COUNCILLOR'S UPDATE

GOLF COURSE

Local residents will have two opportunities to hear in public the proposals for the development of the Golf Course. The Council's own Supplementary Planning Document, which is supposed to shape the development and be considered by the developers in their application, as well as act as a measure for the Planning Committee, is planned to come to the full council meeting on 17th October. Residents may attend and could speak in the form of a question at the beginning of the meeting, if this question is submitted early through Democratic Services.

The actual planning application is now likely to come to the Council's Development Control Committee in early December, to be confirmed. Residents may attend the meeting and may speak at it if they notify Democratic Services in advance. It is clear from local social media platforms and also from my inbox that this application has raised many concerns and comments, but the Development Control Committee is the only real chance for local people to make their voices heard, it is therefore vital that people attend the meeting if they feel they have points to raise. If anyone needs any help registering to speak or wants to attend without speaking please let me know and I can advise.

BEGGARWOOD SURGERY

The surgery has separated from Rooksdown Practice and is now under the management of North Hampshire Urgent Care, an organisation of local GPs and practitioners which has run the out of hours service in Basingstoke and Fleet for some time. NHUC are a not for profit organisation, and are keen to improve services at the surgery and make it a real community hub. They have the support of the local community as they work to re-establish Beggarwood Surgery and make big improvements. There may well be teething problems along the way. But having met with the NHUC leads I feel very positive about the future of the practice.

COMMUNITY PLAN GROUP

The group has been meeting regularly for some time now but there is still opportunity for any local people to join in and help shape the plan for Hatch Warren and Beggarwood. Let me know if you are interested and I can pass on details.

BROADMERE/BEGGARWOOD LANE

At time of writing there was still no update from HCC as to the negotiations with Taylor Wimpey to adopt Broadmere. As anyone using the shops/surgeries/nursery/community centre will know, the corner there is highly difficult due to unregulated parking and the siting of a bus stop very close to the crossing island. There have been a number of near misses and it is vital that HCC addresses this before a near miss becomes something far worse. The traffic calming close to the new development at the Island Site was removed due to the building work and entrance going in there, so it would make sense for HCC to reconsider the alignment of the bus stop/crossing island by Broadmere in the light of the new developments also.

COMMUNITY SPEEDWATCH

Some time ago I explored the possibility of setting up a community speed watch campaign in Beggarwood due to concerns around speeding there. Unfortunately we could not quite muster the required number of volunteers. Incidents of dangerous speeding continue around both Hatch Warren and Beggarwood, so perhaps now is the right time to try again to put some teams together? Please let me know if you would be interested.

RESTAURANT REVIEW

BARTONS MILL PUB & RESTAURANT Old Basing RG24 8AE

It's not often that you come across such a delightful watering hole such as this situated as it is on the bank of the River Loddon in Old Basing. It comes complete with a small lake with ducks wandering around the lawn bedecked with picnic tables for al fresco dining. There were plenty of people outside enjoying the early autumn sunshine but we decided to have lunch inside this converted water mill.

It didn't take long for our eyes to get used to the gloom which after a few minutes just seemed to evaporate and we studied the extensive menu without any trouble. The large main bar area had tables and chairs aplenty and there is another dining room with an outside terrace with half a dozen tables with umbrellas to protect diners from nice weather.

These days they offer accommodation with twelve bedrooms available in an adjacent low building and they even have a wedding licence. We noticed when parking that there is an outside shack that can provide more simple food for those that do not want the traditional pub type fare.

Madam decided that she fancied two dishes from the starter menu rather than anything for a main course. So up came some leek and potato soup with a white and brown roll and a full plate of

aubergine salad which met with complete satisfaction. Me, being a traditionalist, had the steak and ale pie with mash, peas, carrots and very tasty gravy. Puddings selected were a tropical Pavlova with mango, pineapple, kiwi cream and frozen yoghurt while I had a dish containing eleven Profiterols with warm chocolate sauce. And very nice they were too.

We had our usual drinks of a bottle of diet Fevertree tonic with ice and a slice for Madam and a pint of Amstel lager for me. We didn't bother with coffee but could see that those that did were presented with a tray with crockery and a coffee pot which seemed a nice touch.

Was it expensive? Well these days it is rare to find low cost food that is very satisfactory so at a total of £47.00 the cost matched the good quality and ambiance we had enjoyed. Their full menu can be seen on their web site provided you work at the navigation necessary.



