### **BEGGARWOOD SURGERY NEWS FROM THE PPG**

### Surgery

Blood tests have been temporarily suspended at Beggarwood due to staff resignations however, they will be reinstated in early September when a new nurse joins the team. Meanwhile patients are being asked to visit the hospital for these services, where patients have reported a well-organised and speedy service. Telephones have also been a recent problem with staff holidays and sickness. Staff from CGH have been drafted in to help with this, hopefully, temporary problem. We will be monitoring both these situations closely over the next month and welcome your feedback via our email address.

Following previous feedback from us at our August meeting with Operose we are led to understand that they intend to reorganise the staffing levels at all the surgeries in Basingstoke and they encouraged us to believe that this would result in a more reliable and positive experience for patients – time will tell.

### Maria Miller MP Meeting

The Health Update meeting, called by Maria Miller MP, on Saturday 16th July, at the Beggarwood Community Centre was well attended by patients of both Beggarwood and the CGH surgeries as well as a strong representation from Operose who run our surgeries. The meeting reflected the growing concern from both sets of patients over the running of the surgeries with questions posed by attendees and answered by Operose. From the meeting we now have a list of serious concerns and we are in discussion with Operose on how they plan to address these issues.

### Dr.iQ

We are all being encouraged to use this new Operose app – Dr.iQ - available free for both iPhones and Android devices. Current feedback to us is mixed. What are your experiences using the app? Once again replies via our email address please.

### **Any Complaints?**

If you feel that you have not been dealt with correctly by the surgery or perhaps not had a good experience in dealing with either the surgery or a member of staff you can make a formal complaint. Operose employ a full time Complaints Manager and so you should get a speedy response. If you feel after receiving the reply that it did not meet your expectations or did not correctly respond to you then you can then escalate the problem to the NHS Clinical Commissioning Group (CCG) again via email: NHCCG. COMPLAINTS@NHS.NET NHCCG.ENQUIRIES@NHS.NET. The CCG will carry out its own investigation and report back to you. We would also welcome your feedback.

### CAMROSE, GILLIES AND HACKWOOD (PPG)

CGH News: Meetings have been held with Operose Health where they have agreed to provide monthly performance figures to share with patients. Latest figures show an average of 1343 calls per day to the surgeries. Over 8300 patients have registered for Dr.iQ, 112 of whom are active users aged 81 and above. 26.32% of face-to-face appointments have now been freed up since the Dr.iQ launch, and 26% have said that it saved an attendance at A and F.

DriQ is designed to help patients get help and support more conveniently, as an alternative to calling CGH. It is early days but, results are mainly good. Following a meeting with local pharmacists, it is hoped CGH PPG will soon be able to provide information on the prescription process between CGH and pharmacies. At the moment, pharmacies are experiencing problems with short supply on some medicines. Patients are encouraged to ensure they have enough medication, and order seven days ahead when running low.

I managed to acquire some funding from the Holly Blue Pub but it is up to the council to apply for that funding and I am awaiting their decision.

### MAYOR'S FREEFALL FUNDRAISER

### **COUNCILLOR'S UPDATE**

TRANSPORT STRATEGY FOR BASINGSTOKE: Over the summer I have attended some interesting briefings and discussions, and two were about the emerging local plan and transport in Basingstoke. About 15,000 homes are slated for our South-West corner of the town. There is a transport strategy for Basingstoke, but I have grave misgivings about its ability to cope with that sort of growth. The main thrust of the strategy is 'modal shift' - moving people out of cars and into public transport. There is a long discussion in the strategy about a Mass Rapid Transit link, but that turns out to be bus-based, with bus links to help them move more freely. The strategy was produced in 2019, and since then we have had the pandemic. The bus company is reporting that usage levels have only recovered to 65% of previous levels. I fear that this renders the transport strategy out of date: it needs to be reviewed and serious consideration must be given to a Western by-pass and significant improvements to Junctions 7/8 on the M3.

WAREHOUSES: the Borough turned down the application for warehouses near Junction 7 and I spoke against it at the meeting. The applicants have appealed against the decision and an inquiry will be held. We wait to see whether the Secretary of State will call-in the matter, given its close proximity to the potential new hospital.

**BEGGARWOOD PPG:** the Patient Participation Group met with the operators of the surgery in August and discussed a wide range of concerns, some of which had been raised at a public meeting organised by Maria Miller MP, attended by about 70 people. The management team reported that they had some structural changes in the pipeline that would be announced once staff had been consulted. There had also been concerns that Beggarwood has stopped doing blood tests - this is temporary. The PPG was told that the situation was due to a member of staff leaving and blood tests will be resumed as soon as a suitable replacement person has been recruited, which is expected to be in September. Thelma Wiseman, the Chair of the PPG, has written a more detailed summary of the meeting which will be posted on-line and elsewhere in this magazine.

