SWAG SNIPPETS (South West Action Group)

The Hampshire County Council committee meeting on the traffic for the Anaerobic Digester was scheduled for 20th March in Winchester with an Officer recommendation for approval. Despite some important concessions from the applicant on the exclusion times for vehicles using Woodbury Road to enhance the protection of school children, SWAG was pushing for further restrictions on the number of vehicle movements per operational day. You can see the revised proposals from the operator on HCC planning website reference 18/03001/CMA.

Hounsome Fields. Take a look at BDBC 18/02513/RES to see the shape of things to come and SWAG's comments. SWAG is still pressing for the location of the primary school and nursery to be re-assessed to avoid it being located immediately next to the A30. Basingstoke Environmental Health is still insisting that despite the expectation that concentrations of NO2 at the roadside will be well above legal limits they will be perfectly acceptable for our children in the school buildings just 30 metres away because of the "open nature of the location"!

Basingstoke Golf Club. Bloor Homes and the board of the Golf Club are still trying to short cut the planning process by aiming to submit an outline planning application before the end of March. SWAG is lobbying for a Masterplan/Development Brief to be consulted on before a planning application is considered. This is what is required by the policies of the Local Plan. There are many infrastructure issues to be considered for these two major housing developments astride the A30.

Bloor Homes held an exhibition of concept plans at the beginning of March. Three unexpected elements were included: an increase in density from the 1,000 dwellings in the Local Plan to 1,100 and a second road access junction near the existing Golf Club entrance accessible from all directions as well as a signalised junction as an alternative to the proposed roundabout. This will potentially lead to no less than 5 sets of traffic lights between the M3 and the Wallop Drive roundabout!

SWAG is increasingly concerned about the dangers for children crossing a very congested A30 from an enlarged Golf Course development to the primary school on Hounsome Fields.

A decision on the outline planning application for up to 3,520 dwellings on Manydown is expected in the next couple of months. You can see planning documents under reference 17/00818/OUT.

We may see further decisions on the MSA at Junction 6 shortly.

COUNCILLOR'S UPDATE

Anaerobic Digester: At the time of writing I was about to go to HCC's Regulatory Committee with SWAG to speak against the application from Biogen to increase the potential number of HGV movements to the digester to 38. We had negotiated a longer window for the school run curfew, but this volume of HGV traffic is far too high. I will update everyone on the outcome but this is of especial concern following the accident on Woodbury Rd between a school student and a car last week, which could have been far worse had the vehicle been an HGV

Community Plan: There was a really good turnout for the Community Plan meeting at Beggarwood Cafe last month and a number of local residents expressed interest in being part of the planning group. Here's hoping we can get this up and running.

Golf Course: At time of writing we were waiting for the Outline Planning Application for the Golf Course development to come in. Bloor Homes had stated their intention to submit by March 29th, I will be opposing on the grounds that not enough time and consultation has been undertaken for a development of this size. It is vital that local people have their say - once the application is published you will be able to comment and SWAG are working on some easy steps to assist. Please follow the SWAG Facebook page or my Gazette Column to keep up to date. There will also be a Supplementary Planning Document produced by the Borough Council which will go to Committee in June and Full council in the autumn and should specify how the development will look. Again, it is hugely important that residents feed into this process so SWAG and I will be flagging up how to do this.

Beggarwood Surgery: The CCG has announced that they have an agreement with Cedar medical that the contract Cedar have to operate the Beggarwood Surgery will be terminated six months from 8th March. Discussions with other potential providers continue and the CGG say that they are providing additional resource to Beggarwood to ensure that patients are able to access care. Patients can also use the evening and weekend GP services provided by Acorn Partnership. Please let me know if you have any further concerns or problems.



The waiter took our drinks order while we studied the menus. Half a pint of San Miguel lager for me while Madam had her usual large slimline tonic with ice and a slice. The "5 for £5" was clearly popular with five main courses from the lunch menu on offer for £5.00. Although there were other choices costing a little more it was obvious looking at what other diners had selected that the quarter pound beef burger, 5 oz Gammon steak, beer battered cod, halloumi hand made chips and open chicken sandwiches all with either triple

fried chips or skinny fries and another vegetable were all the rage.

