COUNCILLOR'S UPDATE

BEGGARWOOD PARK IMPROVEMENTS:

Officers have been working on some ideas for improvements to some of Beggarwood Park including better play equipment for younger children. There will be further information on this as well as an online consultation coming forward soon. Look out for details at Hatch Warren and Beggarwood Community Centres.

GOLF COURSE:

At the time of writing, officers at BDBC were suggesting that the planning application for the Golf Course was unlikely to come forward to the Borough's Planning Committee until January. The Borough's own Supplementary Planning Document was due to go to the full council meeting on October 17th for ratification. This is a document which puts forward the framework by which the planning application should be judged.

HOUNSOME FIELDS:

The planning application for two gypsy and traveller pitches which was due to go to the Planning Committee at the end of October has been withdrawn from consideration at that meeting. I imagine another, possibly amended application, will come forward in due course.

ISLAND SITE:

There have been some complaints about mud on the road next to the building site not being cleared away properly. I have referred this to planning officers.

Just a reminder that this scheme could still come forward but at present not enough people have offered to volunteer, let me know if you would like to take part.

Hounsome Fields. The plans for the first phase, adjoining Longacre, are still being finalised. No approval yet. The big news on Hounsome Fields is that the application for the Gypsy and Traveller pitches at the lower end of the site adjoining Trenchards Lane has been withdrawn. Revised plans are expected.

Basingstoke Golf Club. See planning reference 19/00971/OUT. The Strategic Planning Document (SPD) for the site will probably be approved in late October. However the developer is now about to submit a completely revised application addressing many of the concerns raised by local residents and planning officers especially around tree retention, sound barriers and biodiversity. We await these plans with interest.

Island Site. As all can see the construction of the new pub, the Kempshott Farm, is well under way. Other work on the site for the construction of the retirement homes is also proceeding.

Hospital. There have been a lot of press reports about the possible construction of a new hospital with considerable encouragement from Basingstoke's M.P. Maria Miller. It's worth recording a few facts before everyone gets carried away. I. The planning permission for the proposed Critical Treatment Centre (CTC) adjacent to J7 of the M3 has long since lapsed. 2. A large General Hospital would be very different from the more limited CTC proposal. 3. The money committed by the Government so far is for a feasibility study, not for actual construction. 4. The proposed location is not in Maria Miller's constituency.

RESTAURANT REVIEW

NEWLYNS FARM CAFÉ Lodge Farm, Hook Road, RG29 1HA

We were later than expected driving out of Hook on a Thursday as it was getting close to 2.30 pm and the prospect of calling into a pub for lunch was fast disappearing. Madam had the idea that we should come off the A30 and cross the M3 at Junction 5 and go to Newlyns Farm Shop at North Warnborough. This is just off the roundabout at the start of the Odiham bypass and they have a good café that would more than satisfy our needs.

I say Newlyns Farm Shop because that is how I know them from old, but, my, how this place has grown. The wonderful farm shop is the mainstay but as well as their cookery school upstairs and the café close to the door, outside there is a new barn style building for wine and gin as well as a gift store. Yes, I know that Christmas is coming but this is something they will probably keep all year.

The café has expanded its offering as well so we really were spoiled for choice. An extensive menu stated that they start lunch from 12 noon but they do not specify a cut off time so we could order anything we fancied. With Newlyns rearing their own animals they have the provenance of farm to fork produce and everything is cooked fresh to order. A

hot sharing platter for 2 was our choice consisting of two lamb koftes, four Olde English sausages, six slices of pork loin, coleslaw, apple sauce, ciabatta and a bowl of chips.

If we have this dish again I would suggest eating the pork first as the kofte and sausages keep hotter longer but the reality is that we were forced to leave a couple of slices of the pork because we were so full. Having left something on the platter we did not feel it right to have some cake but decided to take a piece each home with us.

With a pot of Earl Grey tea for Madam and a bottle of Coca Cola for me the total bill came to only £26.54. Great value. And Madam was so impressed with the quality of what we had just eaten that she went into the shop to buy some of the sausages we had just enjoyed. You can't get a better recommendation than that.

ARE YOU BEING OVERCHARGED BY YOUR WATER COMPANY?

