

### HATCH WARREN W.I.

Members of Hatch Warren W.I. held their pre Easter Zoom meeting on 1st April. Our speaker for the evening was changed and we welcomed instead David Woolford who spoke about having a very successful lung transplant eleven years ago. David who suffered with asthma and then pneumonia as a child went on to develop emphysema. He was put on the organ transplant list, when he reach the point of having to use a wheelchair and stair lift and oxygen. David was very amusing with his anecdotes of his experiences before his transplant. You have to be very ill to receive a transplant but well enough to survive the operation and make a good recovery. You have twenty minutes notice before the car with flashing blue lights comes for you and you have to have your bag packed ready. David got the call and as they reached the M25 was then told to go home as the lungs were found not to be suitable for him. On 23rd December another call and off they went this time for him to receive his new lungs which were totally successful. After a seven hour op, David was able to breath without help and stayed at Papworth hospital for about a month. He has to be careful of certain foods otherwise his life is back to normal. Many people draw comfort from knowing that their loved one has helped someone else to live.

Nineteen of our members joined the Zoom HCFWI Spring Council meeting where we learnt about Climate Change with Denise Smythe-Wright and Amanda Owen (aka) The Yorkshire Shepherdess and mother of nine children. ### Mental Health Awareness Week 2021 - 10th to 16th May 2021

Connecting with Nature is positive for our Mental Health

### WHY IS NATURE THE THEME FOR MENTAL HEALTH AWARENESS WEEK 2021?

The answer is simple: Connecting with Nature is positive for our Mental Health

During long months of the pandemic, millions of us turned to nature. Research from the Mental Health Foundation showed going for walks outside was one of our top coping strategies with 45% of people reporting being in green spaces had been vital for our mental health. Websites showing footage from webcams of wildlife saw hits increase by over 2000%. Wider studies also found that during lockdowns, people not only spent more time in nature but were noticing it more. Did you notice the bluer skies, sounds of bird song, and cleaner air quality? I certainly did.

It was as if we were re-discovering at our most fragile point our fundamental human need to connect with nature.

#### Nature and our mental health

According the the Mental Health Foundation introduction to the Mental Health Awareness Week 2021, nature is so central to our psychological and emotional health, that it's almost impossible to realise good mental health for all without a greater connection to the natural world. For most of human history, we lived as part of nature. It is only in the last five generations that so many of us have lived and worked in a context that is largely separated from nature. And it is only since a 1960s study in the US found that patients who were treated in hospitals with a view of nature recovered faster, that science has started to unpack the extraordinary health benefits.

Nature has a unique ability to not only bring consolation in times of stress, but also increase our creativity, empathy and a sense of wonder. It turns out that it is not just being in nature but how we open ourselves up and interact with nature that counts. Even small contacts with nature can reduce feelings of social isolation and be effective in protecting our mental health, and preventing distress.

Nature is our great untapped resource for a mentally healthy future.

### So what can we do to connect with nature?

The answer to this question could be found in a model created by the New Economic Foundation in 2008 – the Five Ways to Wellbeing – Be Active – Connect – Take Notice – Learn - Give. The Five Ways to Wellbeing has proven an extremely popular model to help support approaches to positive mental health. Groups as diverse as General Practitioners, mental health commissioners, arts practitioners, church groups, community and voluntary organisations, and civil service departments have all adopted this approach.

So how can this model work to support Mental Health Awareness Week?

I hope that you manage to take time for you during Mental Health Awareness Week? I will be enjoying time outside, taking in

nature, and hoping that the sun shines for all of us together.

### BHCS—The fastest growing school in the area!

We are excited to report that Brighton Hill Community School is the fastest growing school in Hampshire; it has seen a large uprise in applications in the past 3 years. The school have 255 spaces available each year and for September 2021, 496 applications were sent in. The application number for 2020 was 440, and 2019 had 405 applications. It is the 12th highest number of applications that any school in the country had. In 2016, the application number was 197; this shows the rise in the school's applications. Mr Edwards, our headteacher, said, "We are the fastest growing school in Hampshire by some distance. We are absolutely delighted that the local community are continuing to put their faith in us at Brighton Hill Community

School. We've worked incredibly hard to turn our school around over the last few years and it's fantastic to see that the hard work is paying off. Our students and families are extremely happy with what we are doing and where we are going. We hope this is just the beginning of our journey as a school. Come September, we will have doubled our numbers as a school in just four years, which is an extraordinary team effort. It's great for Basingstoke as a town to, that so many families who historically would have chosen schools outside of the area are now realising that they have even better options on their doorsteps, with a number of other schools in the town making great improvements too."