As it happened, Madam had a 7oz Topside minute steak –

medium rare as they are on the thin side – which came with half a large tomato, skinny fries and lambs lettuce. She said it was very enjoyable.

I had beer battered haddock (they had run out of cod) but this came with an upcharge. However it was so big it hung over both sides of the large plate. Triple cooked chips, mushy peas and a small ramekin of tartare sauce completed the dish. The fish was very fresh although I thought the batter was very dark on the skin side as if it had been in the fryer for a fraction too long. It was, though, very tasty.

One could have either a starter or pudding for £2.79 although from the lunch menu. There were eleven other puddings on offer but in price range £4.19 - £5.79. Madam had a mini pudding with a medium sized cup of skinny cappuccino Costa coffee and I had caramel apple Betty which came with a small jug of custard.

The bill came to £25.06 which we both considered very good value for money. And the food was very acceptable. I don't think it will years before we go again.

It's recommended that you purchase signal blocking pouches to keep all your keys safe from this type of hacking. Keeping them in the microwave will also work.

Not only is it distressing and a violation to those experiencing this type of crime, it can also have wider reaching consequences causing various insurance costs to rise for all occupants in the surrounding areas.

Letter... to the editor

I have read with interest an article in the Basingstoke Gazette dated 27th February: Hatch Warren school joins in battle to improve our air quality

The article is about a programme run by Hampshire County Council to help educate young people about the importance of good air quality and the practical steps that can be taken to improve it. It also tells how St Mark's Primary School is getting involved and participating to the scheme.

As a resident of Highwood Ridge, plagued by traffic of parents' cars during the school run hours, I can only welcome such activities and fully support the effort of St Mark's Primary School to raise awareness among its pupils to the air quality around their school.

I have myself become resigned to the fact that the cars invading my street seem to be unavoidable, which is sad enough. However, I strongly oppose parents leaving their engines running while waiting, spreading exhaust fumes which are then inhaled by school children and residents alike... When I'm really fed up, I sometimes knock on their windows and ask them to switch off their engines: most do, some don't. Among others I remember a father wearing shorts early February explaining to me that it was too cold to switch his engine off, which really made me cross.

The Gazette article gives me hope that things might be moving at last in our street and in Basingstoke. I encourage the pupils of St Mark's in their activities and I believe that they are fully capable of having an impact on parents and changing behaviours.

There are many ways of action, as an article from the BBC web site showed me this morning: it relates how primary school children in Greater Manchester have taken to patrol the streets around their school and hand out fake parking tickets to parents who leave their engines running or park on yellow lines. Reading this article actually prompted me to write this message. I shall follow with interest the progress of St Mark's pupils and want to thank St Mark's school for their involvement.

At HWBCC we are a social club that is inclusive to all, we are proud of all our members and love to hear how they came to join the club, and their stories so far, so every few months we are going to try and share those stories with you in the hope that it inspires you to come and ride with us in the future.

This is Lizzie's story....

Having joined the club at the beginning of August I immediately knew that I had chosen my next sport well, when I realised you could chat and exercise at the same time! Being a former competitive swimmer, this was a big change, you can't really chat when you are under water! I also couldn't believe how much of Basingstoke I didn't know, having grown up in the town, I was amazed at all the beautiful villages that surround it and the lovely country lanes that are there to explore, along with all

I jumped straight in with the 20 miles at 13mph average speed and soon caught the cycling bug. Having already completed the London Marathon, I was soon convinced that Prudential Ride London-Surrey 100 on Sunday 4th August, was my next challenge. I, along with many others in the club, entered the ballot. At the beginning of February all members were checking their post for either the 'Congratulations' 'Commiserations' magazine. Unfortunately I received the latter. Now, half of me was thinking thank goodness as I'm not sure I'm ready for it, but the other half was Lizzie with her sister Melissa who lost her battle downhearted. This sportive would with Cystic Fibrosis in 2008 at the age of 21 send me on my way to completing

the London Classics: the medal awarded to finishers of the London Marathon, Ride London and Swim Serpentine. My disappointment grew, so I knew I had to get a place with a charity to not miss out... and I got one!

