All relevant training will be given, as well as regular and on-going support and supervision.





COUNCILLOR'S UPDATE

ROAD CLOSURES: There are two separate sets of road closures being planned for the A30 and I think some confusion may have crept in between them. The first set will affect the A30 between the motorway and the Saunders Way junction (the entrance to Longacre). This closure is to allow for resurfacing. Though the order is for three months, the works are expected to take five nights only, between the hours of 8pm and 8am. The second set of works is being planned by South East Water between the Kempshott and Hatch Warren roundabouts and will start in January for 16 weeks, so that they can install a new water main. They are planning to use temporary traffic lights to control traffic, which I fear is bound to increase the use of the Hatch Warren estate roads to avoid delays. There will be a public information session in December. I am trying to find out which developments the new pipe will serve and whether there are alternative routes that could have been considered. I also want to find out whether other utilities have plans for digging up the roads and if so, whether they could be done at the same time.

COURSE GOLF **DEVELOPMENT:** Bloor Homes have issued a newsletter confirming that work is starting on the Golf Course housing development. Working hours will be 7.30 am to 6pm, Mondays to Fridays and 8am to Ipm on Saturdays. There will be no activity on Sundays and public holidays. Arrangements have been made for staff parking on site. The existing clubhouse will be demolished by the end of November and the first of the 227 homes in Phase I will be available for occupation in Spring / Summer 2022. Usefully, Bloor have provided details for contacting the project team should their work cause difficulties. GRIT BIN: With the season of frosts and ice on the road approaching, I have been chasing for a date for installing a grit bin at the top of Gloucester Drive. I have been advised that it should be fitted by the end of the year.

COUNCILLOR GRANTS: the County Council has been running a Councillor devolved budget scheme for many years, and the Borough Council has now launched a similar initiative. Community groups and organisations are able to apply for funding for small-scale items to support local groups and projects. Grants of between £250 and £1,000 are available to help groups and not-for-profit organisations purchase equipment that will make a difference to people's lives

and help bring communities together following the COVID-19 pandemic. Each Borough Councillor has a $\pounds 2,000$ 'pot' so the three Hatch Warren and Beggarwood Councillors have $\pounds 6,000$ between them. That is in addition to the $\pounds 8,000$ that I have as a County Councillor, although that has to cover Hatch Warren, Beggarwood and Kempshott.

CAR MEETS: I attended a meeting at Sainsbury's to discuss potential measures to address the problems caused by car meets in the car park. Also there were the Store Manager, Mitie (Sainsbury's agents) and the Police. Mitie have agreed to bring in a mobile Automatic Number Plate Recognition facility to identify cars and their owners. Signs will be erected warning drivers that the car park will be closed for non-users of the shops and cashpoint machines. It is hoped that the ANPR will act as a deterrent. If the problem returns when the mobile ANPR is not present, the business case could then be made for a permanent facility. I went to the meeting hoping to propose some physical measures to deter the antisocial behaviour, but was told that the car park is too large; Mitie felt that it would be difficult to secure the whole of it in this way.

BEGGARWOOD SURGERY: At the time of writing, there is still no announcement regarding the new operators at the Beggarwood surgery, but it is believed to be imminent. The Patient Participation Group meeting that was scheduled for November was postponed and it will be called again when the decision is known.

WAREHOUSE APPLICATION: has been well reported, the second consideration of the planning application for a warehouse near Junction 7 of the M3 resulted in a refusal. Dummer Parish Council and the pressure group CAGE won a remarkable victory in persuading Councillors to overturn the original decision of the Development Control committee. So what next? The applicants have already lodged an appeal against the refusal of the outline planning permission for the site so it is entirely predictable that they will appeal against this decision as well. One of the reasons for the refusal was the need to protect the (mainly) oak trees at the entrance to the site and it may be relevant that temporary tree preservation orders have now been placed on them, confirming that the community was right to stress their importance. Other arguments that could be deployed in resisting an appeal are that the proposed site is outside the current Settlement Policy Boundary for Basingstoke and opposite a potential

site for a new hospital. I believe cogent arguments can be made to support the Borough Council's decision.