### **COUNCILLOR'S UPDATE**

**DENTAL SURGERY:** It looks as if major changes are afoot regarding Beggarwood's promised dental surgery on the Island site. Grainger Trust put the site up for auction (see https://auctions.savills.co.uk/index.php?option=com\_bidding&view=commission&layout=catalogue&id=73) with a guide price of £200,000 and it sold for a reported £365,000. That's a lot of money and we don't know yet who the new owners are or what they intend regarding the building of a new surgery. It would be a blow to Beggarwood and the new developments currently taking place if this community asset were to be lost.

**PATIENT GROUP:** the latest meeting of the Beggarwood Surgery PPG received a positive report. The surgery is receiving encouraging feedback from patients, and the newly-recruited doctors have slotted in smoothly. Vaccine rollout is progressing well through the Hampshire Court Hotel site.

**OPENREACH WORKS:** work has been taking place in many locations round Hatch Warren and Beggarwood relating to Openreach, and there have been a lot of complaints about the standards of workmanship. Hampshire County Council officers are aware and have served numerous defect notices. The matter has been discussed with senior Openreach managers. As a result of the dissatisfaction, Hampshire suspended the granting of permits for new works and allowed new ones only for remedial works or where there were safety or safeguarding measures needed. At the end of the day, the County Council reserves the right to prosecute if works remain below the required standards - this was done successfully in 2016. However, Openreach have a legal duty and powers to install and maintain their apparatus, and superfast

broadband is a critical element of the economic recovery.

LITTER AND MESS: the Café in the Park at Beggarwood has posted photographs showing litter and mess left overnight at the outside tables. They were devastated to be greeted by the broken glass and rubbish and have cleared it up as best they can. They are determined to help stamp out this antisocial behaviour and are sharing CCTV footage with the Police.

WAREHOUSE APPLICATION AT IUNCTION 7: the Borough Council's development committee turned down outline planning application for four warehouse units but passed the full application for the first of those four. One of the conditions discussed by the Officers is to require the operators not to allow traffic onto the A30 corridor at peak times and this would be important to Hatch Warren and Beggarwood. The local Members of Parliament have written to the Secretary of State asking him to 'call in' the application because they are concerned about the impact the warehouses could have on the proposed new hospital. At the time of writing it is not known whether the Secretary of State will call it in as requested. If he does, there is likely to be an inquiry headed by an independent inspector. The developers have said that the roundabout they will build on the A30 will also serve the proposed new hospital, but without knowing the amount of traffic that the hospital might generate, I don't see how they can be certain on that.

**DIGESTATE SPREADING:** An important test of the changes made at the Anaerobic Digester passed in mid-April. The operators gave advance warning that the Digestate from their plant would be spread on the adjacent wheat field.

The last time this happened there were reports of odour for many days, but the improvements to the plant should have reduced this impact. It seems that there were some early reports of odour but the problem may not have lingered as badly as last time.

**CAFE IN THE PARK** has reopened its lunchtime takeaway service. This operates from the park side of the building and they are putting photographs of bacon rolls on their Facebook page to tempt customers back. This is a popular service with dog walkers and other users of the large field.

**NEW B&M:** Hatch Warren has its new B&M store next door to Sainsbury. On its opening day there was a queue to enter that snaked all the way past the golf store and round the corner. With all our local shop units now occupied, let us hope that they all benefit from increased footfall.

The PORTSMOUTH ARMS OPEN AIR MARKET continues to be very popular on Saturdays with (socially distanced) queues for stalls. It has now been able to welcome back its 'nonessential' stalls and should therefore be back to its full size.