Unfortunately, in 2008, I lost my sister, Melissa, to Cystic Fibrosis, a generic disease that affects the body organs, in particular the lungs. Thanks to amazing family members, friends and work colleagues, I was able to raise over £7000 when I completed the marathon, so I can only hope that I raise half that amount this time. In memory of my sister, and having this tremendous backing, will give me huge inspiration to tackle those Surrey Hills, which include Box and Leith Hill, part of the Olympic Road Race in London 2012.

The club has also introduced me to the new man in my life, who is also doing RL100 for the same charity. He has already had me in hard training in the Cotswolds whilst we were supposed to be on holiday! I'm not

sure that he is the right trainer though as he thinks 100 miles is just a spin round the park after cycling around the M25 and 200+ miler last year. I will give that one a miss for now! Simon has entered the Fred Whitton Challenge which is 112 miles up and down the massive hills in the Lake District. I will watch and support.

DO I NEED A BUSINESS LASTING POWER OF ATTORNEY?

As a business owner if you become mentally incapacitated tomorrow then who would pay your bills or invoices, ensure staff salaries are paid and complete any outstanding work for your customers and clients?

You cannot assume that a colleague or family member will be able to gain the relevant authority to make decisions on your behalf.

Therefore, to protect your business interests, particularly if you are a sole trader or self-employed, you ought to consider a Business Lasting Power of Attorney.

This is a legal document that allows you to nominate people to make decisions on your behalf if you were ever become incapacitated.

Lasting Powers of Attorney (LPAs) do not only cover personal assets but may also cover business assets and interests in a business. As a business owner it may be in your best interests to review your affairs and look to put in place a Business LPA to cover the situation, not only if you were mentally incapacitated, but if you were abroad on holiday or on business, or if you were to have an accident and were unable to attend meetings.

What happens if I don't make an LPA?

If you have not made a Business LPA and you subsequently lose the capacity to make your own decisions or become of unsound mind, then, if you do not have other arrangements in place (such as partnership agreement or articles of association), it may be necessary for someone to apply to the Court of Protection for a Deputyship order. This process can take between six to 12 months to complete and can be expensive. The appointed Deputy may not be who you would have appointed as your attorney.

PROBUS HEARS IT'S IMPORTANT TO HAVE A HOBBY

It is received wisdom that following retirement it is important to keep both physical and mental capabilities in good working order. There are plenty of things that people can find to occupy their minds if they are not into visiting a gym on a regular basis.

Alan May has a boyish enthusiasm for filling his life with interesting pastimes. He outlined his hobbies to fellow members of the Probus Club of Basingstoke, the social club for male retired professional and business managers. While he plays golf once a month and with his wife regularly enjoys ballroom dancing he has several cerebral interests, one being very unconventional.

For many years attendees at the Probus Club Spring Ladies' lunches and Christmas Dinners have been entertained by the pictorial and brain teaser quizzes he has compiled, many details of which concern Basingstoke and its environs. Clearly his interest in crossword puzzles comes to the fore.

An interest in genealogy over time has thrown up many interesting facts. His wife

has Belgian parentage so he produced family trees of his Belgian in laws with the family name of Faes going back to the mid 1700s in Watou near the



Belgian/French border. They have seen on a WWI memorial and the graves of three brothers, George, Gaston and Jerome Faes, who were on his wife's family tree. In 2018 Alan and his wife were invited by the Belgian local council to the naming ceremony of a road commemorating the three Faes brothers.

Another branch of his wife's family lived on the outskirts of Brussels. During WW2 her little cousin Fifi was often asked by her mother to deliver messages to different people. After the war she discovered her mother had hidden British soldiers in the attic. The messages were to get the soldiers moved further down the resistance line and back to England. Very much like the television series "Allo Allo".