OLD DOWN ACTION: At a meeting called by Maria Miller MP residents discussed the future status of Old Down. Originally it was planned to designate this important green area as a Local Nature Reserve at the same time as Beggarwood Park, many years ago. Then access arrangements to Manydown South were considered and consultants identified Old Down as a potential route for a road. As a result, Beggarwood Park received LNR status but Old Down did not. Now, however, the situation has changed. The Borough Council has published its thoughts on development in the South West of Basingstoke, and access to Manydown can be achieved from nearer to the motorway as well as through Hounsome Fields. In my opinion this enables us to re-open the idea of designating Old Down as a Local Nature Reserve. I wrote to the Chief Executive at the Borough Council asking for this to be considered. He replied saying that the Borough is considering Local Green Space status, which sounds to me to be a lesser recognition of the importance of

OLD DOWN AND BEGGARWOOD WILDLIFE GROUP

The Autumn colours and supportive of tree planting leaf fall came late this year. October and November were very mild with few

There is a rich variety of trees on both Beggarwood and Old Down but both sites could accommodate more numbers. Beggarwood in particular has some very mature tall trees such as oak and beech. The Group has planted several saplings and whips on Old Down such as rowan and hawthorn (the berries are so good for many bird species). More trees could and should be planted and the Group hopes to achieve this. Sadly, our local authorities are not very

- but very keen on felling. It is such good news that the Gateway

Development has been refused by the Development Control Committee thus saving the beautiful avenue of mature oak trees. Of course there will be an appeal by the developer. In this time of rapid climate change and the dire consequences we need to keep our mature trees and woodland.

There is a proposal being made to the Council to give protection to Old Down as a wildlife park/area. Beggarwood has Local Nature Reserve status but not Old Down which leaves it vulnerable during any planning process. Local councillors support this so hopefully it will be progressed.

Hopefully, unlike last year, we will be able to enjoy the Christmas celebrations and gatherings of family and friends. The Group wishes you all a really wonderful Christmas and a happy and prosperous 2022.

HATCH WARREN ATHLETE WINS GOLD

Local athlete Neil Barton has been crowned European Masters champion after being upgraded to the gold medal, two years after being awarded the silver.

Barton, a member of Basingstoke & Mid Hants Athletics Club, was competing for only the second time for Great Britain at the 2019 European Masters Championships in lesolo, Italy, where he finished second in the over-35 men's long jump.

Two years later Barton received some unexpected news that the German athlete who'd won gold has been disqualified following a doping violation. This meant that Barton was upgraded to the gold medal position.

"While I would have loved to have heard the British national anthem played at the medal ceremony, I can't complain" said Barton. "To say that I'm shocked and over the moon is an understatement!".

We have also been in conversation with KIWI Education and hopefully we will be supporting some of our young people



CAGE UPDATE

CAGE (cleanairgreenenvironment. org) was delighted that Basingstoke Council's Planning Committee turned down the application to build a gigantic warehouse on J7 M3 at their meeting on the 27th October. Our local councillors Diane Taylor and Hannah Golding, both worked hard to stop the warehouse development.

However, an appeal has been lodged by the developer, Newlands, for outline planning permission for all 4 warehouses on the site and there may be one in the pipeline for the refused warehouse. The CAGE campaign will carry on, so continued interest and support will be much appreciated.

CAGE is very pleased that Tree Preservation Orders on the Oakdown Oaks have now been lodged which should mean that the importance of the trees and the priority habitat has been acknowledged. The SaveOakdownOaks petition has now reached almost 104,000 signatures.