AND FINALLY ... as the lockdown restrictions gradually ease, please continue to be cautious regarding the spread of COVID. Wear the masks, try to stay at least 2 metres (3 steps) away from anyone you do not live with (or anyone not in your support bubble), keep washing your hands and let fresh air into your home by opening windows, doors and air vents as much as possible.

### Covid - 19 Update

Firstly, a huge thank you for your continued patience and cooperation, whilst we learn to adapt to new restrictions at the store.

Our colleagues are passionate about providing a safe place for you to shop during an unprecedented time for all retail workers.

With changes to the way we all shop, occurring on an almost daily basis, please take time to check our website for up to date details and, the notices on display at the store.

Our Online Delivery service from the store now delivers almost 30,000 items every day and reached record levels before Easter, with over 45,000 items and 600 deliveries in just one day.

Online deliveries continue to be prioritised, in the first instance, for those who have

registered as extremely vulnerable via the government website. We've also been able to include elderly customers – where they have a Nectar Card – in releasing delivery slots for them too.

We've increased capacity for our Click and Collect service from the car park; it's almost trebled from levels we usually see.

Social distancing is in place prior to you entering the store and, you will have already noticed our measures to try and extend this within the store as well.

Our Online team of pickers now begin their roles at 2am in the morning, with the aim to be free from the shop floor as soon as they can after we open. However, with the challenge of increasing our delivery capacity, we can't always fulfil this.

#### **Food Donation Partnerships**

We've taken the decision to remove any food donation points from the store, at the present time. With restrictions still in place for the items our Food Donation Partners are requesting, there is little point in encouraging donations, at this time.

We've teamed with Basingstoke Voluntary Action, who are co-ordinating the 19 'Food Donation Hubs' across the Borough and, together with our colleagues at the Depot and our Retail Events Teams, have started to work at supplying food as a bulk delivery.

Sainsbury's continues to work closely with fare Share across the UK, with an initial investment of £3million.

These measures will help in less trips to the store from volunteers looking for items, and allow us to concentrate on bringing availability back to the shelves for our customers.

Finally, may we take this opportunity again to thank you for your patience and cooperation with the many changes you have seen at the store.

### MADEIRA CAKE RECIPE

Hello again, Amanda from Indigo Bakes back with a new recipe this month and a little update on our garden too.

I'm currently sat in front of the ovens again, it's still really chilly in the mornings! I don't like being cold, so you'll find me most mornings in front of the ovens warming myself up.

We've started spending more time getting the garden ready. The eggshells are working! An abundance of tulips are now coming through and after I surrounded the stems of these and the hyacinths with crushed eggshells, the slugs and snails have left them well alone. Although I have lost a few flowers due to the frost over the past week.

We have started planting out our vegetable plugs; with carrots, brussle sprouts, turnips, peas and beans, mange-tout, potatoes and pumpkins! It's the first time we have planted so many and most of them will be grown in containers as we have a small garden and also are in competition with the squirrels! So any tips on keeping these pesky pests off of my turnips would be grately received. This month I am sharing our Madeira cake

This is a really versatile cake mix and you can add any additional flavours you like. I've given you a few ideas at the end of this recipe, but have a go at adding your own twist and please let us know how you've got on with it. Also, if you have any cake batter left over you can use it for cupcakes.

220g unsalted butter

200g caster sugar

3 large eggs

200g Self Raising Flour

tbsp Milk

Tsp vanilla extract

Pinch of salt

Grease a 900g loaf tin and set your fan oven to 160C.

Beat the sugar and butter together until very light and very fluffy.

Add each egg separately waiting for the one before to fully incorporate into the butter and sugar.

Slowly fold in the sifted flour with the pinch of salt.

\*if adding additional ingredients, add them when the flour is almost all folded into the mix. Mix the milk with the vanilla extract and add. If you feel that the mixture is too thick then add an additional tbsp of milk.

Pour into your greased loaf tin and smooth out the top of the cake batter.

Pop into the middle shelf of your oven and bake for 45mins, checking at 40mins with a skewer into the deepest part of your cake. You may need an additional 5-10mins depending on your oven and flour. Every oven is different, every flour bakes differently.



If you wanted to add additional flavours, you can add the zest of a lemon, or chocolate chips. Glacé cherries work really well too.

