steering group of about half a dozen people, but it is not a huge blank cheque on your time, perhaps one to two hours a month to develop the plan. Please come along to hear more and see whether you would like to contribute.

BRIGHTON HILL ROUNDABOUT

As part of the preparations on the design for the new scheme for the Brighton Hill roundabout, anyone using the roundabout overnight in late January will have noticed the coning off of lanes and approaches. This was to enable a radar survey to locate underground utilities equipment.

- Finally there have been some interesting contributions in the Letters pages of the Basingstoke Gazette on the idea of a **Western Bypass** for Basingstoke. SWAG also contributed, pointing out that Traffic Consultants who looked at this decided that there was no justification for such a bypass. We believe that the proposed MRT would be a better solution rather than building still more roads.

The interior design clearly conforms to their pleasant standard style with a range of tables, booths and banquettes for larger parties. There is something to suit most requirements.

Staff are obliging and extremely attentive. We were presented with several alternative menu cards which I thought led to some confusion. One had Monday to Friday offers but these could not be considered as it was Saturday and today's card had a reduced list of four main courses. Then there were extra side dishes and sweets to consider. As if this wasn't enough there was the large full menu containing everything they could offer.

Without doubt one of the most flavoursome I have tasted.





PROBUS HEARS ABOUT NATO

Just about everyone has heard of NATO (the North Atlantic Treaty Organisation) but very few recall that it was founded in 1948 and enlarged in 1949 to a total of 12 countries bordering the North Atlantic. It



was formed because of the perceived threat from Russia following their land blockade of West Berlin which caused the airlift to operate for eight months to ensure the western sector of the city could be supplied with everything necessary to sustain life.

The key criterion of NATO membership was that any armed attack on any member country in Europe and North America would constitute an attack on them all.



All this and much more was explained by Probus member and Basingstoke borough councillor Paul Miller who outlined his personal involvement in this international defence structure over four decades which included the cold war and then the Bosnian and Kosovo difficulties and several

other campaigns. As an officer in the RAF and then latterly as a civilian he rose within NATO eventually based at their headquarters in Belgium.

Member countries agree to assign assets in the form of military hardware and personnel to NATO and are managed in all operational roles by NATO staff. As such they have been involved in many conflict zones and incidents during this time many of which have not been reported in the free press.



With the fall of the Berlin wall in 1989 there was great excitement as other former communist countries threw off the yoke of the old USSR and embraced social change and democracy. However this brought up several concerns - would a unified Germany remain neutral and what would happen to the nuclear weapons held in

the old communist countries. It also brought up the question of whether there still existed a future need of NATO but other events only served to confirm that it was indeed still needed.

In fact today the membership has grown to 29 countries. Many newer members of NATO were originally eastern bloc countries that formed the basis of the Warsaw Pact organisation set up by Russia in response to West Germany joining NATO in 1955.

The Balkans crisis starting in 1989 which included the Bosnian and Kosovo campaigns were only as successful as they were due to the cooperation of the former communist countries of the Czech Republic, Poland and Hungary who allowed their airfields to be used by NATO forces. In return they hoped that it would create a favourable climate to their subsequent applications to join the EC.

It was complicated by the fact that the old Yugoslavia was a member of Eurocontrol which coordinated civilian air traffic which had increased considerably in recent years with tourist expansion on the Dalmation coast. The NATO air forces needed to have surveillance and operational access to this airspace and eventually ran an air campaign over 78 days involving 38,000 sorties which allowed in a multinational peacekeeping force which brought an end to ethnic cleansing.

Today NATO has become a Crisis Management organisation as its forces continue to lead the way in Kosovo, Afghanistan, in the Mediterranean and several other places including Iraq where it is carrying out training of national forces. It is also helping the African Union and in the Gulf of Aden guarding against Somali pirates. NATO is carrying out work on the European migrant crisis and has 20,000 troops in action around Europe and elsewhere.

The United Nations does not recognise NATO, only nation states, but fully appreciates the role played by this military cooperative of North American and European countries in striving to maintain peace in this troublesome world. It does however involve its organisation UNHCR, based in Geneva, to become incorporated with NATO actions in various humanitarian projects.

