The South West Action Group (SWAG) is dedicated to "inform and influence" on major planning and development proposals for the south west and west of Basingstoke and the surrounding villages of Dummer, North Waltham and Oakley.

Sadly, its future is now in doubt as it needs a new Chairperson to lead.

Although the massive housing developments of north Manydown, Hounsome Fields and Basingstoke Golf Course are already, or will soon be underway, don't for one moment think it will stop there. Landowners in and around where you live want to build a lot, lot more. Here's just a flavour of what additional development is being considered in the latest Strategic Housing and Employment planning documents:

- Hatch Warren, Beggarwood and Kempshott Over 9,500 more houses
- North Waltham Almost 200 more houses around the village plus 4,500 alongside Maidenthorne Lane
- Dummer 80 houses proposed for the village plus an industrial and warehouse area as big as all the industrial estates in and around Chineham
- Oakley a further 4,000 houses

COUNCILLOR'S UPDATE

ANAEROBIC DIGESTER

Odour emissions from the digester have gone from bad to worse in the last few months with local residents from all over Hatch Warren and Beggarwood reporting the "rotting cabbage" smell. Biogen the operators installed a new biofilter last Autumn in an attempt to address the problems, but this certainly appears to have not succeeded. The up to date situation at the time of writing this was that the operators had installed a temporary bypass to try to put an end to the smells, and were working with the Environment Agency to find a solution. Only the Environment Agency have the power to close the plant, and I understand that, after years of pressure and appeals to them, they are treating this with some degree of seriousness and had sent their national expert down to the digester to investigate.

GOLF COURSE

At time of writing there was still no confirmation of the date the application will go to the Borough Council's Development Control committee

BEGGARWOOD PARK CONSULTATION

The consultation has now closed and Borough Council officers are now looking at the responses prior to coming up with some new proposals for the park. There are more details on the Borough Council website.

ST MARK'S SCHOOL PARKING

I've received further complaints from local residents re parking issues around St Mark's at school run times. I contacted our local Community Safety Officer who has been very proactive and has attended on a number of occasions. He reports that he has spoken to a number of drivers on the scene. He has also spoken to parking enforcement who make the point that they have 6 officers to cover the whole lot of the Borough, including 73 schools, but that St Mark's is on their list to attend.

This is my last submission as a Councillor for Hatch Warren and Beggarwood as I am standing down in the May elections. I would just like to say thank you to everyone who has contacted me over the last ten years, it has been a pleasure to represent the area that has been home for more than twenty years and I am super proud of our community and what we have achieved here to build a great place to live. I will still be here and still be active in the community but thankfully no longer involved in the political side of things. RESTAURANT REVIEW

THE DRAGONFLY Popley, RG24 9AS. 01256 830714

Nearly thirteen thousand pubs and bars have closed since 2007 but the last two years saw a reversal of this trend when 325 opened. One such is the Dragonfly on Carpenters Down, a Marston's Brewery house which opened last May. Based close to the entrance of the Chineham business parks it clearly attracts custom from their employees as the car park was verging on being full even though it was 1.30 pm when we arrived.

The Dragonfly follows the style of other Marston houses which basically are attractive family eating establishments that also sell beer. At busy times they even have those electronic reminders when your table is ready.

And what a great offering they present with extensive choices to suit all tastes. Specialising with a carvery of three joints there are several special family deals for four. Two medium and two small carveries for £20, or, Crackin' Chicken deal consisting of two ½ roast chickens, chicken goujons, popcorn chicken, wings, four portions of chips, coleslaw and beans. Food of this standard just could not be produced at this price at home.

What attracted Madam and I was the offer of two meals for $\pounds 12$ which is available all day except Sunday. The choices here were a medium plate carvery, chicken and bacon salad, classic burger, 10 oz gammon

steak with fried egg and pineapple ring, aubergine bake, beer battered fish and chips and beef lasagne.

Madam had the chicken and bacon salad, which filled a large dish that she described as delicious and I had the fish and chips which came with mushy peas and tartare sauce. It was freshly cooked and was good quality.

A starter or sweet/coffee are £2 extra. But be careful about when you order these items as we discovered to our cost that unless they are ordered at the same time as the main course the sweets become £3.99 although coffee for Madam remained at £2.

With a pint of Peroni lager and a diet tonic water the total cost was £24 even with paying almost double for my apple pie and custard. We concluded that with its pleasant design and atmosphere and a great choice of food at extremely competitive prices this establishment is worthy of our recommendation.

They have spent the last few months reorganising and updating practices, services and premises and would now like to introduce themselves to the community.

What has been done so far?