Have fun baking this one! Remember we can deliver free range eggs and flour in your home delivery box. Check our website for all of the types of flour we can supply.

### OLD DOWN AND BEGGARWOOD WILDLIFE GROUP

Despite the terrible past year Spring has sprung (that's the wonder of nature and our world) and on

both sites the butterflies and bees are emerging. Some of the early butterflies are the *Brimstone*, *Peacock* and *Small Tortoiseshell*. The early bees are usually the queen *Bumble bees* and these can be seen flying about looking for a suitable nesting site. Also around are various species of the *Mining bee*. These are smaller than bumble bees. As the name suggests they dig out a hole in the ground for their nests.

Old Down is a good site for many species of butterflies and for some years has been recognised by Butterfly Conservation as the Hampshire stronghold of the Small Blue. There were several transect counts of over 100 during 2020 including a staggering count of 296 on 27 May last year. The total number of Small Blues seen in 2020 was 919 – which is very impressive.

This is the time of year when the wildflowers start to show on the Old Down meadow and the wildflower areas within Beggarwood. Sadly, it is likely

that the displays will not be as good as previous years, especially on Old Down, as a consequence of the heavy footfall. The Council did not carry out its usual mowing regime on the meadow last year and thus the footpaths are not so defined and this is resulting in people wandering all over and thus trampling the vegetation.

Good news - work parties have re-started on both sites. On Old Down we have planted some wildflower plugs and some dog rose. We have also started to tackle the invasive dogwood which has really spread because we have been unable to keep it in check during the last 12 months.

### PROBUS HEARS OF THREE PYRENEAN ADVENTURES

Probus Club member, retired RAF Squadron Leader, Chris Perkins MVO, talked about his recollections of three backpacking expeditions to the French and Spanish Pyrenees some four decades ago. They were "home spun" adventures involving experienced members of the Royal Air Force Mountain Rescue Service, although the last trip was with those with little or no mountaineering experience providing a trekking experience second to none.

As a boy, in the immediate post war suburbia of south Birmingham, he always held an interest in the great outdoors. Birthday, Christmas and pocket money was spent sourcing items of ex-military maps, rucksacks and compasses. Only after embarking on his RAF Service in the 1960s could he afford to purchase up to date clothing and equipment and eventually joined the RAF Mountain Rescue Service.



A decade later, he was persuaded to put together a 'trekking adventure' to the French/Spanish Pyrenees. Being a military sponsored expedition, permissions had to be obtained and diplomatic clearance achieved for them to operate in the border area. They were challenged on the first two expeditions by the French National Gendarmerie as Basque separatists were active in the area. This worked to their advantage for the third trip as a liaison had



been established with the Gendarmerie unit based at their start point in Bagneres de Luchon: an ideal location to securely leave valuables, a change of clothing, camp overnight and 'clean up' prior to the long rail journey back to base.

None had experienced travelling in the area during July. The scarce information that could be gleaned, described fantastic rocky ridges and peaks, permanent glaciers and high valleys holding year-round snow and ice. On the first expedition, they kitted themselves out with normal RAF Mountain Rescue winter mountaineering clothing and equipment as if tackling a winter trip to the Scottish Cairngorms or Glencoe. Combined with the heavy tentage of the time, all rucksack loads exceeded 60lbs with tinned food for a couple of weeks.

The plan was to set up a base camp just inside the National Park boundary and each day make exploratory excursions, some with overnight bivouacs to look at various glaciers, mountain huts and suitable routes to gain the frontier peaks. They looked very strange 'apparitions' toiling up the steep, but well-defined lower tracks loaded up and perspiring profusely. In temperatures well over 30 degrees, they were overtaken by folk trekking in their shorts, 'T' shirts and walking trainers, all carrying lightweight overnight sacs and plenty of water. They were bound for French Alpine Club mountain huts below the snowline where accommodation and food could be provided - at a cost. Utilising these 'facilities' and locating camps nearby, the RAF team were able to access the upper snowfield couloirs, peaks and frontier ridge thus saving the gruelling descent and climb each day.

