

DID YOU KNOW WE TALK ABOUT MENTAL HEALTH ALL OF THE TIME?

So you have heard the messages, we need to talk about mental health. I even have a big sign in my office saying that exact phrase. But would it surprise you to know that we actually talk about mental health all the time? What we need to do better is 'Listen' to mental health in our everyday conversations. In my day to day training through Simpila Mental Health, I help people to connect their minds to the understanding that mental health is something that we all have. Firstly we have to raise awareness of this simple fact, we cannot deny the reality that we have mental health, and every decision that we make will have a mental impact, and no surprise that this can be defined as either a positive or negative impact. We actually talk about mental health much more than we realise.

Let me give some examples and see if you can spot the signs of mental health in the narrative.

"I am really worried about my workload and the expectations of my manager"

"I am excited to see my friends at the weekend" (social restrictions being adhered to of course)

"I am waiting for the results of a biopsy"

"I am really enjoying getting outside in the sunshine"

Can you spot the signs of mental health? Would you know how to approach a conversation and listen to someone talk about their experiences?

The key to understanding how mental health changes is to listen. We are all born with the ability to listen to others, yet this skill is often compromised with our opinions and views. So we need to listen without judgement. If we can learn to put our opinions aside we can find a much great connection with others — also known as Empathy. Empathy is the ability to connect to the feelings of others, to see the world from their perspective, and sometimes just to sit alongside them for support.

So, there is nothing to stop you now from just sitting down with someone, ask them how they are feeling?, and hear the words

spoken. This is the first step in talking more about mental health.

Red Nose Day - Comic Relief 2021

Red Nose Day is an annual event with the mission to end poverty, abuse and mental health problems by funding programmes that keep people safe, healthy, and educated. Through the power of entertainment, people are brought together to laugh and have fun, all while raising life-changing money for the people that need it the most. It is also celebrated to make the public laugh; hence the reason that we wear the famous red noses.

This special day was founded in 1985, by Richard Curtis and his friends. They came up with the idea to use humour to raise cash for charity, to help change lives in Africa and the UK. On Christmas Day 1985, 'Comic Relief' was launched; live

on BBC One from the Safawa Refugee Camp in Sudan. The concept behind Red Nose Day was to have one day of the year when everyone does something silly or funny to raise money for Comic Relief, a non-profit organisation. 1988 marked the year of the first Red Nose Day, with over 150 celebrities taking part. 30 million people helped raise £15 million. This year's Comic Relief raised over £52 million.

This year, Brighton Hill Community School did their bit for Comic Relief despite the Covid related restrictions:

- BHCS presented... The Masked Singer! Seven amazing staff sung their hearts out, creating incredible (and humorous) performances. Cowboy, Alien, Firefighter, Scream's Daughter, Panda, Phoenix and Zebra were our contestants:

- Alien was the tremendous Miss Paterson, with her extraordinary singing.
- Firefighter was the theatrical Mrs

- Cowboy was the stunning Mr Head Riordan who really strutted his stuff.
- Panda was the terrific Mr Du-Heaume bringing fresh footwork to the show.
- And finally, Zebra, who wore a striking costume, was the one and only Mr Beeching.

All of the staff's amazing singing contributed to the fantastic £1053.48 we raised as a school for Comic Relief!

COUNCILLOR'S UPDATE

MERGING OF CHURCH PARISHES:

the Diocese of Winchester is creating a new single parish that unites Immanuel Church in Danebury Road with St Mark's in Kempshott. Revd Nicola Such (currently Vicar at St Mark's Church) will cover the new parish. The Reverend May Barker has been offered and has accepted the post of HalfTime (0.5) Incumbent of the United Benefice of St Stephen's North Mundham and St Leodegar's Hunston in the Diocese of Chichester. Personally, I am sad at the news that we will be losing our local church leader. Rev May, and before her Father Michael, have been towers of strength in our community and it feels like a successful era coming to an end at a time when our population is set to increase. The changes will take effect at the end of this month.

