LIVING IN THIS 'ONLINE' WORLD

Are you finding it increasingly difficult to live in this 'online' world? You are not alone.

As a charity supporting Disabled people in Basingstoke we are seeing a sharp increase in the digital divide, of older people and those with a disability being 'left behind'.

Basingstoke & District Disability Forum (BDDF)'s services are all free and available to anyone with a disability, visible or invisible. If you feel you will benefit from what we do, then we are here to help you. Since the outbreak of the pandemic services have been forced to move online, not just for BDDF but for every charity and business in the world. For people who do not have access to a computer, this can be a very lonely, isolating experience.

At BDDF we are working hard to reach our members who do not have computer skills, or who are lacking digital confidence. During September and October, we have been running a five-week basic IT course at the Basingstoke Discovery Centre. Our learners are discovering how to send emails, safely shop online, join video calls so that they can see loved ones, and search the web.

Some of our learners didn't have access to any technology at home, so we teamed up with BVA's Reboot IT scheme to offer free refurbished laptops to those who would otherwise not have the means to buy one.

We have some more funding to help more Disabled and older people to get connected. If you or someone you know needs our help, please contact us on 01256 423869 or email info@bddf.org. uk. As soon as we have enough people interested, we will work with our partners to deliver a further basic IT course to teach them the skills they need to get online. For those who simply could not afford to buy a computer we will refer them to obtain one free of charge, subject to availability.

SCHOOL PARKING

Irresponsible parking around both our schools at St Mark's and Hatch Warren Primary are making life difficult and dangerous for the residents and children during drop off and pick up times. Highwood Ridge, The Cornfields, Gershwin Road and Hatch Warren Lane are most affected. COUNCILLOR'S UPDATE

PETITION PRESENTATION: The pressure group CAGE (Clean Air, Green Environment) presented its petition on 14th October to the Borough Council, calling for the avenue of mainly oak trees at the entrance to the Oakdown Farm site to be saved. The petition amassed well over 100,000 signatures. The planning application for the Distribution Depots at Oakdown Farm would see these trees being felled. The application is being considered for a second time following arguments put forward by Dummer Parish Council about alleged wrong advice given to Councillors first time round. This remains one of the most contentious planning applications of recent years. If approval is given again, the matter is likely to be raised for a second time with the Secretary of State, asking him to call in the decision on the grounds of its potential impact on the new hospital.

CAR MEET: Local residents have (rightly) complained about the noise and disturbance caused by 'car meets' in Sainsbury's car park. The disturbance is caused by cars with exhausts tuned to create 'backfires' and by squealing tyres as the drivers perform stunts in car park. Social media were alive with demands for something to be done. I spoke with the manager of the supermarket and also wrote to the Police and Crime Commissioner. Following this, the Police issued a long statement. They confirmed that they are aware of an increase in antisocial behaviour during car meets across Basingstoke and they will do everything they can to control the situation. We can help by informing the Police if we become aware of any planned meets. They may then be able to use Antisocial Behaviour legislation to disperse the event. They will work with the Borough Council and have a plan to tackle nuisance behaviour as part of a combined effort involving local neighbourhood policing teams, response and patrol teams, and the roads policing unit who are assisting with road related anti-social behaviour.

ARCUS: The manager at Sainsbury's told me that the car park is managed by a third party company, Arcus. This is because there are multiple retailers operating from the site. I therefore wrote to Arcus, but received no response. I chased and received a puzzling reply: "This is a matter that you would need to raise directly with Sainsbury's as we are not responsible for the management of car parks across the Sainsbury's estate." I am attempting to resolve this contradiction as I want to know what steps could be taken to stop the car meets, and have some suggestions to make. I have written again to Arcus in the hope of establishing a dialogue.

ANAEROBIC DIGESTER: I attended the Liaison Panel's most recent meeting on 28th September. The modifications to the plant have reduced, but not eliminated, odour leakage. The operators will continue to pursue improvements but further changes are likely to be marginal. They confirmed that the plant will not increase its capacity in the light of the national policy to introduce more waste food recycling.

WALK TO SCHOOL: October was designated the 'International Walk to School month'. Hampshire County Council encouraged parents to leave their cars for all, or part of the school run, and walk instead. This builds opportunities for exercise in the children's school day and improves air quality around schools. Walking would also help to ease pressures in areas like Hlghwood Ridge where parking associated with the school run is causing tensions. We are lucky in Hatch Warren and Beggarwood that the Community Association allows its car park to be used for St Mark's School and the Portsmouth Arms is similarly supportive of the Hatch Warren schools.