If your gutters drain to soakaways rather than into the public sewers, you can get a rebate on the standing charge element of your water bill. This rebate has been available since 2001, but you have to apply for it, it's not automatic. I recently found out about this, and applied, because my gutters definitely don't connect to the sewers – I had to pay a small fortune to get clogged soakaways cleared within the last couple of years, to stop flooding in my garden!

Hidden in the extremely small print on my water bill from South East Water – in a misleadingly-worded paragraph on page 6 of the 10-page bill – was a paragraph saying if I thought I was entitled, I should go to Thames Water's website (because South East Water bill waste services on Thames Water's behalf) and apply. Not a simple or straightforward process, anybody'd think they didn't want you to find the online application, but I did it. A couple of

weeks later I received a letter agreeing my application, saying I'd get a rebate backdated to April 2019.

I contacted Thames Water and asked them about the excess charges they'd levied since I moved to Hatch Warren in 1989. They replied that the rebate only became law from 2001, and they only have to rebate to the start of the financial year in which the application is made, if it is the first application made within that postcode. complained, and was told, politely, to get lost. I took my complaint to the consumer council that's supposed to look after water users, and was told Thames Water were correct. Apparently, the right to a rebate is "prominently" shown on South East Water's bills (half way down page 6 of 10); so well advertised in fact that since the introduction of the rebate in 2001 I am the first resident of the 17 households in my postcode to have made an application.

I have subsequently discovered that a resident of a neighbouring postcode made a successful application in 2001, but through some "administrative error" the rebate was withdrawn when he died in 2011, and his widow has been overcharged for the last 8 years.

I live in a four bed detached house, and the rebate is about £26 per annum – not a lot, but why should Thames Water potentially get £26 to which they're not entitled from every house in Hatch Warren/Beggarwood/ Kempshott Rise? Multiply that across the Borough, and I bet they're making millions because people don't see their "prominent" information.

70% of Divorcing Couples Don't Discuss Pensions

Recent research by Age UK has discovered that 70% of couples going through a divorce are not discussing pensions when arranging their finances.

Pensions can be complex and difficult to understand – which is perhaps why they are often overlooked or people fail to recognise their value.

There are various ways of approaching pensions when a couple are separating and the best option will depend on the personal circumstances of the individuals, the pension value/options and their overall financial position.

 Pension Sharing is the most frequently used option. This allows one party to secure an agreed percentage of their partner's pension and to put these funds into their own name. This puts the individual in full control.

- popular option used when splitting finances. This involves 'offsetting' the pension against other assets in the marriage, for example a larger property share or other savings. A pitfall with this is that pension values will increase overtime, so this will need some careful consideration as pension assets may be worth more.
- Pension Attachment Orders (previously known as 'earmarking') are used very infrequently as it does have many disadvantages. This is where the court decides on an amount which is payable to one spouse from the pension income.

OLD DOWN AND BEGGARWOOD WILDLIFE GROUP

We have had such a dismal wet October with only the odd bright day. But those odd bright days have enabled us to enjoy the start of the autumn colours and the wonderful views from Old Down over the fields towards Hannington and over Basingstoke town.

The work party on Old Down has been quite lucky with the weather and only cancelled once. A new rowan tree has been planted – looks very healthy at the moment, let's hope it stays that way! Another one is due to be planted soon. It is always a good feeling to put something in as most of the work party tasks involve removing and cutting back. Rowan berries are very popular with many bird species, particularly members of the thrush family which nowadays are not a common sight on Old Down.

Now the summer is over it is time to look at the butterfly records on Old Down for 2019. It is pleasing that our records show we have had a really good year for butterflies. Not only was it a 'Painted Lady' summer but it was also, for us, a Small Blue year too. Numbers of Small Blue butterflies nearly doubled compared to last year - 646 this year, 345 last year. Other species that did really well were Brimstone, Gatekeeper, Holly Blue, Meadow Brown, Peacock, Red Admiral, Large Skipper, Small/Essex Skipper and Small Heath. The number of Orange Tips nearly doubled from last year thanks to the mild spring. Unfortunately, the picture is not so rosy for some of the other species with Common Blues only a quarter of what they were last year, from 584 down to 146. That really is a worrying drop especially as Old Down does have quite a good crop of its caterpillar food source which is Bird's Foot Trefoil. Speckled Wood, Brown Argus and all the 'Whites' fared badly too. Apart from the special events of Painted Ladies and Small Blues we

were delighted to have an uncommon visit from a Clouded Yellow (which is an unpredictable migrant coming mostly from southern Europe). Only 5 other Clouded Yellow sightings have been recorded on Old Down in the past 5 years. The total number of butterflies seen on the weekly transects from April to September was 3,123 and 27 different species. Last year the total was 3,032.