NHUC is a not-for-profit Community Benefit organisation whose key focus is to provide high quality clinical care. Since taking over the practice it has been extremely busy improving services. The plan is to build a team of permanent employees and stop the revolving door of agency and locum staff. Staff training will be paramount in 2020. The aim is to provide best practice and to meet all CQC requirements and national standards.

We know that in the past patients have struggled to get appointments. To this end administrative staff numbers have been increased and a General Manager has been appointed. There are also a number of online and text messaging services as well as a revised appointment booking service which ensures same day appointments for urgent needs as well as pre-bookable and non-urgent appointments. Some of you may have noticed that there is now a regular screening system for long-term health problems.

PROBUS HEARS ABOUT BIRDS AND PLANES

What's the connection between birds and planes?

Quite a lot actually as retired solicitor Stephen Thair, a resident of Old Basing, and a member of the Probus Club of Basingstoke, outlined to Probus Club members how he has made a study of this over many years. He combined his dual interests of bird watching and aviation and easily makes the connection between these two flying objects — one ornithological and the other aeronautical.

Align these with extensive travel for holidays in exotic climes and working for some years in Papua New Guinea with a trusty camera readily to hand means he has a plethora of both bird and plane photographs.

Many types of sea birds have an aircraft named after them. Gannets, for instance, some with 6 foot wingspans, are famed for diving into the sea at great speed. In the 1950s the Fairey Aviation Company built an anti submarine plane with contra rotating twin propellers which gave it both high power and economy of use if one engine was switched off. They later built an airborne early warning version. The name of this plane was of course the Gannet. Fairey also built a naval fighter with a crew of two fitted with a Rolls Royce Merlin engine that was called the Fulmar.

Gulls abound throughout the world and in recognition of their flight capabilities the Percival Aircraft Company constructed their Gull series of high performance light aircraft in the 1930s, including the Vega Gull aircraft. The Mew Gull was a racing aircraft which flew from UK to South Africa and back in 4 1/2 days, a record that stood for seventy years.

Some gliders can be seen at Lasham airfield that have gull shaped wings but probably the most famous plane that had this design, although with an inverted gull wing, was the WW2 German Stuka Dive Bomber. There was also a US Navy fighter called the Corsair that had the same wing configuration.

The male Blackbird with its yellow beak is part of the Thrush family and its aeronautical namesake is the American Lockheed Company's Blackbird SR 71A spy plane which could fly at Mach 3+ and attain an altitude of 85,000 feet. This was necessary in its reconnaissance role before the advent of satellites. This plane was so successful that it is rumoured that it was targeted by 1,000 missiles without being hit. Those readers of a certain age will remember that that was not the case when Francis Gary Powers, in 1960, was shot down in his U2 spy plane over Russia. The name U2 being chosen to create an impression of a utility aircraft rather than the high altitude spy plane it actually was.

Britain only has one type of Kingfisher with striking blue and green plumage although throughout the world there are 86 species. The Museum of the Revolution in Havana Cuba houses a Vought Kingfisher aircraft which made a forced landing on a beach





in 1958 while being used against Fidel Castro's revolutionaries. They captured the aircraft and used it against the government forces that had previously operated it.

Papua New Guinea, on the other hand, has 39 varieties of Birds of Paradise, the males of which have distinctive coloured plumage. Papua New Guineans traditionally use the Bird of paradise feathers in their head dress, partly as a demonstration of their prowess with a bow and arrow.



The world famous RAF Red Arrows display team use a training aircraft, the BAE Hawk, to great effect. Stephen commented,

"Their previous mount, the Folland Gnat was named after an insect, as were many other planes, but that could be the subject for another talk on another occasion".

TREE-MENDOUS RECYCLING

Nearly 10,000 Christmas trees have been recycled following the festive season highlighting a tree-mendous recycling effort by the borough's residents.

For the first time, Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council's garden waste customers were able to leave their festive firs out for collection with their brown bin or sacks.

This was in addition to the 22 Christmas tree drop off points around the borough that residents could take their real Christmas trees to.

The 9,792 trees collected will now be transformed into ProGrow soil conditioner for gardens and wood chippings for borough council parks.

Cabinet Member for Environment and Enforcement Cllr Hayley Eachus said: "This year we made recycling your Christmas tree even easier to do by collecting real trees through our garden waste collection service, as well as our drop off points.

"It is great news that nearly 10,000 trees have been collected this year. We can all do our bit to help recycle more and residents

can be pleased their green contribution will help our parks and gardens bloom."

The council's garden waste collection service takes place all year round, with a two week break over Christmas and New Year. Customers receive 25 fortnightly collections for an annual charge of £47. They have the option of buying a 240-litre capacity brown bin for £28.84 or receive two 90-litre sacks, with additional sacks available for a charge.