**BROADMERE ROAD AREA POTHOLES:** I have been progressing the repair of the roads in the area round the Co-op. At the moment the responsibility for the roads lies with the developers. I have seen e-mails that indicate that they are in the process of getting contractors to come to do the work, but I have not been given any timescales.

**SMELL:** there were questions about a strong smell that impacted Hatch Warren and Beggarwood for a couple of days. Was it the Anaerobic Digester, where maintenance work is taking place? The local consensus was that it was down to muck-spreading. However, a local resident has told me that it was, in fact, down to the spreading of liquid digestate from the Digester, which is used as fertiliser. I am inclined to believe this, but it raises the question of why there was apparently no advance warning, which I shall pursue.

DIGESTER: Reports have continued to come in about odour from the Anaerobic Digester. Biogen, who took over the plant in 2018, have made significant investments to improve the original specification of the plant including a large project to completely re-engineer the biofilter that had been installed by the original operators. I think this improved the situation, but reports of odour pollution continued. Biogen have now identified further opportunities to improve odour abatement are their new improvement plan will include the installation of a scrubber to pre-treat digestate before it enters the biofilter. This will allow the installation of more powerful extraction fans and is specifically designed to remove ammonia and other volatile compounds. In addition, much of the equipment will undergo a full overhaul as part of its 60,000-hour service. Whilst the tanks

are empty, an independent engineer will verify their integrity. Biogen say that the works represent a significant investment and I am sure everyone will hope for odour reports to be eliminated.

CALL FOR LAW CHANGE: I raised the issue of the cable strike at Brighton Hill roundabout at the last meeting of Hampshire County Council. In particular, I asked that an obligation be placed on utility companies to provide accurate mapping of their assets, with penalties attaching if they don't. The Executive Member reacted positively and agreed to write on this matter to Hampshire's MPs.

VISIT TO MONITOR PROGRESS: I will be visiting the Brighton Hill roundabout, along with other Councillors, on 8th September. One question I shall be asking is whether the cable strike has impacted on the overall timetable for completion.

**COMMUNITY MARKET:** The Portsmouth Arms market has decided to rebrand itself as the 'Basingstoke Community Market' and is moving around different locations, including the pub as before, Rucstall Primary School and St Mark's school in Danebury Road, still starting at 10.00 am. There is no indication yet as to whether this is increasing or reducing the number of people who attend. Pitch fees are being donated to the schools, so this is an opportunity to grab something special and support the schools at the same time. They are running a Facebook page which gives details of future locations.

CONGRATULATIONS TO BRIGHTON HILL SCHOOL: as part of a House competition in July to raise much needed provisions for the local food bank, the school donated food weighing 171.72 kilos, which is the equivalent of 409 meals. The school has received a public 'thank you' from the food bank.

**FABRIC SHOP:** I have picked up the sad news that the fabric shop at Brighton Hill Centre is to close on 8th September. The rumour is that the vet from next door is going to move in.

ST MARK'S SCHOOL: Work has started on major improvements to the school's outside area. New assets will include improved seating to cater for a full class outside, improved gazebos, the introduction of animals including chickens, rabbits and guinea pigs, a new trim trail and improvements to the woodland area. When school returns in September, there will be a lot more for the children to enjoy.

**FOUNDATION GOVERNOR NEEDED:** St Mark's school is advertising a vacancy for a foundation governor. A foundation governor is appointed to the governing body to support the religious character of the school. Being a governor also involves meeting with other governors (12 meetings across the year), meeting with staff a few times across the year, and visiting the school.

The HATCH WARREN FUN DAY AND SUMMER FESTIVAL was a huge success. The weather was glorious, immediately prior to the first of the heat waves and the field near the community centre was full of many stalls. Some of the stall holders were local clubs and societies and others were small businesses. Quite rightly, the intended dog show was cancelled because of the heat. I was pleased to see the event supported by the Mayor of Basingstoke, Councillor Paul Miller and Dame Maria Miller MP. Congratulations to the Community Association Committee making this such a success after the disruptions of recent years.

### OLD DOWN AND BEGGARWOOD WILDLIFE GROUP

What a very hot, dry summer! Such prolonged heat and dryness has not been good for our gardens,

farmers' crops and wildlife. The ground has been so dry and hard for so long it is a wonder any plants have managed to flourish but somehow the natural world appears to have survived the scorching sun and lack of rain. The lack of green on both sites is very marked and it is rather sad to see brown sites instead of green sites. Despite the conditions there has been a good show of wild flowers on both Old Down and Beggarwood although some have not done as well as they should - particularly in not growing as tall. Some tree species are susceptible to dry conditions and the leaves will start to discolour and drop early – such as birch and beech. Perhaps when this is published

the rains will be with us and we will be back to normal temperatures.