At the time of writing this report the flower meadow has still not been mown by the council (despite requests from the Group) which is not good news for encouraging fresh growth next year.

Work Parties: Please come and join us. For Old Down, we meet outside Old Down Hall every Thursday 10-12 noon. Always check our website just in case there is a cancellation or change. Currently there are no volunteers for work parties on Beggarwood. If anyone is interested in volunteering for Beggarwood please contact the Group to discuss. After all she had almost thirty years' experiences to call upon, all far more serious than this. The good, the bad and the downright funny is how Jackie Dimmock described situations she encountered as an officer in the Hampshire & Isle of Wight Police. Discounting the usual Powerpoint slides, instead she used her hobby of quilting to amusingly illustrate some of her varied incidents as customs and practices changed over the years. The W in WPC eventually went missing, as a Police Constable had that rank irrespective of gender. However, the uniform did not change until later so she had a straight skirt, stockings and suspenders. Not the most practical attire when responding to a reported break in and forced to climb over a school wall after her

In those days she was issued with a radio but had to buy a pair of handcuffs and a small truncheon that fitted inside her shoulder bag which she would swing with great effect at miscreants.

male colleague jokingly told her that

the gate was locked.

Trousers came later, but these were men's trousers and consequently fitted women badly.

Today female Police Constables have tailored trousers, advanced radios, CS sprays, handcuffs, cameras and stab vests.

Undertaking a police driving course, lackie was inexplicably taught to double de-clutch even though the car had a synchromesh gear box. Let out in a small car, although fitted with a blue light it had no siren so she had to use the horn to get through traffic. On her first outing she made the classic error of driving the wrong way up a one way street. Chasing a suspect would have been her excuse had she been reported.



At a meeting led by the then Chief Constable she failed to ask about a report that 99% of female officers suffered sexual harassment at work. Being news to lackie she afterwards quizzed the Chief Constable as she wondered if she was the missing one percent. He said that to rectify matters she would be welcome to visit his office anytime. How times change.

Following on from serving five years in the Child Protection Unit Jackie become a Schools Liaison officer. She was able to tease information out of children relating to domestic problems. Children told of drug addict mothers using a lighter under a tea spoon in the kitchen. Others being abused and their siblings in the same school equally suffering were unknown to teachers. Fathers who drove while drunk or did not wear a seat belt were all reported by the children.

Drug raids required a female office to be part of the team as she would be needed to handle women suspects. One raid on a bungalow the suspect escaped out of a window. Jackie leaned out trying to spot him. An inquisitive donkey came up to the window and bit Jackie's left breast. Everyone said that they should examine the damaged area as it needed to be recorded in the accident book.

In the early days of DNA she became a scene of crimes officer. A girl had been murdered alongside the Basingstoke canal in 1981 with no suspect emerging. All the evidence was kept in Basingstoke. In 2002, in the north, a wife reported her husband for assault. Using familial DNA profiling he was eventually charged with the murder.

HATCH WARREN UNDER FIVES

Our first half term at Hatch Warren Under Fives has flown past; the children have been busy with lots of craft, autumn activities, baking and science experimenting.

There have been lots of things to discover for our topic of autumn - we've been looking at the changes in the garden and the different colours of the leaves and we've taken autumn walks to listen for the crunching sounds of leaves. We've also had great fun jumping in big puddles as part of our weather theme! Some of the children have spoken about seeing hedgehogs in their gardens; so to extend their learning we included hibernation as part of our autumn topic (being able to talk about the natural world and show concern for living things is an expectation for a typical child aged 30 to 50 months). The children made some wonderful hedgehog houses and baked hedgehog bread rolls (these are much harder than they look — so a huge well done to the children!) These have been replaced by a mesh, reusable bag, made from recycled plastic bottles, which can be purchased for 30p. By the end of October, we'll have replaced the weighing scales with a new bowl instead of the flat surface we're currently using.