The HATCH WARREN COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION is advertising its Annual General Meeting which is planned for Wednesday 9th June at 7.30pm. Present intentions are to hold the meeting virtually, via Zoom. If you would like to attend, please register through the HWCA website. The trustees face a big challenge in resuming activities again after the lockdowns, and this will be an opportunity to hear how they plan to tackle the task. The meeting needs a minimum of 25 attendees to be quorate.

FOOTPATH 701 CLOSURE: There was some confusion caused by the publication of an order closing part of Footpath 701 that runs through Heritage Park which is not needed for public use. The history is that this path was built over when Heritage Park was constructed and the 'closure' is simply a tidying-up exercise.

GOLF COURSE DEVELOPMENT: Bloor Homes have published more details of their evolving plans for the Golf Course site. The first 'reserved matters' application has been lodged with the Borough Council and covers Phase I of the development comprising 227 new homes including 91 affordable, 7 hectares of open space and the proposed road and path layouts. If you would like to study the proposals, the planning reference is 21/01323/RES. You can comment through the Borough Council's website.

DANEBURY ROAD POSTS: The post protecting the field in Danebury Road that I reported missing last year was recently joined by another. It is not known who removed them in the first place, but the risk of having one or more posts missing is that the gap could permit illegal trespass onto the field. The Borough Council has now replaced them both.

AMAZING RESPONSE TO OAK TREES PETITION: A petition has been started to save the 70 oak trees that line the access to Oakdown Farm, where permission has been granted to build a warehouse. When

I checked last, the number of signatories had passed 93,000, which is really quite remarkable. If you are interested in this issue, more information can be found at change.org and on the sites of local pressure groups SWAG and CAGE.

YOUR COUNCILLORS: At the elections on 6th May, Hatch Warren and Beggarwood elected Rebecca Bean, Samir Kotecha and Dan Putty as Borough Councillors. Stephen Reid was returned as County Councillor for the Basingstoke South West division. After these 'all out' elections, the pattern will now revert to having a vote for one Borough Councillor each year and a County Councillor in the fourth year.

COUNCILLORS' GRANT SCHEME:

I am expecting the County Councillors' 'devolved budget' scheme to start again on 1st June. If you have an important project that requires a little funding, I would be delighted to discuss it.

AND FINALLY ... a lot of people are sad that Terri Reid has stood down as one of our Borough Councillors after eleven years. She had a reputation for getting things done and I am better placed than anyone to know just how much work she put into the job. On everyone's behalf I say 'thank you' to Terri for her services to this ward.

RECIPE

This months recipe is a really easy white bread. You can bake it in a tin or as a flat bread or dinner rolls. You can mix other ingredients with it too. This is a bread where you don't need to knead it so much, so easier on your hands and wrists.

Versatile white bread

570g bread flour 360g water at room temp (20°) 15g olive oil/sunflower oil 12g salt

10g fresh yeast or 1 sachet of instant yeast Dissolve fresh yeast into the water, for instant yeast, follow the directions on the packet.

Combine all ingredients and mix to form a stiff dough.

Knead with a small amount of oil on your work surface for 2 minutes until cohesive.

Place dough in a lightly oiled bowl and cover with a tea towel or cling film and allow to prove for 10 minutes on kitchen worktop.

Take out and knead again for 1-2 minutes on a lightly oiled surface.

Place back in the bowl and leave for another 10 minutes.

Knead again on a lightly oiled surface for I-2 minutes and return to the bowl until doubled in size approx I-2hrs.

Turn out onto a floured surface.

Measure into desired sizes, mould into rounds and rest on your worktop for 10-15mins. (We made a small loaf, 4 small dinner rolls and a focaccia out of our mix).

Mould into your desired shape, small log shape for tins, balls for rolls, flatten your flat breads and use your finger tips to dimple the top of the focaccia.

Transfer into tins or on to a baking sheet and cover with oiled cling film and prove for 45 mins. Cover your focaccia with olive oil and before baking, top with whatever takes your fancy.

Baking times:

Set your oven to as hot as it will go and when you put the breads in, turn down to 220°. Ovens vary so check on your bakes.

Large loaf 30-35 mins

Small loaf 5-28 mins

Rolls 10-12 minutes depending on size

Focaccia and flat breads, bake in a really hot oven for around 15 minutes.