DEEP LEARNING DAY BHCS

Three times a year, Brighton Hill Community School have Deep Learning Days. These are designed to teach us more about different areas of life around the topics of 'Respect and Equality', 'Keeping Healthy and Safe' and 'Careers'. We cover these topics in our My World lessons but having a day off our normal timetables means we can learn about these topics in more depth. Years 7-10 participate in these days and have 3 sessions as well as their normal tutor sessions; in this article, we have perspectives from students from Years 7, 8 and 9 who tell us about the 'Respect and Tolerance' Deep learning Day we had in the Autumn Term.

Jeremie from Year 7 said, "Deep Learning Day for Y7 was intriguing. We learnt how women in the past fought for their rights and went as far as arson and putting bombs everywhere to attract attention and get what they want. These were the Suffragettes, the women that were violent. The other group was the Suffragists, who

fought for their freedom peacefully. We also learnt about the association BHCS has with The King's Kids, a children's home in Uganda for children that don't have parents or can't be looked after. In our last session, we learnt how people with disabilities were treated back in the 1600s and how we have changed our attitudes since then. We even played some sports disabled people might play seated volleyball, seated table tennis and blindfolded goalball."



Zoe from Year 8 said, "On Deep Learning Day we did all of our lessons off-

timetable to learn about some important things that we will need to understand in life. We went around into different classrooms in our tutor groups and the topics that we learnt about were: 'Black History Month', 'Barriers for People with Disabilities' and 'Gender Inequality Around the World'. I think that it's necessary to have a day in school when we can look at these topics as we learn



essential matters that may affect us or others during the course of our lives."

Anna from Year 9 said, "On Deep Learning Day, Year 9 were looking at three main topics – 'Discrimination in Sport', 'Sex Discrimination' and 'Human Rights: Refugees coming to the UK'. I think it was interesting to look at the plain reality of the kind of things that are happening in our everyday lives and what causes them. We are always encouraged to accept and respect everyone, no matter how different they are to us."

service. Service throughout the two world wars and the regular introduction of the most up-todate boats and

equipment along with the introduction of river and beach patrols has all meant over 100,000 lives being saved during the last nearly 200 years. In 1891 the RNLI was the first charity to have a public collection and as a voluntary organisation has to continually actively fundraise so to help Bridget brought a selection of items for sale.

At the time of writing this, the shops have been full of Christmas goods for over a month and by the time you read this, you will be left in no doubt that the Christmas season is coming. Some of you may have already bought and wrapped your presents, written your cards and ordered the turkey!

And where you might wonder, does the season of Advent fit into this world of shopping and spending? This year the Advent season starts on 28 November and ends on 24 December. The word advent means "coming" and there are, in fact, three meanings of this word that Christians describe in advent. I suppose that because of lock down restrictions it must be some considerable time since I drove to Overton passing the old Deane Gate Inn that stood forlornly in the dip of the road gathering road grime.

Today it could be likened to the way an ugly chrysalis evolves into a beautiful butterfly the way the Palm Brasserie has been created into such an attractive being. Goodness knows what it cost to transform this place but all credit to the owners who have created a unique dining experience within this newly developed, modern style, expanded old pub.

We had Sunday lunch there and what a pleasant experience it was. The main dining area was designed for family dining, and there were several with young children, while we were placed quietly in an adjacent area that suited us well.

Decision making was difficult due to such an extensive menu with many vegetarian and vegan options. Madam chose the traditional Sunday roast beef while I took time to select lamb rump slices cooked freshly pink with crispy fat with some Asian style touches. Madam could not praise her choice highly enough, especially the properly cooked vegetables.

Having foregone a starter in favour of a dessert Madam had panna cotta with biscotti and I had the lemon tart with raspberry coulis and vanilla ice cream. Two coffees followed to complete

a delicious lunch. With the gin and tonics, bottle of water and a glass each of a Malbec the bill, including service, came to £89.65.

Was it worth the money? Absolutely. Will we be back? Of course.