DIGESTER TRAFFIC

Those of you who walk your children to and from school and cross Woodbury Road, and those of you who use Woodbury Road generally, will be aware of the huge lorries and tankers that use the road to and from the anaerobic digester. You will possibly have seen the cameras down past the Danebury Road mini roundabout, that were installed after a huge amount of pressure by residents, to monitor the lorries, and which confirmed how they frequently flouted the rules on timing and routing - rules that were imposed in an attempt to protect the safety and amenity of residents. The evidence provided by the cameras was very helpful in forcing the digester operators to put pressure on the hauliers to abide by the rules.


You may therefore be interested to know that the cameras are no longer being monitored by the County Council. The Council officers have decided that the use of the cameras is "disproportionate, and cannot be justified on planning grounds, particularly as there have been no reports of accidents".

The digester operators and hauliers are fully aware that the cameras are not being monitored, and that they are therefore pretty much at liberty to ignore the rules if they choose to do so, as there will no longer be accessible independent evidence of what they do.

We might as well give up, let them do whatever they want, aided and abetted by the County Council.

OFSTED CHIEF INSPECTOR AMANDA SPIELMAN VISITS BCOT'S 'OUTSTANDING' NURSERY

Keen to see an 'Outstanding' college nursery in action, the head of Ofsted, Amanda Spielman paid a visit to Basingstoke College of Technology (BCoT) this week. Hosted by BCoT Principal Anthony Bravo and meeting with Nursery Manager Rebecca Pickles and Fiona Dicks, Course Director for Health Care and Early Years, Ms Spielman said: "It's always a pleasure to see the providers that Ofsted inspects in action, especially when, like this one, they are doing really well for their children. The enthusiasm and dedication of staff is plain to see, and it's clear that the nursery has really high aspirations for all of its children. It also provides a hugely valuable service to the young adults attending the college, allowing them to continue their own education."

Not only does the BCoT Nursery offer exceptional care and outcomes, it also plays a pivotal role in the Early Years and Health and Social Care curriculum. Students

studying on these courses have the opportunity to do both work placements and work experience in the setting, spending time and undertaking activities with children across the nursery age range. Students from other colleges and a number of universities including the University of Reading, Kingston University and the University of Winchester, also seek to complete their placements at the nursery.

Commenting on the significance of the visit and the role the nursery plays at BCoT, Principal Anthony Bravo said: "We are very proud that Ms Spielman selected our college to explore her interest in the wider benefits an outstanding nursery can bring to both the children in its care and the students studying here at BCoT. The nursery is not a stand-alone provision on the periphery of the college, it is very much integrated within our community and the successful delivery of key aspects of our curriculum."

Providing the perfect backdrop some Early Years lessons are held within a classroom in the nursery and there is also the opportunity for students to practice their observations and implement lesson plans with the children. Drawing on the expertise

LOCAL DOG LOVERS' SOLUTION TO MODERN DAY LONELINESS

Volunteer dog cuddling is being offered by Barking Mad Basingstoke as an antidote to the problem of loneliness in modern society. For those who are retired or work from home and are spending large chunks of time alone, caring for a waggytailed companion on a temporary basis and meeting other likeminded dog lovers could really help to overcome feelings of isolation.

The perception of loneliness as mainly an issue for the older generation is now proving inaccurate, as a study from the Office for National Statistics suggests that young adults are more likely to feel lonely than older age groups. Due to huge advances in technology, the number of freelancers and remote workers is rising, with an article in Business Leader claiming that a 'third of business owners think that workforce will work remotely by 2020.'



Sam Walker of Barking Mad Basingstoke said,

"Whilst remote working has obvious advantages, working alone under pressure and not having the physical presence of a team to support you can lead to loneliness that can't be fixed by any kind of app. Caring for a friendly dog not only provides canine cuddles (far better than any virtual hug) but also the motivation to go and take a walk at lunchtime, increasing the likelihood of adhering to New Year fitness resolutions." 


