

❖ I smiled when I read in The Rabbiter Cllr Reid's explanation for the uncut grass on our estates. Cllr Reid must think his constituents are naive. He says council 'problems' and a 'green initiative' are behind our once nice estates looking like something out of the third world.

Had the council actually planted wild flowers there might be some strength to his argument, but the reality is waist-high weeds everywhere you look. And a quick call to the council offices revealed that the real reason grass is not cut is in fact financial cutbacks.

So despite the level of Council Tax paid by residents of Hatch Warren and Beggarwood, we're left with uncut verges and open spaces leading to: lines of sight at junctions being blocked, an increase in ticks (with the risk of Lyme disease), dog owners unable to clear up dog poo because it's now hidden in long grass; increased allergic symptoms for those suffering from hay fever, more rats and mice, overhanging metre-high nettles and places where once our children could play, now thick with weeds.

To be fair to Cllr Putty, he did his best to get something done, but apparently the green lobby among the Tory council is so strong that the 'back to nature' brigade won't hear of our estates being tidied up.

BUYING A PROPERTY THROUGH THE SHARED OWNERSHIP SCHEME

Taking that first step on the property ladder can seem daunting especially in today's climate with house prices at record high levels.

For those who are not able to buy a property on the open market, it is worth considering going down the shared ownership route, which makes buying a property more affordable for many firsttime buyers.

Trish Coutts, who is a conveyancer working in the Residential Property Team at Phillips specialises in working with first-time buyers and dealing with shared ownership transactions. She said: "In essence shared ownership is a tried and tested way of buying a percentage of a property and involves paying rent on the remaining share that you do not own."

This year the Government has implemented several changes which should make the scheme accessible to more people.

Those who are purchasing under the new Shared Ownership Affordable Homes Programme 2021-2026 are now able to buy a smaller share in the property to begin with.

"Until April this year, the minimum you could buy into a shared ownership property was 25%," said Trish.

"This has now been changed to just 10% with first-time owners paying rent on the remaining 90%. This is especially good for people who would have had difficulties in putting together a larger deposit."

Properties on existing developments will still be limited to a first-time purchase of a minimum of 25%.

One of the benefits of the Shared Ownership Scheme is that when you can afford it, you can increase the share you hold in the property. Trish said: "This is known as staircasing and enables a purchaser to buy a larger percentage of the property."

However, Trish points out that you will need to pay for legal and mortgage fees each time you increase your share by staircasing. "It may make better sense to save up for a bigger share and staircase in one go rather than do this several times over a certain period," suggests Trish.



COUNCILLOR'S UPDATE

WAREHOUSE AT JUNCTION 7: at the time of writing there is still no news on the request by local MPs for the Secretary of State to 'call in' the decision of the Borough Council to approve the first warehouse at Oakdown Farm. I wondered whether this meant that further work was being carried out during the unusual hiatus period, perhaps to review the traffic and transport figures, but have been advised that this is not the case. At the same time, there is no announcement yet regarding Dummer Parish Council's request that the Development Committee meeting be re-run, in the light of errors they allege in the advice given to Councillors. Local campaigners have renewed the call for residents to sign the petition calling for the protection of the 70 mature trees, of which 67 are oaks, at the entrance to the site.

PATIENTS' PARTICIPATION GROUP: the Beggarwood Surgery's PPG invited Maria Miller MP and representatives of the Clinical Commissioning Group to a recent meeting, where the major item on the agenda was the tendering process for a new operator to take over the surgery when North Hampshire Urgent Care's contract comes to an end. I attended as an observer. Wanting to choose an operator that is best for our local community, the CCG has made what I think is a significant offer: the Chair of the PPG will be allowed to observe the presentations given by the potential operators and to comment afterwards. This will ensure that the patients have a voice during the decision-making process. The other pieces of positive news at the PPG were that NHUC has agreed to stay on a few months longer to help achieve a good transition.

CHURCH PARISH REORGANISATION: as part of the process of merging the Immanuel and St Mark's Parishes, the Church steering group has been considering a new name. The most popular one put forward at their recent Vision Days was 'The Parish of Basingstoke Down'. This is an historic

name for the geographical area that covers Kempshott, Beggarwood and Hatch Warren. The two churches will keep their individual names.

COUNCILLOR GRANT SCHEME: The Warren at Hatch Warren Community Centre is operating its activities for young people during the summer holidays and I have been pleased to approve a grant to help them, from my County Councillor devolved budget. I have also been able to help fund a new storage shed for the local Guides/Brownies. Now that the grants scheme is open again, I would be pleased to hear from other organisations that I might be able to assist.

VACCINATIONS: All patients at the Beggarwood surgery aged 18+ have now been invited for their COVID vaccination. If you think that you have been missed, please contact the surgery. It increasingly looks as if 'double-jabbed status' is being viewed as essential for some activities.