Once weighed, the price sticker can be placed on the mesh bag for scanning at the till. You can put multiple items in the mesh bag or, indeed, bring your own container/bag.

Simply remember to always weigh your produce separate from your bag/container. Items purchased from our Bakery, can now be placed in a paper bag or, your own container/bag, prior to purchase at our checkouts.

It has been estimated that by removing these plastic bags, we'll have saved 291 million single use plastic bags from our shelves, across the whole store estate.

You may have also started to notice a change to our ready meal offer for customers. Following successful trials, all the plastic packaging for our ready meals, can be recycled.

We're continuing to work closer with suppliers of other ready meal ranges to help ensure their packaging is recyclable too so, watch this space for further updates.

CYCLE BASINGSTOKE

Our aim is to help people cycle, make it possible to cycle whatever your age, ability or journey purpose.

We are lobbying local government for a better cycle network and looking for more supporters.

No waterways = no boats No cycleways = no cycles

It is normal to cycle in Holland. Why? There is a comprehensive cycle network which makes cycling quicker and more convenient than taking the car.

We are negotiating with the Council to get a direct usable cycle route into town from residential areas along/near the A30; protected from motor traffic, not shared with pedestrians. This is essential as thousands of new homes between Hatch Warren and M3 junction 7 will mean gridlock at worst and congestion at best.

We have successfully obtained a review of Basingstoke Cycle Strategy as it has failed to deliver improvements in provision for cycling. By collaborating with other groups we have persuaded Hampshire County Council to review how they design cycle routes and to allocate more funding. An audio powerpoint presentation from Cycle Basingstoke is being used as part of training workshops in September and October. The Basingstoke Transport Strategy (approved end of July) was modified thanks to suggestions from Cycle Basingstoke so funding will be obtained for schemes that facilitate cycling. Words with no money mean nothing.

Lobbying for change is a numbers game which is why we were delighted with a 50% increase in our membership during Green Week in September. We would love it if you signed up as a supporter or if you got your club or employer to join as a corporate or group supporter. Membership is free, but donations are important as we want to sponsor Bikeability training, which replaces cycling proficiency , and National Standard Instructor training. SPIRITUALLY SPEAKING

Remember me

This month Immanuel Church celebrates two special services. The first is All Souls on the 3 November at 6:30pm. This is a quiet, reflective service where we remember those we have loved but are no longer with us. There is an opportunity to light a candle and the names of those who have died will be read out whether the loss is recent or a long time ago. The act of remembering is at the heart of this service. Jesus asks us to remember him by sharing Communion together and at Immanuel Church we do this every week in our Communion services. The bread and wine we share symbolises the body and blood of Jesus. We do this not only to remember him, but to share our faith with others, so they too may come to know him.

The second special service is Remembrance Sunday on 10 November at 10am. We remember those service men and women who gave their lives for us in past and present conflicts. The British Legion have written these poignant words, "remembrance unites people of all faiths, cultures and backgrounds but it is deeply personal." Last year I had the privilege to be in Jerusalem during Remembrance Sunday and I took part in the service at the Jerusalem War Cemetery which is for the allied armies who died in the First World War along with service men and women. I was really moved to see graves with the inscription 'To a soldier of the Great War known only to God'. We may not know the name of the soldier but God remembers them and they are not forgotten.

During my recent move, I came across a card that was sent to my mother's family informing them that their 19 year old son had been killed in action in the First World War. The card that the family were sent says 'gone but not forgotten'. During World War Two, my husband's grandfather was killed in 1941 on HMS Repulse. We still have some fragments of their lives through a small amount of photographs and documents. We named our son Joseph after his grandfather.

Having spent some time thinking about remembering, I found myself asking, how do I want to be remembered? What difference can I make to others? I believe God never forgets us and that he cares about all that is going on in our lives, both the difficult times and the joyful moments, in the big and the little things. I wonder what difference we can make here in Hatch Warren and Beggarwood?
