43 million people in the world are blind 1.2 billion need glasses to see better

World Sight Day, now in its 9th consecutive year, comes once again to a stand in Old Basing Mall courtesy of The Basingstoke Lions Club.

On a global scale, the aim of this day, on which Lions Clubs around the world conduct various sight-related projects, is to focus attention on the universal issue of avoidable blindness and visual impairment and thus raise awareness about the importance of eye health and the need for quality eye care services for all.

Lions' activities include vision screenings, eye health education programmes, and the donation of assistive devices to those with vision impairment. In this last regard therefore and as in previous years, people are invited to bring their redundant spectacles – prescription, non-prescription and sunglasses – to the Lions stand where they will also find information on sight loss, small items of equipment which can assist with the daily living challenges of visually impaired people and advice on local sources of help.

Around I/I.30pm the Club's very own "Lennie the Basingstoke Lion" may be spotted 'on the prowl, when he drops in on Leightons, Vision Express and Prime Opticians in the Town Centre to collect the haul of spectacles already donated by their own customers.

An additional facility this year will be a spectacle collection point in Morrisons Supermarket from Monday I I th October for the whole week, thus providing an alternative option for those who might find that preferable.

Spectacles are the most common and least expensive method of correcting refractive errors, the largest cause of vision loss. But globally, more than half of those requiring, for example, near-vision spectacles cannot access them due to factors such as poverty, isolation, poor availability, poor access to eye heath facilities and lack of awareness.

So once again the Basingstoke Lions Clubs reaches out to the community to ask that you dig out those old specs and bring them to the Lions' stand or to Morrisons – they will find new homes!

HATCH WARREN SCIENTIST HONOURED

Dr Kanagasooriyam Kanagachandran (Known as Chad) has been awarded an Honorary Fellowship by Swansea University. This recognition is a tribute to his contribution and leadership in science & technology throughout his career. He has over 20 years of experience in product, technology and service innovation in food, beverage, hygiene, pest control, pharmaceutical & biotech sectors including portfolio management expertise.

Chad was born in Batticaloa, Eastern Sri Lanka and completed his primary and secondary education at one of Sri Lanka's oldest and prestigious institutes, St. Michael's College. He received an undergraduate degree in Applied Biology and his PhD in Industrial Microbiology from the University of Hertfordshire. He also worked as a post-doctoral research scientist at the University of Hull on a European Union funded project prior to his entry into the commercial world.

Among his achievements are the invention and patenting of technologies such as the production of omega-3 oils from non-fish sources, the recycling and conversion of brewing industry by-products into biofuel and bio-fertiliser. He has also contributed to the GFSI (Global Food Safety Initiative) Technical Working Group on Chemicals and Food Hygiene to address issues of food safety and loss in the Food Supply Chain.

In pursuit of his passion to use biotechnology as an agent for change for a better future, Chad has numerous publications to his name in reputable international journals on microbiology, biotechnology, and green-process strategies covering waste recovery and food production.

Chad has considerable industrial experience ranging from R&D project conceptualization to product/technology commercialisation and collaboration with colleagues at various global institutions including bio-solution focused activities.

The Swansea University Honorary Fellowships are bestowed annually to individuals in recognition of outstanding achievement and contribution to the

society; previous recipients come from various disciplines including science, technology, politics, sports and entertainment. Chad lives in Hatch Warren with his wife and 2 children.







ADVICE ABOUT LPAS REINFORCED THROUGH PERSONAL EXPERIENCE



Sadly, a lot of us will lose mental capacity in our latter years but if we face that as a possibility we can at least prepare as best we can for that fate.

Failure to do so may cause our families enormous stress and worry, on top of the upsetting emotional impact of seeing a family member cease to be the person they knew and loved.

These are the views of Lucy Watson, who heads the Wills and Probate Team at Phillips Solicitors, which have been reinforced following the death of her parents to COVID19.

"They were both 90 but the loss has been devastating," said Lucy. "Losing a parent is never easy whatever their age and the circumstances of the virus were awful."