Both sites have had many butterfly species during the spring and summer months (the Group will publish its report on transect results before the end of the year). As well as butterflies flitting about there are also day time flying moths. The species you are likely to see at Old Down and Beggarwood are: - cinnabar moth; burnet moth; burnet companion; grass moth; mint moth; mother shipton. The cinnabar moth is very particular and only lays its eggs on ragwort (caterpillar shown below). So it is important that ragwort is allowed to flourish (but not overwhelm) on both sites. Yellow and black is one of nature's warning signs, meaning 'keep off' to potential predators. Ragwort contains toxins which the caterpillar takes up making it extremely distasteful when digested by predators.

Please find time to look at the Group's Facebook page now and again. If you should see any interesting or different plants or insects or birds on the sites please do let us know.

# KEMPSHOTT CONSERVATION GROUP

### At home in the Meadow

A volunteer doing a butterfly survey in Down Grange Meadow in late June saw a female Red-legged Partridge about to cross the path. The Partridge paused for a second and then carried on, followed by five or six tiny chicks. Mother and young disappeared into the grass, presumably on the hunt for invertebrates for the chicks to eat — what a lovely sight.



In recent years, these Partridges have been seen more and more often in and around the Meadow. We have wondered whether this species is choosing suburbia rather than the adjacent farmland to

over-winter, but this is the first time we have seen evidence of them breeding in the Meadow. Certainly they are less likely to be shot there, but it is uncertain how the predator situation compares. Foxes, Red Kites and even cats and dogs are all present on local farmland as well as in the immediate area, so it's difficult to see the advantages for a Partridge moving into the suburbs. 

As we close our doors for summer we would like to reflect on all of the wonderful things we have done over this last half term. The children have shown great resilience during our sports week and from this have


used their creative thinking skills to come

### BASINGSTOKE CIVIL SERVICE RETIREMENT FELLOWSHIP

There were 44 members at the meeting held on Wednesday 3 August who after the usual registration and refreshments were welcomed by the Chairman, David Cowling. He congratulated those with birthdays this month especially those with significant ones and then gave details of the forthcoming trips and events planned for the coming months. Following this The Welfare Officer, Christine Broadbent, gave us updated information on the progress of those members who had not been well.

Unfortunately, our planned speaker for this month was unable to attend but fortunately Alan Jones offered to come and he gave us a talk titled "Keep Your Hair On!". He gave a fascinating insight into something which we all take for granted but is at the centre of a multi-million pound business - HAIR. There are in general between 90,000 and 150,00 hairs on the head depending on hair colour and age The hair itself is dead, it is the follicle that is alive and grows for about 6 years before resting for 2 more. It is one of the most visible parts of the body and Alan pointed out that how it is worn, shown or hidden can either represent our personality or be a religious requirement. It also has many uses especially as it is very rich in nitrogen. It can also, of course, be used in the manufacture of wigs which have had many forms throughout the ages. He ended by displaying some of these which nowadays are mainly made in China and sometimes made from synthetic fibres.

### **#BeSafeBeSound Campaign**

Counter Terrorism Policing is working with music venues and UK festivals to help people enjoy their live events safely this summer. Their advice for anyone attending an event this summer:

- Don't leave bags unattended or anywhere they could cause a security scare. Never agree to look after anyone else's bags, no matter how genuine they seem.
- If you see something on social media that concerns you,
- In an emergency, if you think there is an immediate risk, always call 999 and look around you for help from staff – especially those with radios who can raise the alarm quickly.
- If there is an incident, listen to staff and any announcements.

It was a hot lunch time in the school holidays so perhaps the reasonably busy car park meant that families were in the pub garden, but we wanted shade so went inside. Three small rooms across the front of this old building had been opened up to provide plenty of seating and because a door was open, we entered into the bar room.

In the bar there were a few diners with a selection of tables with a banquette across the wall under the large screen TV which is used to encourage patronage during sporting events. As it was switched off, we had a table in the corner close to a window.

An extensive menu offered the full range from snacks and sandwiches, pizzas, curries, burgers and steaks with some children's selections. Decadent Pub Classics was our choice and for once Madam and I made the same selection. We had chicken and ham pie with skin on chips, peas and a small pot of gravy. Although described as handmade, the pies actually came from a boutique style bakery in Kent, but were tasty, nevertheless.

Thinking alike again, we both chose the same dessert of apple and rhubarb crumble. We both had custard in preference to vanilla ice cream. And very good it was, too. For drinks, I had a pint of Moretti lager and Madam her usual slimline tonic with ice and a slice. She finished off with an Americano coffee accompanied with milk in one of those miniature milk bottles. I didn't bother.

The total bill came to £46.00 which was reasonable considering the food we had enjoyed. We were in no rush, but I just wish that it could have been served guicker as we