THE HATCH WARREN NATURE GROUP: has reported positive effects from the decision to leave more areas free for nature. St Mark's meadow had a plant survey visit from the North Hampshire Recorder of the Botanical Society of the British Isles (BSBI). The most gratifying comment was "This is what a meadow should be". The site has been created through restoration rather than recovering entirely naturally but the plants are those associated with the kind of soils and conditions that exist there and it will change considerably as it matures. The nature group has pictures on its website.

Related to this, the BIODIVERSITY IMPROVEMENT ZONE has generated considerable discussion. It sees some areas of grass being left uncut. I was asked whether there had been any consultation on this. Yes, the Borough Council did seek residents' views, including a survey and a drop-in day at the Community Centre, ending on 20 March last year. The web address for more information is https://www.basingstoke.gov. uk/hatchwarren-and-beggarwood-biz. A total of 153 species of herbaceous plant and

grasses were found – an excellent variety for a town location. Species included favourites such as creeping buttercups in the spring and dandelions and daisies. Forget-me-not and Speedwell were also common as were clovers and the white flowers of wild carrot and yarrow. The grassland structure became more varied and species of butterflies, bees, grasshoppers and spiders all benefited from increased food sources and places to live.

BROADMERE ROAD ADOPTIONS: I have made further enquiries about the adoption of the roads around the Co-op. It appears that this issue, affecting hundreds of people, is still being stalled by a dispute regarding one property that may have extended its boundary to incorporate a drainage facility. The developers are attempting to resolve the matter. In the meantime I have asked that the road markings in the Co-op area be renewed as they are badly faded, and the County Council has forwarded this request to the developers.

PARKING PLEA: St Mark's School has issued a fresh plea to drivers dropping off or collecting pupils to use the community centre for parking their cars. There have been instances of people parking near the busy Woodbury Road junction and even using a resident's private driveway.

NEW HOSPITAL: the 'Hampshire Together' group. of which I am a member, continues to meet. Although the consultation timescale has slowed, planning is still going ahead for the A30 site.

NEW PORTFOLIO: Following the local elections I am delighted to have been reappointed to the Cabinet at Hampshire County Council. I have a new portfolio, who covers HR matters, Performance and Partnerships. In connection with this, I am looking forward to learning more about the work being done in supporting families, addressing issues that could escalate into serious problems later, if left untouched.



OLD DOWN AND BEGGARWOOD WILDLIFE GROUP

What a mixture of weather we have had over the last two months – dry, hot, very hot, windy,

cool, wet and very wet. But through it all the wildflowers on both sites have flourished and bloomed and the butterflies, bees and insects have just carried on regardless.

On both sites there is quite an abundance of *Common Ragwort* this year (the Group pulls some quite regularly but hasn't been able to keep up in the last two years due to lockdowns and restrictions). Ragwort is a beautiful rich yellow and stands tall

within the meadows but, as you may know, it is poisonous to cattle and horses (affects the liver). Thus farmers with livestock will clear ragwort from their fields. However, insects and butterflies love ragwort and in particular the cinnabar moth (day flying) lays its eggs on ragwort. The caterpillars consume the plant and the plant toxins build up in their bodies and this deters predators. The Group therefore deliberately leaves some ragwort around. Another beautiful rich yellow flower found in around meadows is *St John's Wort*. The two plants look similar and so are often confused but close-to the difference in

petals and leaves is obvious. On the St. John's Wort the filaments on the flowers are much longer and there are only five petals. (see photos)

The teasel on both sites has also done well this year and it too is very popular with insects. The purple flowers of the teasel bloom around the head in a circle starting at the bottom and working up in stages so there is never a full head of purple. Years ago the dried teasel heads were used to brush up the nap on cloth — and that is where the word "teasing" comes from.

HATCH WARREN UNDER FIVES

We've been looking forward to welcoming our children back to Hatch Warren Under Fives after the summer break, and it's been great to meet our new children too.

The start of a brand new term can be a difficult time for young children and the first few weeks of settling into a new environment is a time of crucial importance to a child's later happiness within a setting. Our first few weeks are always about settling in and helping our children make new friends and get to know staff. All children are individuals, and while some children will adjust fairly easily and quickly to a new environment and new routines, others will take longer to feel comfortable and secure. At Hatch Warren Under Fives we work hard to ensure that all children settle happily.

Our first topic "All About Me" is a great chance for the children to learn all about themselves, their new friends and their families. We use stories, arts, crafts and songs to help our children discover what is unique and special about themselves and each other:

As the weather is still good we will be using our outdoor learning environment as much as possible and we have some great activities planned for extending our children's learning outdoors. We'll also be learning about autumn this term and exploring colours, outdoor sounds and hibernating animals. And we'll be holding weekly cooking sessions and weekly science experiments too.

HWU5s and the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS)

HatchWarren Under Fives work to the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) framework in all our activities. The EYFS sets standards for the learning, development and care of children from birth to five years old.