As always we'd love to see what you've made. Show us pictures of your focaccia toppings, we might even use them in the bakery!

KEMPSHOTT CONSERVATION GROUP

Eruptions in Down Grange Meadow. This conical shaped lump was nearly 50cm high and most of that was soil. Another spherical version can be seen in the background to the left. These are nests of the Yellow Ant

(Lasius flavus). As the Council has not cut the grass in three or four years, the ant mounds continue to build up. We are keen to encourage these colonial nesters as they provide shelter for the over-wintering larvae and pupae of Common and Small Blue butterflies. Both species of larvae "sing" to attract the ants. They also secrete a "honeydew" like substance that the ants enjoy and take down into their nest to live out the winter.

An even rarer species, the Large Blue, which has been re-introduced to a number of sites due to its catastrophic decline, has



turned the mutually beneficial relationship with ants on its head. Here, the Large Blue larvae get taken into the nest of a red ant (Myrnica scabriondis) where they prey on the grubs of their hosts. Their predations can sometimes destroy the colony. A real cuckoo in the nest!

Watch out for this one! One or two Barn Owls have set up home on a farm in the Oakley area. One was



seen around sunset during the warm spell in April. It did a few circuits around the farm but then headed off eastwards. Did it reach our area we wonder?


It's worth looking out for this now uncommon bird. Quite unmistakable and a delight to watch as it hunts silently looking for voles at dusk. Please do tell us if you see one.

OLD DOWN AND BEGGARWOOD WILDLIFE GROUP

There was some welcome rain last month which perked up the cowslips on the meadows. But the

display on Old Down is not really up to its usual standard – the top part of the meadow is looking lovely but not so the lower part. There appear to be so many more wild strawberries on the sites this spring – the white flowers look so pretty along the verges. Unfortunately last month there were frosts at night which has not been good for insects. Many will not have survived the frosts and already the effect can be seen in that there are definitely less

bees, butterflies and other insects around. In particular there are less moths and this is really bad for bats and some bird species. So it seems that this year there are likely to be fewer insects to pollinate the spring blossoms – such as apple and cherry.

You may be aware of the recently approved planning permission for distribution warehouses at Oakdown and junction 7 M3. It is of great concern that Basingstoke Council has totally ignored the significant impacts this development will have on local biodiversity and the Nature Recovery Network and its own policies in respect of biodiversity, green

infrastructure and tackling climate change. Particularly disappointing is the fact that Basingstoke Council has approved the destruction of a woodland corridor of 67 mature oak trees. 3 mature beech trees and a further 13 oak trees. For decades these trees have been providing habitats to many species and are a core part of the local Nature Recovery Network and the development will block wildlife movement between some very old copses adjacent to the site. Surely if the development must go ahead, the retention of the trees could be a requirement of the permission. There is a petition asking that the Council debate the issue of the destruction of the trees. Perhaps you would be prepared to support this and sign the petition – it can be found on change.org/saveoakdownoaks.

PROBUS HEARS ABOUT MEETING PRINCE PHILIP

Like most of the nation, following the passing of the Prince Philip, Duke of Edinburgh on 9th April, Probus Club of Basingstoke member Stephen Thair was sure that he was not the only member with reminiscences of this man who had been present throughout his life. One memory was from many years ago and in a far-off land.

"I was fortunate to meet him briefly on the Queen's Silver Jubilee Tour of the Commonwealth in 1977, when I was working as a Barrister and Solicitor in the Department of Justice, in Port Moresby, Papua New Guinea" explained Stephen. "With my wife, Margaret, we had arrived there In April 1975, and so were able to watch some of the ceremonies when the country achieved independence in September that year, when Prince Charles came to do the honours, so to speak."

At the time of the Silver Jubilee Tour, he was running a Junior Scout Troup of mainly expatriate boys (the PNG equivalent of a Cub Pack) with another leader, an Australian Scouter called Geoff. The final engagement of the Queen and Prince Philip in Papua New Guinea before they left for the next leg of their journey was to inspect an assembly of PNG Scouts and Guides. They were lined up for the royal inspection in a giant horse-shoe on the Murray Barracks' parade ground in Port Moresby, with the Guides forming one side of the horse-shoe, and the Scouts the other.