Well before the coronavirus pandemic Lucy had encouraged her parents to make Lasting Powers of Attorney (LPAs) for their property and financial affairs and also for their health and welfare.

"While doing so we took the opportunity to have the difficult discussion about life sustaining treatment," said Lucy.

A health and welfare LPA can only be used when the donor has lost mental capacity. Lucy knew her father's capacity was starting to fade when he made his LPAs and could envisage a time she might need to act on it, but doubted that this LPA would be needed for her mother, whose mental capacity was very good.

However, when Lucy's mother was unconscious in hospital and the outlook was very poor, Lucy and her family were sure that their mother didn't want to be 'kept alive' and had to make a difficult decision and refused life sustaining treatment.

"Were we playing God? It was very upsetting, but we felt and still feel sure we did what our mother would have wanted," said Lucy.

"Health and welfare LPAs can be needed in unexpected circumstances and unexpected times. My personal experience has reinforced my advice to clients of the importance of making these LPAs and of using the process to properly think through and discuss your wishes with those close to you."



COUNCILLOR'S UPDATE

OLD DOWN: I have written to the Chief Executive and Leader of the Borough Council raising again the hope that Old Down can be designated a Local Nature Reserve. As the next local plan is under active consideration and will designate which fields should be developed, this seems a good time to state which green assets should be protected as well. People feel very sensitive about Old Down, as some years ago a map showed a potential road into Southern Manydown going across it. The Chief Executive has replied acknowledging that Old Down is valued by residents as an area of open space and agreeing that LNR status is one way in which it might be protected. He says that it is currently being considered for designation as a Local Green Space. My opinion is that this would be helpful but it is not the full status or protection that this important site deserves. More worrying is that he also says that land to be developed in the local plan has not yet been fixed and deciding the various points of access will be part of the next stages of thinking, which to my mind leaves the danger open. Given that the Beggarwood Park across the A30 has LNR status, I believe it would be entirely reasonable to give a matching protection to Old Down and make it clear, better late than never, that this piece of land is off-limits. DEFIBRILLATORS: the Hatch Warren and Beggarwood Community Association launched a crowd funding appeal to raise money to place a defibrillator on the external wall of the Beggarwood Community Centre. It has attracted great public support and has raised (so far) the better part of a thousand pounds. As a result, the equipment has been ordered. I have agreed to use part of my County Council devolved budget to pay for the installation costs and if there is anything left over, it can be put to moving the existing defibrillator at Hatch Warren Community Centre to the outside of that building as well. That means that both these major areas for sport and recreation will have this potentially life-saving equipment available. The Beggarwood surgery Patient Participation Group has been supportive and is likely to place signs in its windows. There is also a defibrillator at the Holly Blue.

HEALTH MEETING: Maria Miller MP held a meeting in September at the Beggarwood Community Centre to discuss health provision in the area and, in particular, the Beggarwood GP surgery. I delivered a history of the surgery and its past difficulties and how North Hampshire Urgent Care had turned it round. The

Clinical Commissioning Group gave details of how they are going through a selection process for a new operator to take over from NHUC. Thelma Wiseman, Chair of the Patient Participation Group, confirmed that the PPG has been allowed to observe and comment on the potential operators' submissions. She made the interesting point that PPGs should have the right, by law, to be part of the selection processes.

The PATIENT PARTICIPATION GROUP met in August and received more positive reports about the operation of the practice and feedback from patients. The surgery continues to get calls about the rumour that was started on social media about it closing, which is untrue, As reported above, a new operator is being selected and, importantly, Beggarwood is designated as the local surgery for the new developments at Longacre, the Golf Course and Hounsome Fields.

WAREHOUSES PLANNING APPLICATION: since my last report, the Borough Council has confirmed that it will re-run the consideration of the planning applications for warehouses near M3 Junction 7. This is in response to objections raised by Dummer Parish Council who pointed to alleged errors in the advice given to Councillors. At the time of writing no date has been announced for the Development Control meeting.