At the start of any new academic year change is ahead for our little ones. Will they see new teachers? Stay at preschool for a longer amount of time without Mummy or Daddy? Will they be starting their school journey for the very first time?

One of the areas of the EYFS is 'PSED' which stands for Personal, Social and Emotional Development, A large part of what we do here at Hatch Warren Under Fives is to ensure that we bond with your children and encourage their confidence building. We would encourage and observe a little one to see if, between the ages of 22 and 36 months, they can separate from their main carer with support and encouragement and also express their own interests and preferences. After a demanding year of getting used to school life with Covid in our lives, the final

summer term was no less busy!

PROBUS HEARS ABOUT THE 80TH ANNIVERSARY OF DOUGLAS BADER'S OPERATION LEG

Many Probus Club members can remember the 1956 film "Reach For The Sky" starring Kenneth Moore as the legless WW2 fighter ace, Wing Commander Douglas Bader. However, very few members knew that it was an aeroplane from 18 Squadron, now based at RAF Odiham, that made the drop of a replacement limb bound for the Luftwaffe hospital holding Bader. Coincidently, this August marks the eightieth anniversary since Bader was shot down over German occupied France on 9 August 1941.

Probus Club of Basingstoke member, retired RAF Squadron Leader Chris Perkins MVO, explained how he came across a faded WW2 photograph of three young aircrew whilst recently researching archives at RAF Odiham, which started his investigation into this historic event.

Douglas Bader only managed to bail out of his stricken Spitfire after a leather strap broke, leaving his right prothesis jammed in the rudder pedals. His artificial leg was returned to him at a Luftwaffe hospital after some repairs, but a replacement was really needed.

The German authorities reported his safe arrival and status as a PoW and requested

that a new leg be delivered. They offered safe passage by the Luftwaffe but the British realised the important propaganda opportunity this offered the enemy, so decided instead to use an aircraft involved in a nearby bombing mission to parachute drop the replacement limb.

The faded photograph was of the crew of a Blenheim light bomber of 18 Squadron. They were non-commissioned sergeant aircrew with a 19-year-old Canadian pilot and two twenty something Englishmen as observer and air gunner. They had only been on the squadron a month before the mission to drop the artificial leg came their way and they survived only eleven missions. Their names are listed amongst the 55,000 other airmen lost in Bomber Command during WW2.

As you will see from the picture the Portsmouth Arms is blessed with outside space, making it very easy for a rather large "market" to take place. We open from 10am to 14:00 every Saturday. Stalls change every week and we have a varied lot attending each and every week. No two Saturdays are the same!

RESTAURANT REVIEW

TYLNEY HALL HOTEL

Rotherwick, Hook, RG27 9AZ 01256 764881

Ringing up on Monday hoping to book lunch for the next Sunday, or at the latest the Sunday after, I was offered a choice of I2 noon, I.00 pm or 2.00 pm and was pleasantly surprised that the first Sunday was available.

Selecting the middle time, Madam and I arrived at Tylney Hall in Rotherwick just after 12.30 pm and desirous of a small tincture before lunch we turned into the lounge to be met with a fairly full room and not much choice of seating. A lectern confirmed our lunch booking and at the suggestion of the maître'd decided to have a G &T at our lunch table.

Shown into the Oak Room restaurant we were seated in the bay window with wonderful views of an avenue of impressive pine trees with the lawns descended into the far distance. While there was a lady tinkling the ivories there were few people dining. Even after the 2.00 pm time came there was only 60 percent of tables occupied so it was a mystery where all the people seen in the lounge were consumed in this impressive Victorian edifice.

Surprisingly, the menu offering was quite restrictive, perhaps a reflection on the fall out from the Covid restrictions and reduced staffing levels. There were five choices each of starters and mains and four desserts including a cheese board. We ate almost in concert except for the dessert.

A bottle of still water was accompanied by a selection of bread rolls with salty butter and our starter was a beautifully presented goat's cheese with figs, carrot shaving and a few drops of sauce. Of course, we both had the roast sirloin of beef with a large Yorkshire pudding and selection of vegetables. Wanting well done meat we were disappointed that it seemed that a grill had been put to good use to turn medium slices into our preference.

Some wine, madam? The wine list was quite extensive ranging from 2019 Malbec at £36 up to £1150 for a 1994 Chateau Latour. I had a glass of Merlot while Madam one of Sauvignon Blanc.

Dessert was Tiramisu for the lady, which was a large cube of chocolate tasting sponge, with no sign of coffee flavouring, and rather than an accompaniment of raspberry sorbet she had double cream. I had the grilled pineapple which came with a quenelle of vanilla ice cream.

Two Americano coffees completed what had been a pleasant occasion although it never was going to be a cheap lunch. The two lunches were $\pounds 65$ but with the drinks, coffee and the inclusive 10% service charge this doubled to a few pence under $\pounds 130$. Was it worth it? Probably, because it is not possible to put a price on

the ambiance of Tylney Hall.