KEMPSHOTT CONSERVATION GROUP

It's on the way out! After Christmas, you may have noticed small pieces of red and white warning tape tied to shrubs appearing all over Down Grange Meadow. These are being used to mark out scrub that is to be removed, mainly rose briar and the occasional hawthorn. If not kept under control, rose briar is dreadful stuff that spreads guickly. This means not just cutting it down but also digging out the roots as well. As this is hard work for our volunteers, we get Community Payback to this, and they love it! It's just the type of work they enjoy, cutting stuff down. At the end of each work session they can see where they have been and they get a sense of achievement of a job well done. Scrub clearance started at the end of November and a number of Community

Payback sessions are booked into early March. One of our aims is to clear a block of grassland so that Basingstoke Council can cut the grass this coming spring. In the past when the grass was cut more frequently, small scrub growth was cut at the same time. This just stores up trouble for the future. Although the scrub gets cut down the roots remain and the scrub bounces back with more vigour in later years. In the last 10 years or so, the frequency of grass cutting has been reduced and so scrub has been allowed to flourish. If left, grassland will naturally be overtaken by scrub. If left long enough, this scrub will develop into clumps of hawthorn and oak with an understory of rose briar and bramble, eventually to become oak forest.

Our last two Work Parties for the season on the Meadow will take place on Sundays, 8th and 29th March from 10 00 to 12 00. The meeting point is the Homesteads Road entrance near St. Mark's Church. 

SPIRITUALLY SPEAKING

Lent and Prayer

In the church calendar the six weeks leading up to Easter is called Lent. Lent was originally a forty day period of preparation for those being baptised on Easter Sunday. From there it developed into a time when all Christians were encouraged to renew their spiritual lives in readiness for the great Easter celebrations. During Lent we are reminded of the forty days and forty nights that Jesus spent in the wilderness, a time where he resisted many temptations. Today, many people will decide to do something special to help them reflect on what Jesus did. Some give up eating a particular food, such as chocolate or meat; they may donate money to charity; others may decide to do something special for other people. For lent this year I have decided to read a new book on prayer.

Lent is a time for us to grow in our faith and at Immanuel church we have decided to run a prayer course over seven weeks to help us explore different aspects of prayer. Prayer was an integral part of Jesus' life, he prayed at different times and in different places. Sometimes prayer was corporate, sometimes it was solitary. He said to them, "When you pray, say: Father, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come. Give us each day our daily bread. Forgive us our sins, for we also forgive everyone who sins against us. And lead us not into temptation." (Luke I I:2-4) I find it inspiring that over the centuries this particular prayer, the Lord's prayer is still being used.



ADVICE FROM CYCLE BASINGSTOKE

Where can you cycle?

The public highway is anywhere the public have the right to pass - roads, paths, footways etc. The carriageway is part of the highway which for carriages and vehicles, the footway alongside is for walking. The footway/sidewalk/pavement was paved and higher up to keep people's feet clean and dry, out of the puddles, mud and muck churned up by horses and carriages. In law a cycle is a vehicle , therefore you risk a fixed penalty notice and a fine if you cycle on the footway. Blue signs with a bicycle symbol give you permission to cycle legally on the footway (cycling on the carriageway is still legally ok as well).

Blue signs are advisory. Bicycle symbols on a blue rectangle (e.g in . Vyne road and Salisbury gardens) advise you that a recommended cycle routes continues on the carriageway not the pavement, not much use without directions signs! Blue cycle dismount discs recommend dismounting, usually placed where there is a hazard for the cycle user (not the pedestrian), for example danger of getting run over at a road crossing, low headroom in a subway or low parapets on a bridge. Did you know that there is also a horse rider dismount sign and dismounting block at a subway into War Memorial Park? Cycle dismount signs are found on cycle routes so at least you know it is legal to cycle, even if it may not be safe to do so.

safety cut-offs on route at about every 20 miles. Jeff and Elliott started off the challenge together but unfortunately, Jeff was unable to finish. However, Jeff's continued support for Elliott was extraordinary. He ran with him for his last miles and saw him safely over the finish line. Fellow club members followed the pair on-line, from the comfort of their sofas, with their hearts in their mouths. The pair's camaraderie was highly emotional and completely unforgettable.

In live footage from the Arc finish line, one commentator exclaimed:

It's hard work and you need to put in the training and the effort and, that guy [Elliott] epitomises what the Arc is all about... getting to the finish at all costs and it's about staying alive...about staying alive!"

As runners, we all have times when we need to dig deep. Sometimes it's on a casual run; other times it's when undertaking our biggest challenge to date. Sometimes it's when we can't run; other times it's when we don't want to run. If you've ever been that person at someone's side, or cheering from the sidelines (or sofa) — you are a true running buddy; never underestimate your value!