PASS WIDE AND SLOW: as part of a national event organised by the British Horse Society, groups of horse riders were riding in our area on Sunday 19th September. The theme of their ride was 'Pass Wide and Slow' and the objective was to encourage motorists to give horses and their riders a wide berth and consideration on the roads. On average two horses are killed each week on UK roads. The vast majority of incidents occur because cars pass too close to horses or startle them by travelling too fast. I was delighted to join the group and say a few words in support before they set off.

ANAEROBIC DIGESTER MEETING: the AD liaison panel meetings are restarting with a new Chair (County Councillor Juliet Henderson) and revised membership. Biogen, the operator of the Digester, has completed a programme of improvements to address the odour problems that were being reported last year. Members of the panel will monitor the situation and discuss any other options for making the plant a 'good neighbour'. I shall continue to attend because the traffic to the Digester is routed through Hatch Warren.

UNEMPLOYMENT: As County Councillor I receive statistics about unemployment and this is of great interest as the economy starts to recover from the lockdowns. In Hatch Warren and Beggarwood the claimant count in July was 2% (70 men and 50 women). That gives our area the second lowest rate of unemployment for a town ward, after Kempshott.

DRAINAGE MAINTENANCE: in the last month, work to improve drainage on the Kempshott roundabout was completed and, judging from the results after a couple of downpours, it looks as if rainwater is indeed soaking away better than before. Flooding on this roundabout has been a hazard for some time and motorists will be interested to observe how much of an improvement has been achieved.

NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH: As the darker evenings start to approach, readers may be interested to know that there is an active Neighbourhood Watch scheme in Beggarwood. To join it you can go to www. ourwatch.org.uk, search for your postcode and scroll down to the Beggarwood Area scheme. Click on that and then complete a short form to join. Neighbourhood Watch is an effective way for everyone to keep a lookout for suspicious behaviour and to report it. It also passes on information about crimes in the area.

CARS PARKED ON PAVEMENTS: I have picked up comments that drivers are causing difficulties for users of mobility scooters and wheelchairs by parking their cars on pavements, with one particular hotspot being the Beggarwood area around Whitgift Close. Users of mobility scooters are being forced into the road and that is dangerous as they can't make it quickly back onto the pavement if a car approaches - they have to search for the nearest dropped kerb. I am sure we all want to be considerate when parking near our homes.

HOLLY BLUE OPENING: I was delighted to attend the delayed official opening of the Holly Blue on I4th September. A presentation was given on the history of this family company and the beers they make. COVID made the launch of the pub/restaurant very fragmented, and everyone hopes they are now able to establish themselves as originally intended.



OLD DOWN AND BEGGARWOOD WILDLIFE GROUP

We are well into Autumn now. Sadly the wild flowers and butterflies are now gone. The

meadows look a bit sad now and some areas will be (or have already been) mown. You will recall that Spring was pretty chilly and wet and there was thought that butterfly numbers would be badly affected but surprisingly they seem to have been plentiful this year. The little hot spell we had in September kept many species of butterflies around into the Autumn – such as Speckled Wood, Large Whites and Peacocks.

The fortnightly bird count has started up again (there is always a break in the summer months). From mid-September the migrant birds start leaving our shores to go south so this is a good time to bird-watch. An unusual local sighting in September was a *Wheatear* on the Manydown Estate up by Breach Farm Cottages. These birds like open fields and are summer visitors. No doubt it was on the start of its migration to Central Africa for the winter. There are also *Barn Owls* up there — but one has to get up early or be there at twilight to catch a sighting.

We love the start of a new academic year at Hatch Warren Under Fives — it's lovely to see how much our returning children have grown over the summer holidays and it's always wonderful to meet our new children.

Our first few weeks are always about settling in and helping our children make new friends and get to know staff. All children are individuals, and while some children will adjust fairly easily and quickly to a new environment and new routines, others will take longer to feel comfortable and secure. At Hatch Warren Under Fives we work hard to ensure that all children settle happily.

Our first topic "All About Me" is a great chance for the children to learn all about themselves, their new friends and their families. We use stories, arts, crafts and songs to help our children discover what is unique and special about themselves and each other.