Much was learnt from that first excursion into the area. Looking across into Spain more incredible mountain ridges were seen, and above the snowline, only a few experienced climbers and the alpinists of the Gendarmerie were encountered. Some access valleys and rocky passes in the area had been utilised by the Resistance during WW2 taking Allied Evaders into Spain. This knowledge set the scene for a return next year to expand the trip into a 'lightweight trekking expedition' taking ten days crossing into Spain, climbing the highest peak in the Pyrenees, Pic de Aneto and returning via a steep and rocky pass over the frontier.



Each trip they travelled by train from London, with the Hovercraft used to cross the Channel from Dover. Also, instead of sitting upright in crowded, bench seated carriages, couchette compartments were utilised. However, on the return journey some French passengers allocated overnight beds in a couple of their compartments, were unimpressed with odours radiating from two weeks of backpacking kit.

They had gained access to a remote and completely unspoilt, beautiful area of the Pyrenees for these expeditions. Unforgettable adventures for all and extremely gratifying. It is hoped that with the passage of decades, climate change causing glacier melt, mass holidays for all and the advent of motor vehicle incursion into those mountains, that the area has not changed for ever!

We had such a wonderful end to the spring term at Hatch Warren Under Fives; it's hard to believe we're now into our final term!





Spring term was all about springtime — the children learnt all about the season of spring and all about baby farm animals too. In the lead up to the holidays we enjoyed lots of Easter activities, we made Easter bonnets and wreaths, painted eggs, made Easter nest cakes, found lots of eggs hidden around the garden and we even had a visit from the Easter bunny who arrived with a basket full of chocolate eggs for everyone.

We have created lots of different role play areas in our home corner over the last few weeks, but the children's favourite has definitely been the farm shop. - · Confidence and self-esteem
- Can take turns and share
- · Can sit still for a short period
- Can separate from parents/carers
- Communication and language skills needed to communicate needs and listen to others
- Can actively learn and creatively and critically think

Some of these characteristics may of course be difficult for all children to achieve and this shouldn't leave parents or practitioners concerned that a child isn't school ready.

### SEA OF PURPLE HAS A SPECIAL MEANING

### **Purple 4 Polio**

Earlier in the spring you may have noticed masses of purple crocus on banks and open spaces around our local towns and villages. These crocuses have been planted to draw attention to Rotary's Purple 4 Polio campaign. Locally some of the crocus corms were supplied by Rotary and planted by local organisations as part of local projects. Basingstoke Deane Rotary distributed 3000 corms last autumn which were planted around the borough and were in full flower this spring.

Rotary has been working to eradicate polio for more than 35 years. Our goal to rid the world of this disease is closer than ever. But why Purple 4 Polio? In the early days of administering the vaccine it was given on a sugar cube. The younger children in places such as India thought it was a sweet and would join the queue again for a second sweet. To identify the children who had been vaccinated their little finger was painted with a purple dye. Hence Purple 4 Polio. It is now administered orally by dropping the required dose directly into the mouth using a dispenser.

As a founding partner of the Global Polio Eradication Initiative, Rotary has reduced polio cases by 99.9 percent since our first project to vaccinate children in the Philippines in 1979. Today, polio remains endemic only in Afghanistan and Pakistan. But it's crucial to continue working to keep other countries polio-free. If all eradication efforts stopped today, within 10 years, polio could paralyse as many as 200,000 children each year. Rotary has contributed more than \$2.1 billion to polio eradication since it launched the PolioPlus programme in 1985, and it's committed to raising \$50 million each year for polio eradication activities.

Because of a 2-to-I matching agreement with the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, that means that, each year, \$150 million goes toward fulfilling Rotary's promise to the children of the world: No child will ever again suffer the devastating, paralysing and crippling effects of polio. Proof of how effective vaccination can be.

Be wary of unsolicited emails, texts or adverts offering unbelievably good deals on tickets. If it sounds too good to be true, it probably is.

The developers, Newlands, are acting as spokesmen for Amazon with whom they are working in anticipation of a completed financial deal.

Maria Miller MP, Kit Malthouse MP, and four other local MPs have jointly requested that the Secretary of State grants their request to launch a public enquiry which would make the final decision on these applications. The future of a new hospital in Basingstoke could be threatened by the possible warehouse development, as the existing infrastructure would not support traffic from both the hospital and warehouses on junction 7.