BEGGARWOOD SURGERY NEW OPERATOR: presentations have been received from potential new operators of the surgery, and a decision is expected imminently. Thelma Wiseman, Chair of the Patient Participation Group, offered comments on behalf of the patients.

BEGGARWOOD SURGERY PATIENTS' SURVEY: I attended the most recent Patient Participation Group meeting. It received a report on the annual patients' survey conducted between lanuary and March this year. It shows that the practice is performing well in comparison with local Clinical Commissioning Group and national averages. The Practice scored 88% for 'overall experience as good'. There was a wish for patients to see their preferred GP more often. Overall, there has been a sustained year-on-year improvement in key areas including the ease of making an appointment and the feeling of trust that patients express in the attention they received.

WINTER JABS: the Beggarwood surgery is reporting a high take-up of the 'flu jabs. COVID booster jabs are starting. I do encourage everyone to take up the jabs, which have done so much to help ease the lockdowns.

DEFIBRILLATORS: the new Defibrillator cabinets have now been installed outside both the Hatch Warren and Beggarwood Community Centres. I was pleased to use part of my County Councillor's devolved budget to augment the Community Association's crowdfunding initiative to get this life-saving equipment installed.

HOUSEHOLD WASTE RECYCLING CENTRE: in a month when the Borough Council has had to suspend green waste collections, Hampshire County Council relaxed restrictions on the use of the Recycling Centre in Wade Road. We are no longer limited to one visit per week. We still have to book slots but now we can visit more often.

PASS WIDE AND SLOW: I was pleased to meet the horses and riders taking part in the 'Pass Wide and Slow' ride. They set off from the road to Kennel Farm and on the way back came up Cliddesden Lane past the Portsmouth Arms. In wishing them well I offered a couple of thoughts: the person who taught me not to pass too close or guick to horses when I was learning to drive was my father, who grew up in a rural community, and not my driving instructor. There may be many drivers out there who have not received this advice. And today, with the advent of electric cars, it will be very easy for drivers to come up behind a horse and rider without them hearing, making it much easier to startle the horse as they pass. Please be careful!

REGISTER TO VOTE: The Borough Council's canvassers are visiting households to ensure that everyone eligible is registered to vote. Over 63% of households have already responded to its annual canvass and this is the time of year when in-person visits start to ensure the electoral register is up to date. Canvassers will be wearing Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council identification when they call: please make sure you register.

MAYOR IS GUEST OF HONOUR AT PROBUS CLUB

The Probus Club of Basingstoke was honoured to receive a visit from the Worshipful the Mayor of Basingstoke & Deane BC, Cllr Onnalee Cubitt, joining the members for lunch at their regular meeting at the Test Valley Golf Club.

Cllr Cubitt told of her background in charity fund raising starting as a seventeen-yearold, encouraging Basingstoke businesses to make small financial contributions to support her work as a volunteer in Sri Lanka.With a business degree she entered the world of high finance working several years for Standard Chartered Bank, then tried her hand at estate agency, which she did not like, although her company car proved very beneficial for getting about in London being a black cab.These days she and her husband have a building business specialising in renovation work across north Hampshire and Berkshire.

With ambitions to be a Member of Parliament she applied to join David Cameron's list of potential candidates but was told that she could not progress as she had no political experience. Local politics beckoned and she has been a Basing councillor for many years.

Probus President, David Wickens, presented Cllr Cubitt with a cheque for her selected charity appeal, the Community Furniture Trust and Friends of St Michael's Hospice. Before lunch members had been entertained by speaker Jeoff Evans who traced the changing role of TV quiz shows over the years. Starting in 1938 with mental challenges, when TV returned in 1946 there was an updated version which was a trans-Atlantic quiz where London based panellists had a radio connection with participants in New York.

American TV, being commercial, attracted large audiences with quiz programmes that had large value prizes, but the BBC's charter would not allow it to follow suit and although they continued with guiz shows the prizes were either very modest or even non-existent. Shows like What's My Line and Brain of Britain then had to compete with the introduction, in 1955, of Independent Television who had Double Your Money, hosted by Hughie Green and Take Your Pick with Michael Miles. Trying to emulate the famous American quiz, The 64,000 Dollar Question, Hughie Green ran a show called The Sky's The Limit with the top prize being 64,000 sixpences.