He traced his mother's side back to the I 600s in Gloucestershire and their travels

through railway service to Swindon and thence on to London and eventually Dover. As a man of Kent he traced his father's family back to the late 1700s. In the 1930s an uncle had a pleasure boat near Deal. Sometimes at night the boat picked up contraband which was then buried in the garden.

"Although his civic duty included being a member of the Lifeboat crew ", Alan explained "but inexplicitly he refused to go to Dunkirk with the small boats to rescue the British troops from the beaches."

A 1959 GCE "O" level in Art has been put to good use in retirement when Alan bought a set of water colours. In the U3A he has progressed from Beginners to Improvers and concentrates on flowers and birds. His paintings on display were to a very high standard.



"I enjoy the peace and quiet together with the calming effect and is very relaxing. You meet others who are always willing to help and comment."

This artistic bent comes in useful with his "secret hobby" of Cross Stitch. Usually a female pastime his wife taught him to such a degree that he featured in the Cross Stitch magazine. As a



regular cruiser he can often be found in the ships' lounges with a small design.

"I get a few raised eyebrows but I am too old to worry what people think. I bet they can't do it."

Alan is an inspirational example following the advice that people should get out of their comfort zone and try something new.

Using different scenarios he illustrated the effects of not making a will; when making one having it done in the correct manner; the levels of inheritance tax which would apply and how planning in advance would lessen the burden on those left to administer an estate. He covered the different types of property ownership available - joint, tenants-incommon and, depending on individual circumstances, - the setting up of a trust, and he explained how these would affect who gained an inheritance. In finishing he spoke about Power of Attorney and how having a funeral plan could guard against future rising costs. Following a question and answer session he spent some time seeing people on a personal basis.



SPIRITUALLY SPEAKING

Only last week, I was admiring an array of beautiful daffodils, crocuses, snowdrops, heathers and hellebore in my garden. The birds were starting to build their nests; the sun was shining and I thought 'All's well with the world'. Today, the March gales came and shook the trees, shrubs and flowers to within an inch of their lives, then departed via the hole in my fence where the gale had forced out a sturdy panel in its haste to move on. I'm hoping the old adage 'March comes in like a lion and goes out like a lamb' will be fulfilled, so that I can sort out the debris and broken twigs left in the storm's wake. **Holy Week**, for Christians, is rather like this old adage.

On Palm Sunday, all four Gospel writers record how Christ rode a donkey, in triumph, into Jerusalem to the cheering and rejoicing of the crowds of people who had come there to celebrate the Passover. (Jews celebrate Passover as a commemoration of their liberation by God from slavery in ancient Egypt and their freedom as a nation under the leadership of Moses). There was a truly festive atmosphere. The crowds throw down their coats and palm branches before Christ, the King of Kings. Shouts of "Hosanna" and "Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord", fill the air. All seemed well in their world on this day.

But not everyone was full of festive joy. How little the people knew. They couldn't sense the brewing storm and neither did Jesus' disciples. During the next eventful week, they would be shocked to see the storm of betrayal and violence that was to follow.

Thursday comes – Passover day. That evening Jesus shares a Passover meal with his twelve chosen friends – knowing that

one of them (Judas) would betray him that night. After the betrayal, Jesus is led away to face an illegal 'mock trial' where Jesus is found guilty of Blasphemy. Jesus' friends – afraid for their lives – have deserted him.

Good Friday - Pontius Pilate condemns Jesus to the most cruel and barbaric of deaths — crucifixion. The sun disappears from view and the skies turn black. Jesus dies. Jesus went 'like a lamb to the slaughter'. He was the sacrificial lamb! He took upon himself the punishment for our sins and misdemeanours. He died for everyone.

Good News – Easter Sunday – Jesus rises from death to life. A sign of hope for each of us, that we too will rise one day and live forever with Him in His Heavenly Kingdom. Alllelulia.






SCOUTS

An excellent weekend of activities and adventure all round!