So far we have discovered that dinosaurs, Peppa Pig and Paw Patrol are firm favourites with the children, we've also spent time in the garden and the mud kitchen, water tray and climbing wall are proving very popular garden activities.

As the weather is still good we will be using our outdoor learning environment as much as possible and we have some great activities planned for extending our children's learning outdoors. We'll also be learning about autumn this term and exploring colours, outdoor sounds and hibernating animals. And we'll be holding weekly cooking sessions and weekly science experiments too.

A year 7 student: 'This week has been very big and daunting, and I feel a little worried at times, but I have loved the lessons and have made some friends and am excited for the rest of the year. The summer school helped me, so I knew where I was going a bit better and met some teachers. The activities were fun, and I felt more ready for the first day."

'So, Miss Heath, what worries do Year 6s often have on the transition to Year 7?'

'The BIG worry is getting lost or not making any friends. The summer school this year has really helped with growing the new Year 7s' confidence and with making friends.'

'They also worry about bullying, but our students here are so lovely that the Year 7s are often surprised at how thoughtful and caring the other years are. Also, the antibullying ambassadors, well-being square and our staff, are always on hand to help any student who feels they are being bullied."

'How do you as HUB staff try to help Year 7s' worries go away?'

'We are always a listening ear and make an effort with getting to know the students who are worrying a lot before they start with us. We will invite them into school before they start to show them around and go through key adults. Ms Thomas, Mrs Richards and the TA team were also around for summer school so that we could get to them before they started.

'Do you think the transition will be any different due to Coronavirus?'

'It has been different this year due to COVID - we normally like to get into primary schools. The Year 6 taster days could not happen but it was great to have the summer school on this year!'

'Is there anything students from other years can do to help the Year 7s feel more comfortable and welcome?'

'On the whole, our students are great at helping all our new starters. I would say to remember how nervous you felt when you first started and offer to show the Year 7s around. If you see someone on their own, go over check they are ok and see if you can help.'

We welcome all our Y7s to join our amazing school community and are already looking ahead to next year's! Our open evening for Y5s and Y6s is on Monday 4th October – hopefully you were/will be able to attend.

HATCH WARREN WI

Members of Hatch Warren W.I. welcomed Steve Herra via Zoom to our meeting on 2nd September, 'Cunard History and Glamous Stars'. Steve was a purser on board the Queens until he retired. Samuel Cunard was born in Halifax Nova Scotia, when it would have taken six weeks by sailing ship to cross the Atlantic Ocean. The ships would carry passengers, mail and freight. Cunard shipping line's maiden voyage was from Liverpool to Boston aboard the steam and sailing ship Britannia in 1840 taking just thirteen days to cross. Because Boston harbour froze in winter the ship then transferred to New York. A cow for fresh milk and chickens for fresh eggs were also carried. 1840 saw the first bath tubs and in 1881 electric light. Charles Dickens and his wife sailed in 1842. Ist class passengers dined with the Captain. Steve spoke about the RMS Mauretania, Carpathia and the Lusitania and the different roles these ship played. Some famous people travelled on the Queens, including Marilyn Monroe, Clark Gable, Richard Burton and Elizabeth Taylor, Bob Hope and Charlie Chaplin to name but a few. Cunard moved its headquarters from Liverpool to Southampton in 1960, Cunard was merged with White Star line and then launched Queen Mary in 1936, QE2 would sail across the Atlantic in summer and cruise to warmer climes in winter. There are 22 dog kennels on the new Queen Mary 2. A new Queen will be launch in late 2022.

Although there is outside seating, as the weather was not looking too promising, we sat inside. The menu offering was simple paninis, sandwiches and soup. The lady serving us had started that day, but she took it all in her stride when I said that I was reporting for the Rabbiter magazine.

We both chose a cheese and chutney panini which came with tasty coleslaw and while my friend had hot chocolate and was impressed that it was hot and not lukewarm as in other restaurants, I had a cappuccino. A feature of the Honesty café group is that all products are made by themselves, and this was evident with a range of sough dough breads and cakes on display.

Service was prompt with the lone server coping well even though other customers were filtering in. It