The Scouts and Guides being wellorganised were all in position for I I am, when the inspection was due to commence, with the pipe band of the Pacific Islands Regiment behind them. However, I I am came and went, with no sign of the royal party. The tropical sun rose ever higher in the sky over the parade ground, and it was, to say the least, very hot. Eventually, at around midday, the Queen and Prince Philip and their escort arrived. The Pacific Islands Regiment band began to play, and the Queen and Prince Philip began their inspections, accompanied in each case by the great and the good of PNG Guiding and Scouting.

"Our troop was in line with me at one end of it, and Geoff at the other end. We had other Scout Groups either side of us. Prince Philip and his party were about two groups away from us on the inspection, when the boy standing next to Geoff fainted because of the heat, and Geoff had to carry him off to the shade of a tree where fortunately he revived. However, by then Prince Philip had arrived at our Group, and so Geoff missed out, and I was the only representative for him to speak to."

"Prince Philip asked me what I was doing in the country and when I had explained, he asked if I was enjoying it – which I was – and then moved on. He was perfectly pleasant to me. I had been a bit anxious as my father had told me a story of a solicitor friend of his who had been introduced to Prince Philip at an event of some kind, and when he replied to a question from Prince Philip as to what he did, received the comment "Oh no, not another b* * * * y solicitor!".

Thus, another interesting PNG experience drew to a close. Stephen always felt marginally guilty that Geoff missed out on a Prince Philip encounter, although in fairness it could just as easily have been the boy next to him who fainted!





APRIL MEETING

This month we read 'American Dirt' written by Jeanine Cummins and what a read it was! We all agreed it was not



a book we would have chosen to read had we judged it on the title, cover and jacket notes but it was completely unputdownable!

The story commenced with a very violent attack leaving Lydia and her young son Luca with no option but to flee their happy family life in Acapulco and head for the USA and safety from the drug cartel. We followed their journey with our hearts in our mouths not quite believing the hardships they had to endure along the way. Some of us followed their journey on maps and looked at YouTube clips of their daring train rides. In fact 19 readers scored this book very highly giving it many 10s and taking it straight to the top beating last month's read and scoring an average of 9.34. We really recommend this read.

This book caused much controversy when it was first published in America as people felt it should only have been written by someone who had been through the experience of that journey.





THE YARD

This is somewhere really different to go for a snack or light lunch with great coffee.

As the address suggests, the Yard is a converted 19th century cattle barn within the confines of Chilton Manor Farm. Driving down the B3046 from Farleigh Wallop it is easy to miss the small sign and the satnav wanted to go about 200 metres beyond the right turn into the farm track.

Visiting on the Saturday before the relaxation of lockdown rules meant that there were no internal tables but a large, tented, gazebo had been installed literally outside in the yard complete with lighting and electric heaters. We were thankful that it gave good cover and comfort against the persistent rain. However, by the time the Rabbiter goes to press they will have resumed the inside seating arrangements.

Only open on Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays from 9.00 am -4.00 pm they have started hosting events evenings and the whole building can be booked for private occasions.

The Yard has a simple menu offering dependent on whether it is after 12 noon when they stop serving breakfast. We had sourdough toasties, with Madam having cheese and leek and I had ham and cheese. Two almond croissants and two Americanos completed what turned out to be quite a substantial meal for £22. There were many delicious looking cakes to tempt customers as well as a well-stocked ice cream selection.

An adjacent building is home to Moonroast the specialist coffee roasters.

The Yard is clearly popular with the cycling fraternity as there was at least a dozen there with Lycra shorts, crash helmets and tinted sunglasses while their machines were kept tidy in a bike rack. Even on a rainy day there was a steady stream of customers, many with young children and dogs but as the car park is at

least 100 metres away hopefully the rain will have stopped when we visit again, which without a doubt we will.

CHINEHAM & SHERFIELD PARK SCARECROW TRAIL 24TH- 25TH JULY