The American Congress became involved setting regulations to overcome rigging allegations which was followed by UK television setting a $\pounds 1,000$ prize limit. The BBC then showed intellectual quizzes that had no monetary prize such as University Challenge, originally hosted by Bamber

Beggarwood Community Centre, Broadmere Road, Basingstoke,



Gascoigne, Six Form Challenge, Top of The Form, Ask the Family with Robert Robinson and in 1972, Mastermind hosted by Magnus Magnusson. The show's format was based on the interrogation of prisoners of war in a darkened room with a spot light. 1971 saw Sale of The Century, with Nicholas Parsons, The Golden Shot with Bob Monkhouse, Jim Bowen with Bull's Eye and in 1980 the BBC introduced The Question of Sport.

The prize limit was raised to £6,000 in the 1990s and by 1996 all prize limits were removed. This eventually led to Who Wants To Be A Millionaire which initially struggled to find a host channel as they thought showing four possible answers was too easy. 2009 saw The Chase, hosted from the start by Bradley Walsh, and now Beat The Chaser.

The speaker had been a contestant on Mastermind, Egg Heads and several others, and these days is a quiz question writer. Perhaps a role reversal of being today the game keeper and not the poacher.

THE NEW BEGGARWOOD SURGERY PPG

COMMUNITY NEWS

A defibrillator has now been installed outside the Beggarwood Community Centre. This has been the result of a successful crowdfunding campaign which raised £1000. County Councillor Stephen Reid has also contributed from his County Council budget. A notice will be put up outside the surgery to inform people where it is located.

Maria Miller M.P.- Healthier Communities meeting - 2nd September 2021

This meeting was called by Maria Miller MP and attended by representatives from Hampshire, Southampton and Isle of Wight Clinical Commissioning Group, (CCG) Beggarwood Practice Patient Participation Group (PPG) and members of the wider Beggarwood community.

Attendance was rather low which may suggest that the overall satisfaction of the local services provided by Beggarwood surgery was at least satisfactory if not above average? The meeting was centred mainly around the upcoming change of provider for the Beggarwood surgery. The CCG, who will appoint the new provider, took note of the desire from the PPG and residents that the incoming provider should be locally based and community focused, be staffed by permanent doctors and nurses and hopefully retain the existing team at Beggarwood. The CCG's decision will be announced in late October.

The PPG asked Maria Miller if she would contact the Secretary of State for Health to put forward the idea of making it mandatory that PPGs become part of the procurement process when their practices are taken over. Ms Miller agreed to do that and the PPG will follow this up with her in a couple of months.

SURGERY UPDATE Patient Survey

The PPG also received a report on the independent annual patients' survey conducted between January and March this year. The survey highlighted that Beggarwood Surgery was ranked in the top 25 surgeries in Hampshire. It shows that the practice is performing well in comparison with the CCG and national averages. The practice scored 88% for 'overall experience as good'. There was a wish for patients to see their preferred GP more often. Overall, there has been a sustained year-on-year improvement in key areas including the ease of making an appointment and the feeling of trust that patients feel in the attention they received. Vaccinations

Bookings for flu jabs have started with text messages sent to those eligible to book an appointment to attend the surgery, along with pneumonia and shingles vaccinations texts. Coronavirus booster jabs, which will be done at Jamieson House, Chineham, will operate in a similar way with text messages again sent to the appropriate patients. These will be done in the same priority order as the other Coronavirus jabs.

This was a spur of the moment thing. On a rare occasion, for me, at least, visiting Festival Place it was approaching midday and I enquired of Madam if she would enjoy an early lunch somewhere. We went out of the doors by the sadly shuttered Debenhams into the open air and looked around. Spotting the Cosy Club, and knowing we had not frequented the place previously, and with no idea what to expect, in we went.

An interesting vista greeted us. The interior design was partly American/Western/Spanish and was very spacious. Plenty of room between tables may be the remnants of Covid restrictions with mirrored dividers giving an intimate feeling while adding reflected light to the ambiance. The menu was extensive with Brunch selections to tempt the smaller appetite. Sandwiches, six types of burgers and thirteen main courses that had no obvious connection to the décor.

We both had a burger. These were nothing like those obtainable from the big yellow arch; mind you, neither was the price. Madam had the Classic Burger with additional bacon while I pushed the boat out and went for the Blue Velvet Burger which came with pulled beef brisket, blue cheese and various salad vegetables. A brioche bun and fries completed the extremely tasty offering. There was an extensive drinks menu, but we just had soft drinks. I had a diet Coke and Madam an elderflower cordial.

Those burgers tasted of beef and being very filling they left no

room for a dessert, or coffee. The bill came to £34.35, and a generous tip was left for the pleasant waitress. It turned out to be a good decision to dine at the Cosy Club and I am confident that it is somewhere we shall return.