CASTLES IN THE AIR AND OTHER FANTASTIC INVENTIONS

Wacky, weird and wonderful are some of the thoughts that come to mind hearing about and viewing some of the inventions covered in an illustrated talk by Nick Brazil to the Probus Club of Basingstoke.



Of course all the inventions were from past ages but some had the germ of an idea that came to fruition and can be seen today. Although some inventions made it into production the vast majority got as far as the Patent Office and no further. Many offered labour saving as their main attraction such as the canine powered sewing machine where a dog ran on a turntable replacing the traditional treadle. And the dog powered turn spit saving servants the labour of continually rotating the carcase of meat over the fire. A type of dog was bred for this task and it is said Queen Victoria had two of them. The breed died out after the invention of different cooking equipment.

Multitasking is nothing new. What about the machine that was a combination baby rocker and butter churner which enabled the busy farmer's wife to also have free



hands to continue with her knitting. Or the fresh air bed that had a large trumpet shape over the sleeping person that brought in fresh air from outside. The problem was that on waking and sitting up the person banged their head on the trumpet.

The sweat bed, designed to rid the occupant of a fever, had a boiler at its foot to heat up pipes under the mattress. The electric under blanket today offers the same result. And the swooning chair that provided some sort of recovery to ladies fainting in their tight corsets and clothing in the heat of an airless room. By sitting on a chair with a descending cushion it caused two paddles to fan the face of the distressed young lady.

Talking of hot rooms there was the invention of a table railway that brought food to diners that overcame the need for servants to be skilled in the art of silver service. Similar ideas can be seen in several restaurants today.

Britain has always had variable weather conditions and the thought of being out in a thunder storm and being struck by lightning saw the invention of the lightning conductor umbrella. This had a tall aerial to attract the lightning and a wire to take the strike to ground. It was modified for some ladies' hats. Not to be outdone in the millenary department there was the portable umbrella built in to the hat which is something that keeps coming up these days. One idea in the not really successful category was the invention in the German army in Africa of a rain collecting hat complete with a small tap.


Aerial photography developed by using pigeons with a camera strapped to them. The picture was taken at a particular height caused by atmospheric pressure. Two photographs could be taken by strapping two small cameras to the pigeon. This was superseded in WWI with early planes fitted with cameras for reconnaissance purposes. The Lumiere brothers in France

developed a successful type of colour photography known as autochrome that only stopped in the 1950s.

Transport had many eccentric developments. The Danish Hunting Monocycle could travel at 24 mph and the American Monocycle beat that at 30 mph. The Dutch military Multi cycle in 1887 could transport twelve soldiers on one vehicle and for something completely left field was the Telegraph Wire Bicycle in 1890 which, as the name suggests, was suspended from telegraph wires rather than running on the ground.

And was there a castle in the air? There certainly was when at the Antwerp exhibition in 1894 the idea was promoted of using 150,000 cubic feet of lighter than air gas in a balloon to support the building of a town. Residents would ascend and descend using elevators. Naturally it was all hot air and it never saw the light of day.

EMPLOYMENT LAW IS CONSTANTLY ON THE MOVE

It is often said that the area of law which changes the most is employment law. That certainly seems to be the case judging from the raft of changes that have recently been proposed by the government.

Here are just a few of the proposals that are being considered:

Prohibiting Non-Disclosure Agreements in sexual harassment and discrimination cases

The government plans to ban confidentiality clauses from being used to prevent individuals from disclosing information to the police, health professionals, lawyers and social workers. However, Non-Disclosure Agreements will still be lawful for legitimate reasons, for example to protect confidential information and trade secrets.

Redundancy protections of new parents and the introduction of neonatal leave

It is proposed that new and expectant mothers and employees who are adopting or taking shared parental leave will have legal protection against being made redundant for six months after they return to work.

It is proposed that this six-month rule should also apply to employees who inform their employer they are pregnant.

Phased return from sick leave

The government is finally proposing to shake up the Statutory Sick Pay system. As part of this process it is being proposed that employees who are returning to work after a period of sick leave will be entitled to enter into a flexible phased return to work.

The right to reasonable notice of work schedules and compensation for the cancellation of shifts

The government is consulting as to whether workers should be entitled to reasonable notice of their work schedule and is looking at introducing a penalty to employers who fail to provide adequate notice of this.

In addition, workers who suffer a cut in their shifts at short notice without warning could be entitled to compensation.
